Wear Old Type Badge
Col. Homer Garrison Jr., director
of the Texas Department of Pubblic Safety, announced today the Texas Rangers are going back to the tradition-steeped Mexican sill-
ver badge wworn by their predecesver badge worn by the
sors in frontier days.
Garrison said the
Ranger badige, issued to each of the 62 members of the force, is a replica of the badge which old-time
Rangens carved out of Mexican Rangens carved out of Mexican
silver pieces when Texas became a state and their duties changed from military to law enforcement.
The best information available
indicates that the five indicates that the five-pointedl star on the badge symbolizes the "Lone
Star" of Texas. The points are Star" of Texas. The points
supported by an engiaved wheel. When the Department of Public Safety was created in 1935 and the
Rangers became Rangers became part of it, this
badge was replacedl wwith a solid badge was replaced with a solid
badge of somewhat different shape and' design. Then in 1957, a different badge wwas aciopted for all officers of the Department, incuding the Rangers. This is a modern version of the old Ranger badge, with a five-pointed star surro
