Co. Judge Gives Budget Report
The Commissioners Court met in
Special Session Wednesday, Aug Special Session Wednesday, Aug
ust 29, 1962 and approved the Budget for the Calendar Year 1963 .
Other business transacted at this Special Mecting was to set the official county tax rate. for the 1962
tax roll, which roll provides the taxtax roll, which roll provides the tax-
es for operations in the calendar year 1963.
The County tax rate was set at is the smallest county tax rate. Thince thetax roll of 1928 . The County
rate for that year was .95 c. The County tax rate for the 1929 rol
was $\$ 2.20$. From 1941 through 1949 the tax rate was $\$ 1.80$. In 1950 the County, tax rate began to de-
cline when it was $\$ 1.50$. During the past four years the County tax 254 counties in Texas, 35 have a tax of 95 c . 177 have a County tax rate of over 95 c and only 43 have a County tax rate less than .95 c The
average tax rate for Texas is $\$ 1.13$. Our County tax rate consists of the road tax of 1.15 c voted in 1915. The County does not levy any taxes for bond issues. The money necessary of the two Home for the Aged comes from the operating Public Buildings an
The County is on a cash basis in every respect, except that it does
isue R. \& 'B. time warrants for the purchase of machinery and in building of the Rough Creek bridge. The money to pay these warrants
comes from the operating funds of the commissioners. There has been
only five or six times in the past twelve years that any fund has been
in the red and none in the past four years.
