The Texas Highway Commission today appproved the expendiure of $\$ 192,000$ for highway safety and
beterment in Fisher County during beterment in Fisher County during
1963, announced Disrict Highway 1963, announced Disrict Highway
Engineer J. C. Robberts of Abilene. He said a total of 5.2 highway miles in the county will be involved The work will be under the super
vision of F. N. IShave, Resident Engineer, Hamlin, Texas. State Highway Safetyl and Better mnt Program just authorized by Under Under this program, a total of
2,369 miles of U. S. andi State highWays will be improved. Work will
be done on 356 projects in be done on 356 projects in 164
counties. Total state-wide cost will be about $\$ 20,640,000$. Purpose of the annual program
is to continue the improvement and modernization of U. S. and State highways for increased safety and
convenience of travel. convenience of travel. ment Program is one of the perime
mater factors responsible for a significant 26 per cent drop in the number of traffic deaths on primary highways during the last eight
years, the Commission years, the Commisssion said. "Together with programs for new
construction and careful maintenconstruction and careful mainten-
ance, the $\operatorname{Safety}$ and Betterment ance, the Safety and Bettermen
Program has helped achieve a meaningful reduction in traffic fatalities on the primanty highway
system," said Herbert 'C. Petry, Jr., system," said Herbert 'C. Petry, Jr., Chairman of the Highway Com-
mission. Petry termed the Safety and Betterment Program as "not only de-

for the 1963 upland cotton crops were announceed today by J. W.
Landers, Chairman, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Cou-
nty Committee. The referedum will be held on Tuesday, December 11 . The polling places are located as

Polls will be open from 8 a.
Any person who dioes not reside in the countyl in which he is engaged in the production of upland
cotton in 1962 may obtain a ballot prior to the referendum from any
county ASCCS office and cast his ballot by mail. Also, any producer
who resides in the county in which he is engaged in the production of
cotton, but will be out of the county in December 11, may cast his
ballot my mail. Absentee ballots ballot my mail. Absentee ballotsts
must be mailed in accordance with must be mailed in accordance with
instructions available at county ASCS offices and must reach the county office for the countly in which the producer is eligible to

Chairman Landers explained Chairman Landers explained that
every effort has been made to in-lotment-quota program so the the outcome of the referendum may re-
present the considered opinion of all the voters. Farmens opligibible to cast ballots are all those who en-
gaged in the production of upland gaged in the production of upland
cotton in 1962 . This includes those
farmens whose 1962 cotton history acreage is pratected by participation in the Soil Bank, released acreage or preservation. If the husband
is eligible to vote, the wife is eligiis eligible to vote, the wife is eligi-
ble. Approval by at least twoble. Approval by at least two-
thinds of the growers voting is necessary if quotas are to go into ef-
fect.
Issues to be decided in the December 11 referenum are (1) quotas or no quotas, and (2) the level
of price support to be available for the 1963 upland cotton crop.
If the vote is favorable, quota winl be in effect for the crop - with
penalties on any "excess": cotton produced on a farm, and priee support to growers who complys with
their farm allotments will be available at a level of from 56 to 90 If the vote is not fayorable, there will be no quotas or penalties ap-
plicable to the 1963 upland cotton plicable to the 1963 upland cotton
crop, and price supportt to cooperas directed by law.

1963, it is anticipated that such legislation would supplment rather
than substantially chage the basic program choices in the December 11 referendum
