NEWS County Spricultural Agent Texas A.e M. College Extension Services

A recent discovery may prove of prest value in future efforts to montrel or eradicate a very expensive livestock parasite, the screwmontrel. The discoverry was a black screwworm fly. Normally, the flies are blue-green.

The first black screwworm fly was found by Dr. Leo E. LeChance, insert geneticist of the USDA's Agricultural Research Serivce at Kerwille, in a laboratory colony obtained from Orlando, Florida. Since these flies had not been irradiated, the black one is believed to be the result of a naturally occurring mutation. Several generations of the black screwworm fly has been produced by LaChance and his associates.

The black color is important as a genetic marker (a distinguishable physical characteristic that is heriinde) and could prevent a problem which delayed the eradication in the Southeast, a quick, effective way to mentify the released flies.

Irradiation does not alter the appearance of screwworm flies, and they are not radioactive when reawered in traps. Dye or other markings are not sufficiently permanent for accurate identification. An easiby distinguishable marker, such as the black color, could eliminate this problem and speed progress in futing cradication programs.

The ARS entomologists are now conducting studies to determine how the genetically marked flies with wild flies in mating activity, ingevity, and flight range. If the black screwworm flies prove biologically successful, they will provide a valuable new tool for use both in entomological research and in conirol and endication afforts.

This discovery could mean much the program now getting underany in Texas under the sponsorship of the Southwest Animal Healthe Research Foundation.
