Raising dairy cattle and demonstrating the use of dairy products in meals are popular 4-H Club projects. Hundreds of girls and boys throughout the state, in checking project results, are probably asking themselves the question a prize-winning dairymaid asked herself.

"Where would I be today if I had not had the opportunity to join 4-H?" According to the youths' own stories, they learn good health habits, accept responsibility and work with others. And they usually profit from their efforts. The dairy project is open to

boys and girls who have one dairy animal or an established herd. Many young dairy members started with a single heifer, and in 10 years or less built a valuable herd.
Of the 134,000 club members

in 50 states enrolled in a dairy animal project today, about a third are girls. This ratio held among the six national dairy scholarship winners last year.


