FTC Announces Shoe Labeling Results

New federal labeling rules requir ing disclosure of all materials use ced recently by the Federal Trade
Commission.
The FTC said the rules will go into effect at the manufacturing to labelimg and advertising to labeling and advertising.
requirements:
No trade name or coined name may be used if it rialsely suggests shoes or siippers are made of a ceptain material. For instance, it be described as "dura-leather" or "Barkhyde."
If imitation leather is used, this must be disclosed through such stacements as imitation leather shoelinings composed of mitation ther."
If a leather material is embossed, yed or otherwise processed to look like a different type of leather, the label must tell the actual type used. For example, "simulated alligat All labeling disclosur made in the form of stamps, tags or labels fixed to the shoe in such a way that they will remain in ulay until delivered to retail customers. All labels must be the type that can casual inspection of the product.
