

Miss Gerhardt, daughter of Richard and Jackie Crawford of Graham and Robert A. Gerhardt of Amarillo, will be one of only 350 high school students (out of over twenty million nationwide) nominated to become a Congressional Scholar.

Those attending the week-long conference will meet with high-ranking government officials, senators and representatives, members of the Washington diplomatic corps, national media figures and prominent scholars.

The Congressional Scholars will see first-hand the inner workings of the government as they attend a mock session of Congress, meet with members of the President's Cabinet, and much more.

They will attend a number of special functions held in their honor, including a presentation on the floor of the House of Representatives and a special White House issue briefing.


