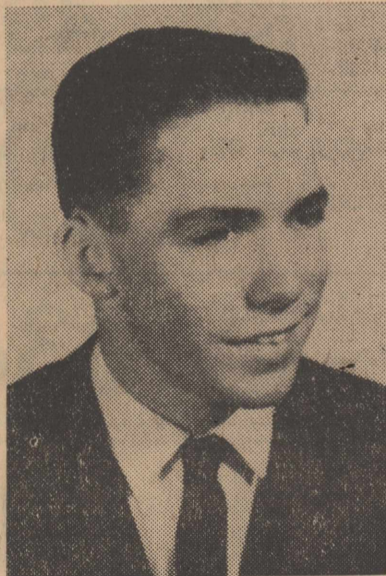

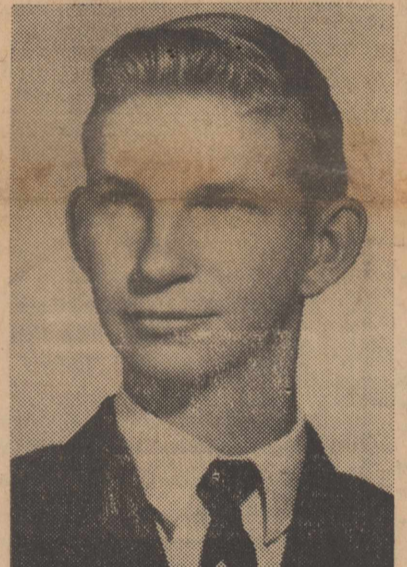
Methodist Church New Service Hours

Morning Worship, 9:30 a. m. Sunday School, 10:45 a. m. Evening Worship, 7:00 p. m.

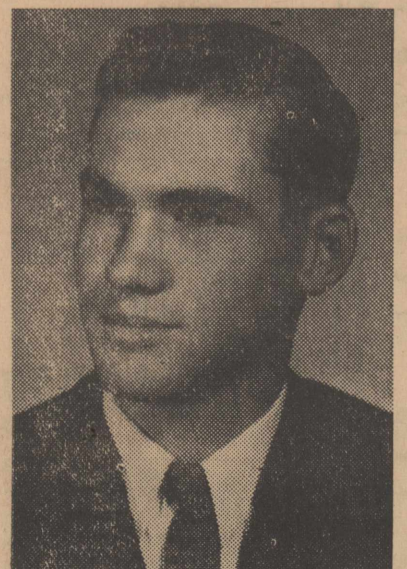

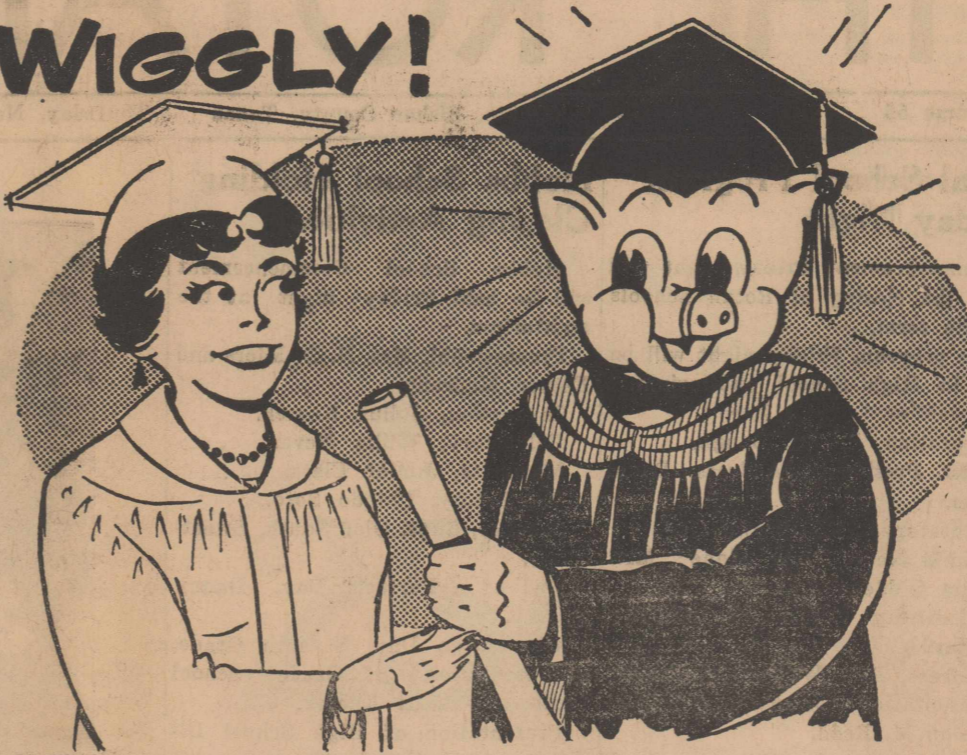

Proclamation

Whereas, one of the best-known and well-regarded qualities of the State of Texas is its soundly built and carefully maintained highway system; and

Whereas, a consistent program if highway construction and modernization has in recent years brought about a reduction of more than 25 percent in the fatality rate on all Federal and State highways in Texas; but

Whereas, heavy increases in traffic endanger these advances in highway safety, since the state's population has increased by one-fourth since 1950, the state now has more than five million registered motor vehicles, and the miles traveled by these vehicles now totals 43 billion miles a year; and

Whereas, due to this flood of traffic some 22,000 miles of the state's 25,000-mile system of U. S. and State-numbered highways are already, obsolete for the loads of traffic they carry;

Therefore, Be It Resolved, as the Nation at large observes National Highway Week during the period May 20-26, 1962, that the Texas Highway Department be commended for its achievements in building today's fine highway system in the face of mounting traffic problems; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the citizens of Texas be urged to view with concern the adverse economic effects and the cost in human lives that will result if highway traffic overwhelms the capacity of our roads, and to support a sustained program of highway improvement and modernization to keep Texas growing.

There, I, Justin M. Morrow, do hereby designate the period May 20-26, 1962, as

Highway Week and urge that special attention be directed to the needs of our highway system.

Hiway Maintenance To Hold Open House

How does the Texas Highway Department use tiny glass beads to make your driving safer? Why do highway engineers cut circular holes in brand-new highways?

These are only two of the many fascinating aspects of highway engineering and maintenance that local citizens may explore on Friday, May 25.

On that day the Highway Department will hold "Open House" at the Maintenance Warehouse of Fisher County as part of National Highway Week (May 20-26), announced Carl Wiley, Maintenance Construction Foreman of Fisher County.

Any interested resident of the area may visit the Maintenance Warehouse at Roby during the hours 8 a. m. to 5 p. m. and observe the daily functions of the public agency which is responsible for the care of approximately 229 miles in Fisher County.

Maintenance Construction Foreman Carl Wiley said the Open House will show the public how the Highway Department operates on a normal working day.

"I would like to extend a most cordial invitation to the citizens of this area to visit our Open House," he said. "Your neighbors who work for the Highway Department would like to show you through our facilities and demonstrate a few of the many test and operations we conduct daily to care for the highways."

Visitors to the Open House will see examples of two-way radio communications, and the various machinery and equipment used to maintain existing roads in smooth riding condition and pleasing appearance.

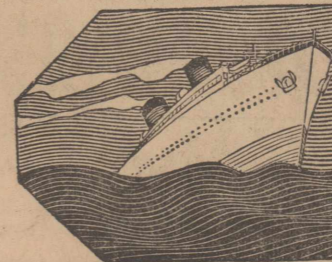

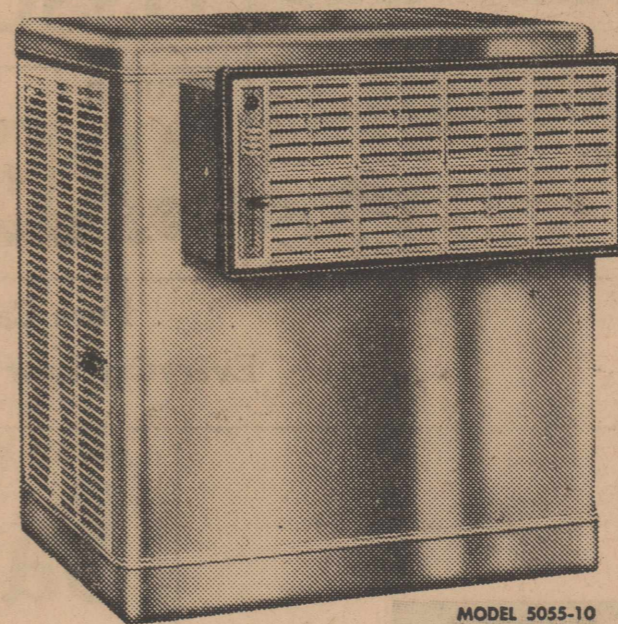

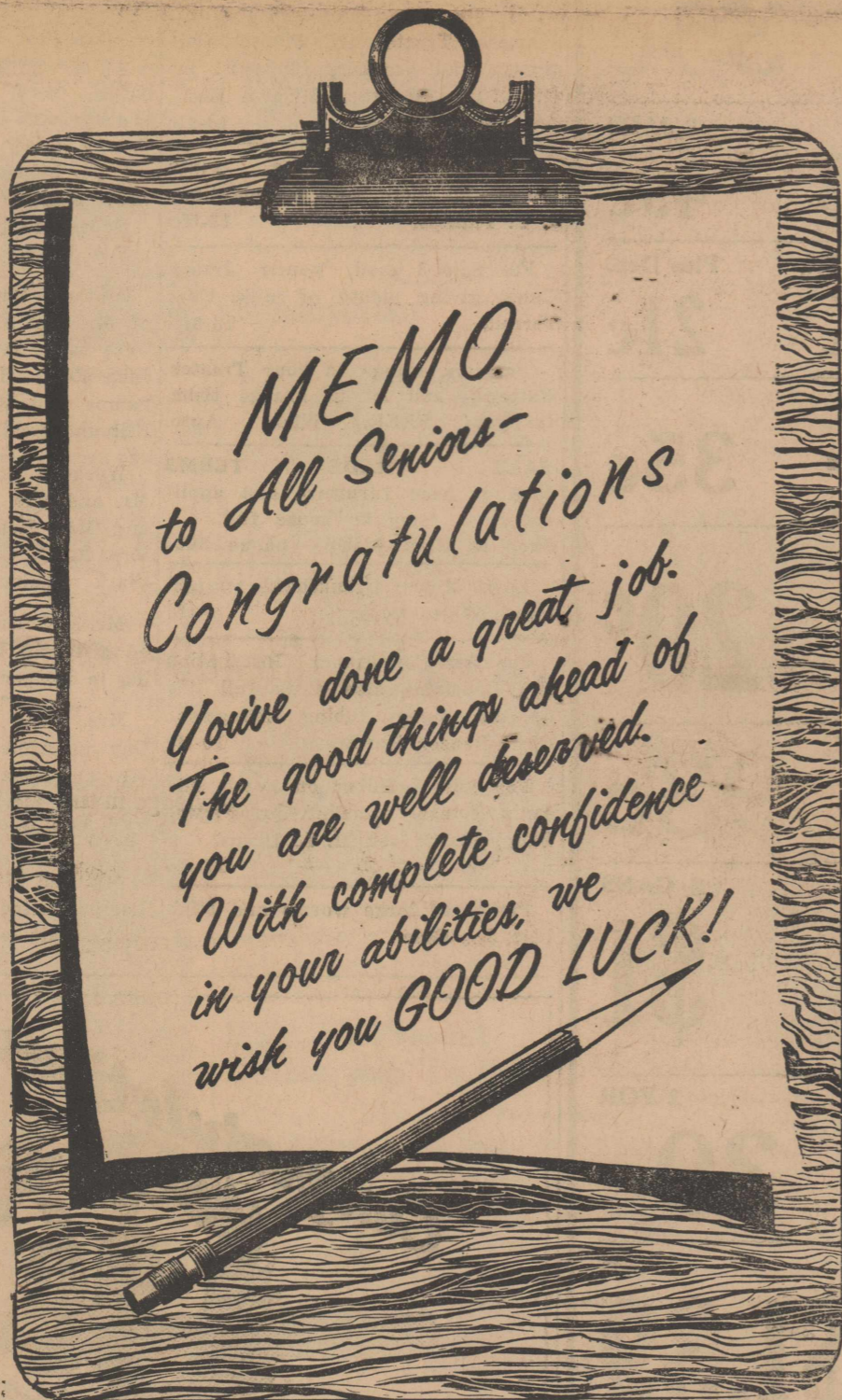

Joe Ogle Family Traces Family History

The following article from Texarkana Daily News, in regard to Mrs. C. C. Hall of Texarkana, the youngest sister of Joe Ogle of Rotan:

"A belated Christmas gift, from England, has been received by Mrs. C. C. Hall, 1823 West 16th st.

It is the coat of arms of the Ogle family (Mrs. Hall for an Ogle before her marriage), and was a gift from her son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. B. J. Bell of Galveston. Mrs. Bell also has a copy of the coat of arms.

The shield, with hardwood mount bears the family name, a fesse between three crescent gules, crest, and a bull's head proper out of a ducal cornet. The colors are those of the family.

The family can date its ancestry as far back as Sir John Ogle, the first Ogle to leave England and come to America. That was in 1664. The Duke of York granted him large tracts of land in what is now Delaware and Maryland.

Besides Mrs. Hall, the surviving sons and daughter of the late Rev. and Mrs. Hericks Ogle are Rev. T. S. Ogle, Waco; Rev. Alvin H. Ogle, Poteau, Okla.; D. S. Ogle, Sr.; Joe Ogle, Rotan, Texas; Mrs. Mary Glass, Snyder, Texas; Mrs. Stella C. Bertch and Mrs. Seborn Fountain.

There are some 50 grandchildren, great-grandchildren and other descendants down through the fifth generation, and they attend the Ogle family reunion held in July each year."
