Eyewitness Account Of Jewish Massacres In Kiev Tells Of Brutality Of Nazi Conquerors

ness account of Jewish massacres in Kiev during the early days of its occupation by Ger-man troops has been given the newspaper Izvestia by Dimitrii Grlov, a resident of Kiev, who said he saw hundreds of men and women stripped naked and then shot down at the edge of a gulley into which their bodies dropped on a great pile. In the account, distributed by

Tass news agency, Grlov re-"Several days after the Ger-

mans entered Kiev I went to Lvovskaya Street. An incessant procession of people was streaming through it and both side-walks were lined with German patrols. This human stream kept flowing for three days and three nights without interrup-

"The Germans were driving the Jews to Babyi Yar gulley beyond the city. I also stealthily made my way to that place. I was able to stand the sight of what I saw there for only ten minutes and after that everything went black before my

"The Germans forced people to undress and then methodically gathered their clothes and loaded them on trucks. In separate trucks they put underwear. Then they tore off from naked people—there were men and women among them-rings and watches if they had any, dragged them up shivering from cold or mortal terror at the edge

of the gulley and shot them. "The Germans did not spend any bullets on little children, but simply hurled them alive into the gulley.

We all realize that a state of war emergency demands certain laws and practices which are expedient and necessary to successful action, even though they would not be asked or allowed in peacetime. But the term "war emergency" has been invoked in the present Congress on several occasions as an excuse for measures whose passage could scarcely affect the war one way or the other, and whose provisions are of debatable merit, to say the least. The bill to subsidize the public schools comes readily to mind. But the latest one, the so-called Ellender Bill, tops them all.



Co-Belligerent Prisoners

The situation of Italian prisoners in the United States has remained unchanged since Italy's surrender and subsequent elevation to the status of co-belligerent. This situation, though anomalous and perhaps embarrassing, is understandable in the light of more urgent problems confronting the Army. Yet it seems that, knowing the temper and sympathy of most of these prisoners, they might be given a greater opportunity than they now have to do their part as cobelligerents by helping to relieve our manpower shortage.

A representative of the Bowling Proprietors' Association recently went to Washington to ask that war prisoners be allowed to work in bowling alleys as pin setters. And there must be other jobs that they could do without submitting Americans to any danger. Obviously this body of prisoners represents a variety of skills. The barrier of language should not keep these men from doing a satisfactory job in many kinds of manual work—for example, the less technical tasks connected with farming, lumbering and construction, as well as other work which is not strictly "essential" but which needs doing, nevertheless.
