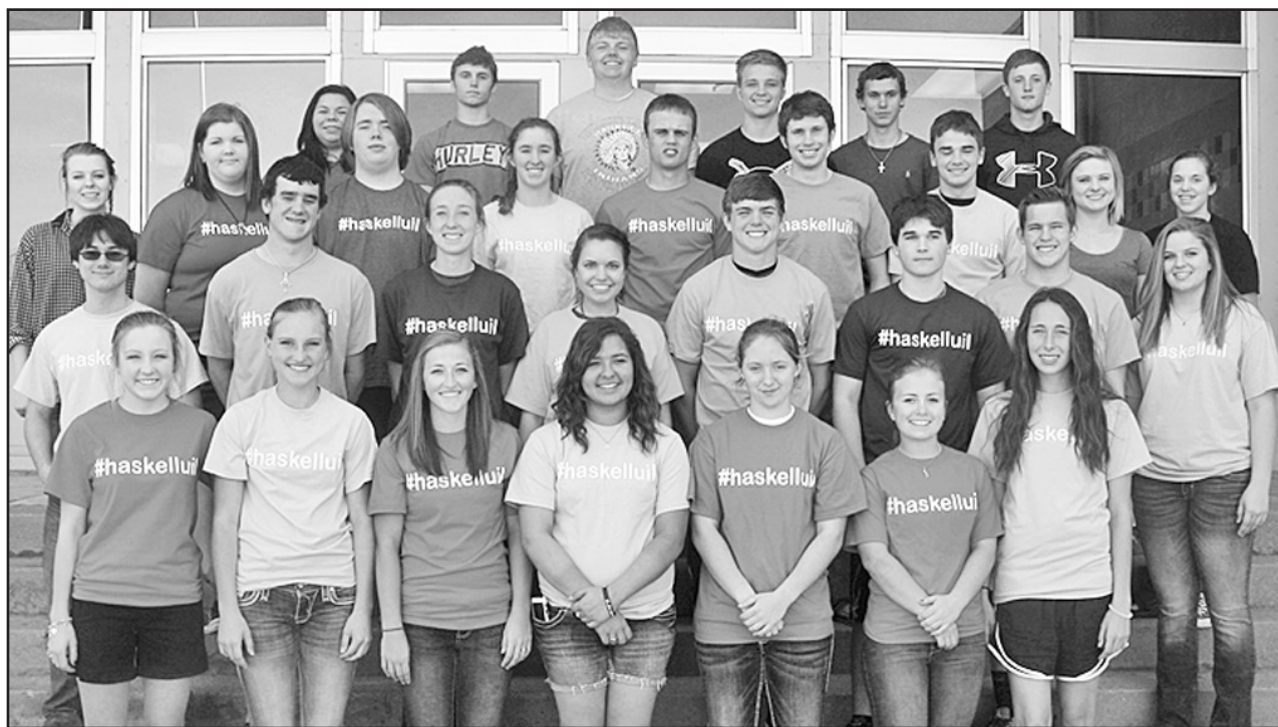

Vote Sat. in city/school elections

In just a little over a week, voters in Haskell will be going to the polls to elect three aldermen and two school board members.

The cities of Rule, Rochester and Weinert, as well as Rule ISD school board, will not hold elections, because all incumbents are unopposed.

Seeking re-election to the Haskell city council are incumbents Ernest Frye, Shane Whitt and Allen Morrow. Challenging for a position on the council are Jason Isbell and Randy Bowers.

On the Haskell CISD board of trustees, Lance Sloan is unopposed for place #4, currently held by Susan Turner, who chose not to run. No

election is necessary for that place. On the ballot for place #5, will be incumbent Bert Alvarez and Paul Weiser, while Paul Leonard and Sheena Crosson are vying for place #7, presently represented by Mark Stewart, who is not seeking reelection.

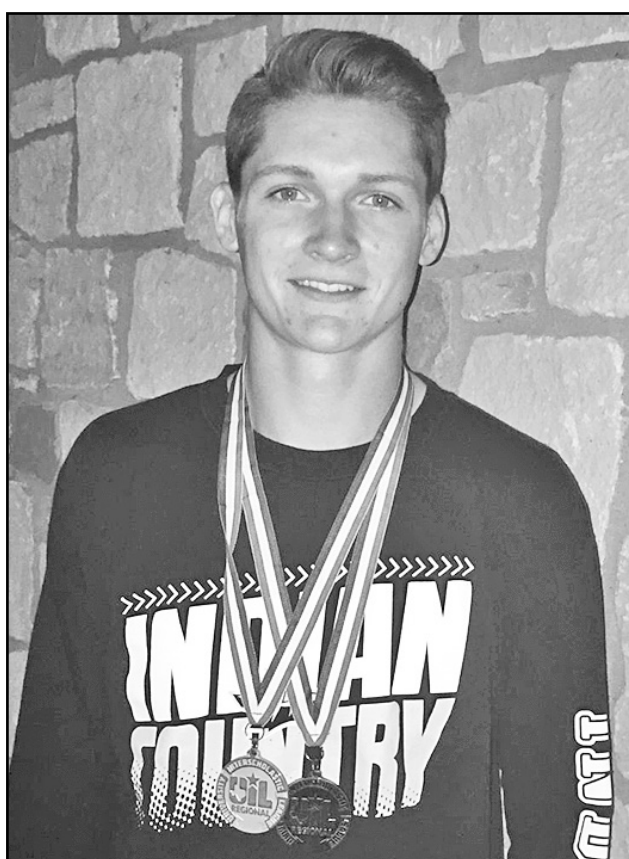
Only registered voters living in single member districts 5 and 7 are eligible to vote in the school election. You may only vote for a candidate running in the district in which you live. Additional information for voters and their corresponding single member districts is available at the school administration office.

Voters are reminded that photo identification is required for voting in person. In addition

to your voter registration card, you must present one of the following forms of photo ID at the polling location. Forms of ID include Texas driver license, Texas Election Identification Certificate, Texas personal ID card issued by the DPS, Texas concealed handgun license, US military identification card, US citizenship certificate or US passport. For more information about photo ID requirements including exemptions, visit www.votetexas.gov.

On election day, Saturday May 9, voters will cast their ballots for both the city and school board elections at Haskell City Hall from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

All registered voters in the city of Haskell, as well as those in single member school districts #5 and #7, are encouraged to make their voice heard by voting for the candidates of their choice.

If the winners are not graduating seniors, the scholarship money will be held by their high school.

To apply, you must fill out and turn in an application by Wednesday, June 3. Each applicant will be interviewed at 4 p.m. on Thursday, June 4 at the Haskell Civic Center. The Sponsor Meal will be

held the same evening, and all applicants will be introduced and winners announced at that time.

Each contestant will need a sponsor, which can be parents, grandparents or a business. Attire for this event is western or something equally appropriate for a ranch rodeo.

Winners will ride in the WHPD Parade and be introduced at both performances of the rodeo.

Applications may be picked up at the counselor's office of all Haskell County high schools, as well as the Haskell County Judge's office on the second floor of the county courthouse.

Services for Jerry Von Collins, 74, of Gallup, New Mexico will be held Sat., May 16 at 11 a.m. at the Church of Christ, 1000 E. Green St., Gallup, New Mexico.

Mr. Collins passed from this earth Fri., April 24, and is buried in Sunset Memorial Cemetery in Gallup, New Mexico.

Born four miles east of Haskell Jan. 21, 1941, he graduated from Haskell High School in 1959. Jerry attended Ranger Junior College and received an AA Degree in 1961. He continued

his advanced studies at North Texas State University in Denton where he received a BS Degree in Education in 1964.

During his time in college, he met Othal Gearldine (Gerry) Barbee and they were married Feb. 28, 1964 in Stamford. The newlyweds moved to Cottonwood, Arizona where Jerry began teaching school on the Navajo Reservation for the U.S. Dept. of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs at Cottonwood Day School, and later at Toadlena Boarding School in New Mexico. He became the principal of Canoncito (now know as Tohajiilee) and later Bread Springs Day School where he retired after 30 years of educating Navajo children.

Later in life, he worked for 10 years as a corrections officer and then as a part time substitute teacher in Weslaco. He spent his last years in Gallup, New Mexico where he could be closer to his daughter.

Jerry was an avid genealogist, volunteer

firefighter, and enjoyed the thrill of finding a bargain at a garage sale or the discount rack at the local retailer.

He was a lifelong member of the Church of Christ.

He was preceded in death by his father, Marvin Leonard Collins; mother, Zula Faye Blair Collins; and brother, Marvin Wayne Collins.

Food drive to be held Sat., May 9

The Haskell Post Office is asking for the community's support May 9 as it joins America's letter carriers and Feeding America, the nation's largest domestic hunger-relief organization in the annual Stamp Out Hunger food drive. Hosted each year by the National Association of Letter Carriers, Stamp Out Hunger is the largest single-day food drive in the country. The event helps to support local food banks and the one in six Americans who struggle with hunger.

Haskell area residents can join the Haskell Post Office and support community members who struggle with hunger by simply collecting non-perishable food items

and leaving them in a sturdy bag near their mailboxes on May 9. A letter carrier will collect the donations and deliver them to local food banks and pantries, including the Haskell County Food Distribution Center. Items will then be distributed to those facing hunger right here in Haskell.

"Stamp Out Hunger is like no other food drive. It allows every community across the country to collectively come together on one day to do their part to fight hunger. We are so grateful to community members who donate non-perishable items and for the letter carriers who take the time to collect each bag to help fight hunger," said Haskell Postmaster Rose

Evans.

According to Feeding America's recently released Map the Meal Gap 2015 study, 17.6% of Texans are food insecure. Stamp Out Hunger is the opportune time for the public to support neighbors who struggle with hunger.

"Hunger affects every community in the country," said Fredric Rolando, NALC president. "At least six days a week, our letter carriers are a local touch point in communities everywhere and we are thrilled to be able to support our neighbors in need though the Stamp Out Hunger food drive."

The Stamp Out Hunger food drive was created in 1993 by the National Association of Letter Carriers

to encourage communities to come together in an effort to stock the shelves of food banks and pantries nationwide. The event is held on the second Saturday of May each year.

The Stamp Out Hunger food drive is held in 10,000 cities and towns in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands and Guam. Last year, letter carriers collected over 70 million pounds of food donations to be donated to their local food bank and pantries.

The United States Postal Service, AFL-CIO, National Rural Letter Carriers' Association, United Way, Valassis and Valpak are all supporting this year's Stamp Out Hunger food drive.

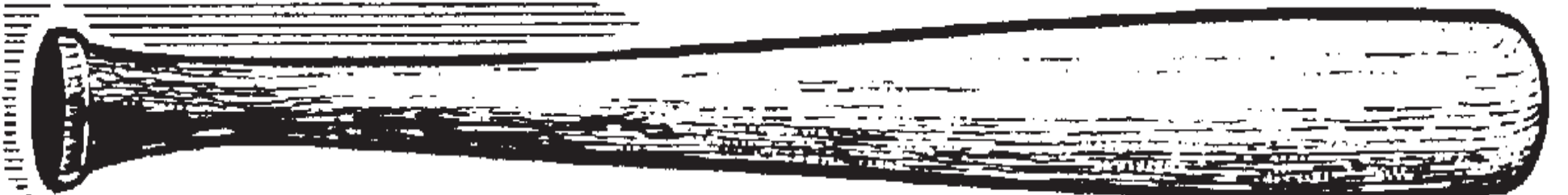

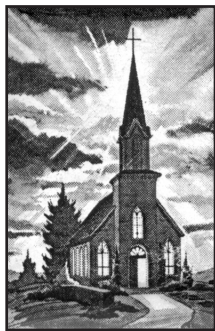

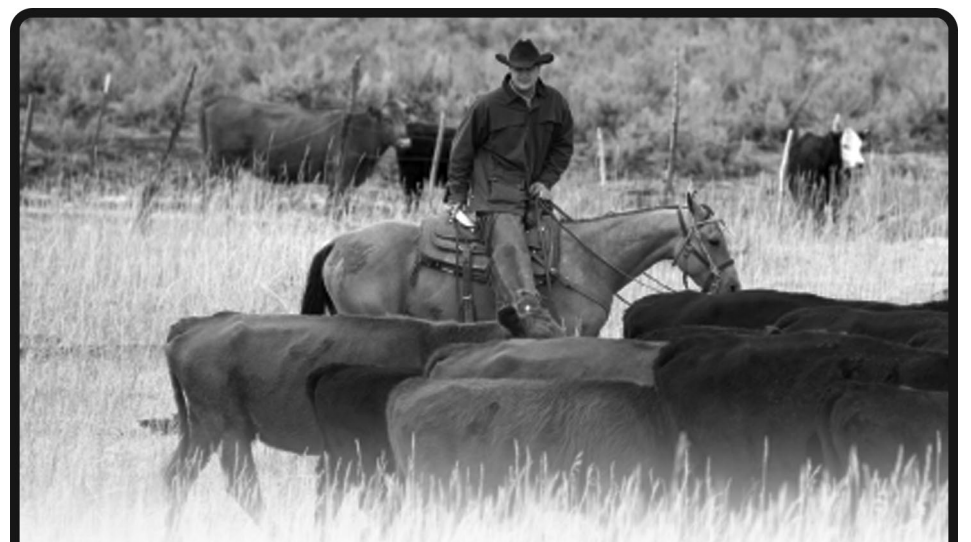
