Garvin, took part in the 33rd Annual County Judges and Commissioners' Conference at Texas A\&M University February 18-20. The program, developed around the theme, "County Government Works," was sponsored by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service's Institute of County Government in cooperation with the County Judges and Commissioners' Association of Texas.
Also cooperating in the training conference for county judges and

Association of Counties, the Conference of Urban Counties, Technology Resource Center of the Texas Engineering Extension Service and Texas A\&M's Office of Continuing Education.
