#### Water Shortage **Proving Critical**

For the second time this year Rotan residents have experienced a water shortage. During May a shortage for several days was relieved by rainfall.

The current shortage has been creeping for several days, and Tuesday afternoon and night the higher part of town was without water. Down town the flow did not cease but pressure was very low.

The City Council distributed circulars over the residential section asking that lawn watering be stopped until storages could be filled and a plan of watering lawns on certain days be worked out, with a rest between days in order to keep storages filled. If watering of lawns is not stopped the Council expects to be forced to turn gyp water into mains to provide adequate water for fire protection.

The Council has warned for the past two years that all wells at City Water Farm were lowering production, and they have dug sev eral new wells, one of them the deepest in history, attempting to find more water, to no avail.

As it now appears the only solution is to curtail use of present supply until a permanent supply can be secured.

If citizens will cooperate with the Council a plan can and will be worked out that will keep the city in water and lawns alive -- for the





Thehuman body constantly produces heat and so must constantly lose it to be compatible with life. Evaporation of sweat cools the body and this process is aided by circulating air. Also, physical exercise in creases the amount of heat produced and in turn must be lost.

Clothing is important. In temperatures below 80 degrees the usual clothing may be worn, but with temperatures between 80 and 92 degrees, just a diaper is sufficient. But when the heat goes over the 92 mark, baby should wear a cotton shirt to absorb perspiration.






