**"God Speaks  
 Through His  
 Ministers"**

Luke 23:33-34: "And when they had come to the place which is called Calvary, there they crucified him, and the malefactors, one on the right hand, and the other on the left. Then said Jesus, Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do."

Christ upon the Cross appears as the victim of wickedness. Wickedness had secured His condemnation, and thus outraged every sentiment of justice; it had scourged and insulted Him in the hall of Pilate, and had compelled Him to hear his cross; it drove cruel nails through His hands and His feet, and suspended Him on the cross in unknown and unspeakable torture. It crucified the Lord of life and glory. Thus, then, Christ appears to us on the seemingly helpless in the hands of His enemies. In the face of all this Christ displays an example of true religion.

On the cross Christ portrays the highest love for his enemies. Hear Him pray, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." If ever revenge could be justified, it would be now, but yet, we find He has no feeling but that of love and compassion. This is the new spirit which He brought into the world - this love for enemies. This spirit of love for enemies is the very essence of ethical Christianity, the heart of the Gospel. How hard to practice, yet how divine in origin!

On the cross Christ portrays the highest kind of affection. "When Jesus therefore saw His mother, and the disciple standing by, whom He loved, He saith unto His mother, Woman, behold thy son! Then saith He to the disciple, Behold thy mother!" Here on the cruel cross, His body racked with pain, Jesus gives the highest example of the fifth commandment, "Honor thy father and thy mother."

On the cross Jesus portrays the highest confidence in the Eternal. "And when Jesus had cried with a loud voice, He said Father, into Thy hands I commend my spirit; and have said thus, He gave up the Ghost." These words express an unbounded confidence in an eternal God. Let this confidence in eternal God be ours, also, both in life and in death.

There is a great lesson here for mankind. No matter how much we may be puzzled by the mysteries of God's dealings with us, let us never lose confidence in the wisdom and

love of God, portrayed through the cross.

**Public School Week  
 March 4-8th**

Public Schools Week was born of a great need. In 1950, public spirited men and outstanding friends and supporters of the public school system were shocked to discover the apathy of the citizens, generally, concerning the needs of our public school system. Shortages of teachers had developed, bond issues for improvement, enlargement and addition to schools were losing support, and it was difficult to interest men to take the responsibility of seeking School Board positions. Abnormal wartime crops of babies were emerging from statistics into living youngsters lining up for enrollment in already overcrowded classrooms.

The State Committee started to work on the idea of a state-wide event, so organized that community observance could be programmed to suit community patterns and command such interests that all citizens would make an annual personal appraisal of their local schools.

This Committee received official support of state government and educational authorities. The Governor of Texas regularly proclaimed the event, as do the legislative bodies, local government heads, mayors, school board members and others.

Presidents of many organizations annually issue statements emphasizing the place of the public school in our American life. They urge citizens to take advantage of Public Schools Week to get better acquainted with the schools and the work they are doing.

All problems confronting our public schools are problems with end results we cannot solve for years to come, or even meet without the active cooperation of every public spirited citizen.

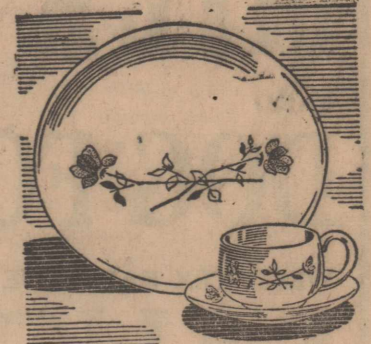

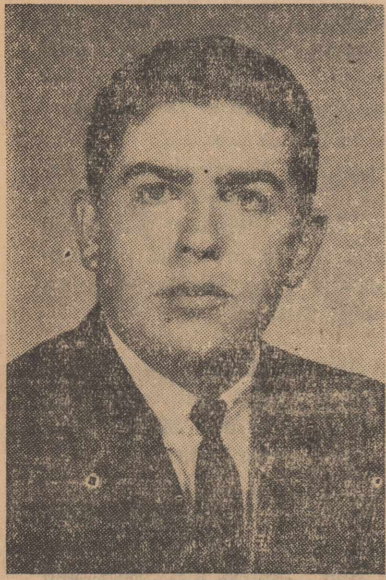

Loyd Senn, Howard County Junior College sophomore, from Rotan, has recently been elected a state director of the Texas Junior Chamber of Commerce, the only time that this office has been held by a college student, so far is known. He is a member of Big Spring Jaycees.

Three Fisher County 4-H Club members are exhibiting steers at the Houston Fat Stock Show this week.

Mark Jameson, Rotan 4-H member, 1 Hereford steer, Mike Herron, Rotan 4-H, 1 Hereford steer and Bobby Smith, McCaulley 4-H, 1 Hereford steer.

This will end this years show season for Fisher County 4-H club members.

Outbreaks of blackleg and malignant edema have been reported by several livestockmen over the county the last few days. Some producers have all ready lost several head of cattle from the diseases.

The diseases cause rather sudden death and since there is no cure, livestock producers are urged to vaccinate cattle as a preventative.

If animals are vaccinated under six month of age re-vaccination may be necessary for lasting immunity.

When vaccinating, it is recommended that a combination shot for both blackleg and malignant edema be used.

Fisher County livestockmen are to be commended on the way they are supporting the Southwest Screwworm Eradication Program. Roger Smith and James Cave, officers of the local committee, report this week that the county has gone over it's quota of \$5,970.00 by \$113.00. Roger's sentiment is the same as several of the other county chair-

men, that is "The idea of County Quotas and County Potentials, plus the promise of a one time investment, must be abandoned for the idea of an all-out effort to eradicate Screwworms from the Southwest and Texas for all generations to come."

Successful operations of the screwworm eradication program in 1963, according to the United States Department of Agriculture, depends on:

1. Taking full advantage of the retarding effects of cold weather on screwworm increase and spread.
2. Preventing entry of screwworm-infested animals into areas freed of the pest.
3. Widespread use by procedure of screwworm preventive measures and pesticide treatments.
4. Quick discovery and reporting of all suspected screwworm cases by producers.

Effectiveness of an artificial barrier now being formed along the southern and western borders of the eradication area to prevent screwworm invasions.

The following suggestions is from the State Eradication Committee: As the weather begins to warm and our normal screwworm season is not too far away, the livestock producer should redouble his vigilance in inspecting animals for possible screwworm cases. Program officials

and Victoria blight, are more important in spring-sown oats than in the fall-sown crop because temperatures become more favorable for these diseases in late maturing oats. Spring seeding of oats also may cause shriveling of the seed because of high temperatures during the fruiting period.

Spring seeding of barley is recommended only in the Rolling Plains and High Plains. True winter type varieties, such as Kearney, Reno or Ward should not be spring sown as they may not head normally. Cordova, Wintex or Rogers may be used for spring seeding.

Spring wheat is not recommended any place in Texas.

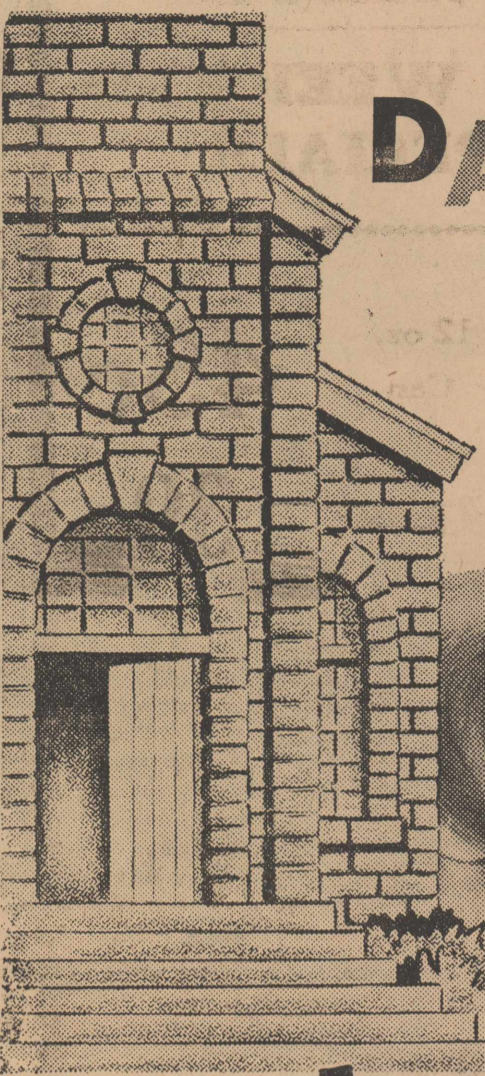

Board of Directors give the following information on cost to taxpayers:

The tax on \$40,000 bond issue is 4c on each \$100 valuation.

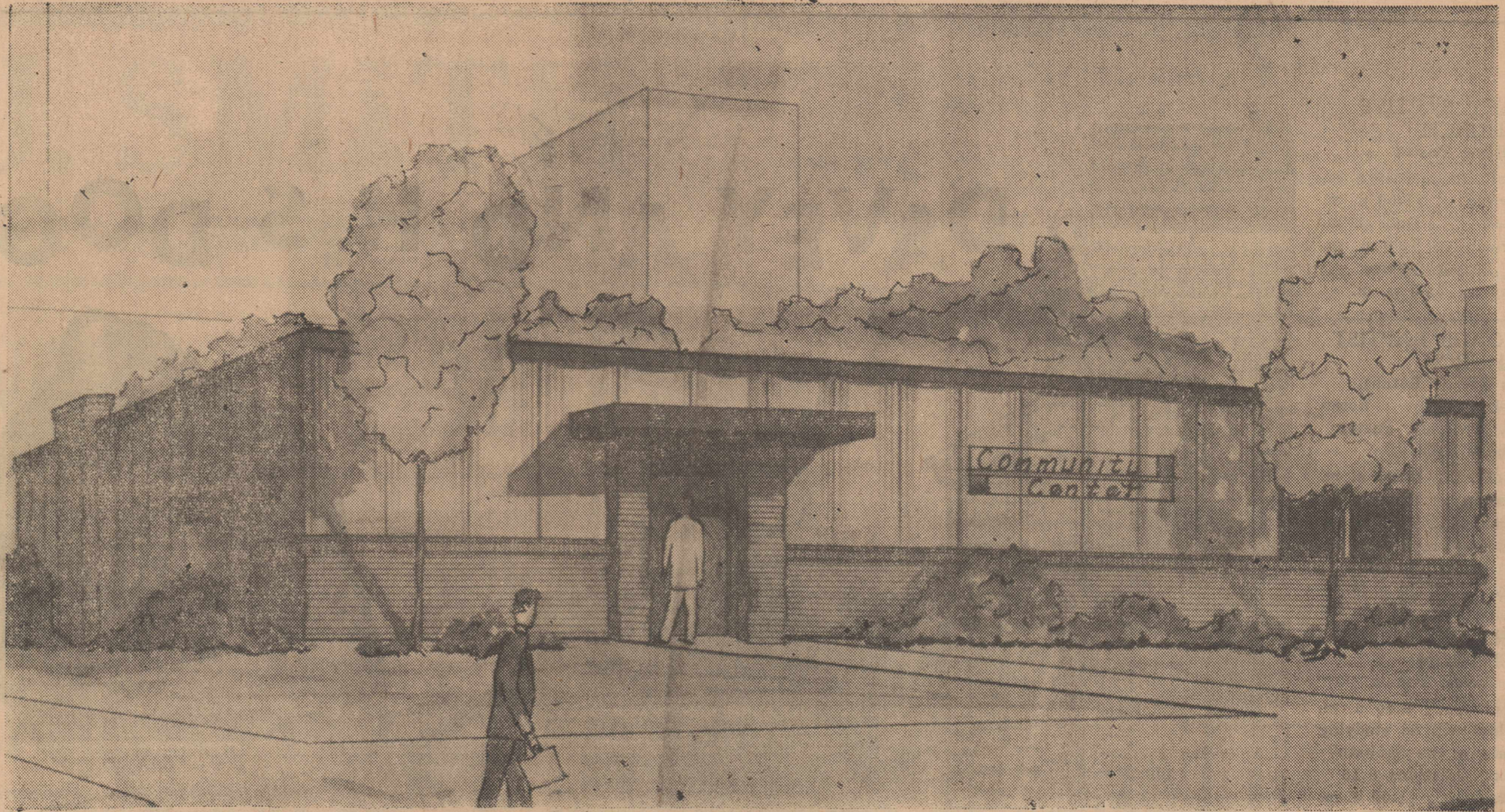
Example: Actual value on \$5,000—County valuation \$900—tax paid 36c annually. Actual value \$10,000—County valuation \$1,800—tax paid 72c annually. Actual value \$20,000—County valuation \$3,600—tax paid \$1.44 annually. The average home owner in Rotan will pay about 60c tax each year on the proposed issue.

Nine directors will formulate all policies for Fisher County Community Center. These directors will come from 9 organizations—one from each. Fisher County Sheriff Posse will be in charge of Rodeo arena. Rotan School will handle FFA arena and Community Center under supervision of the other directors.

These nine directors are: Lions Club, A. B. Parker; Chamber of Commerce, Dwight Nowlin; Jaycees, Chas. Woods; Sheriff Posse, Ray Smith; Fire Dept., Wendell Morrow; Bridge Club, Mrs. Morris Watson; Art Club, Mrs. L. A. Sparks; Beta Sigma Phi, Mrs. Jim Rowland; Rotan School, E. W. Cade.

This is a community project and the board asks full cooperation and help of everyone, as this section of the County needs a Community Center.

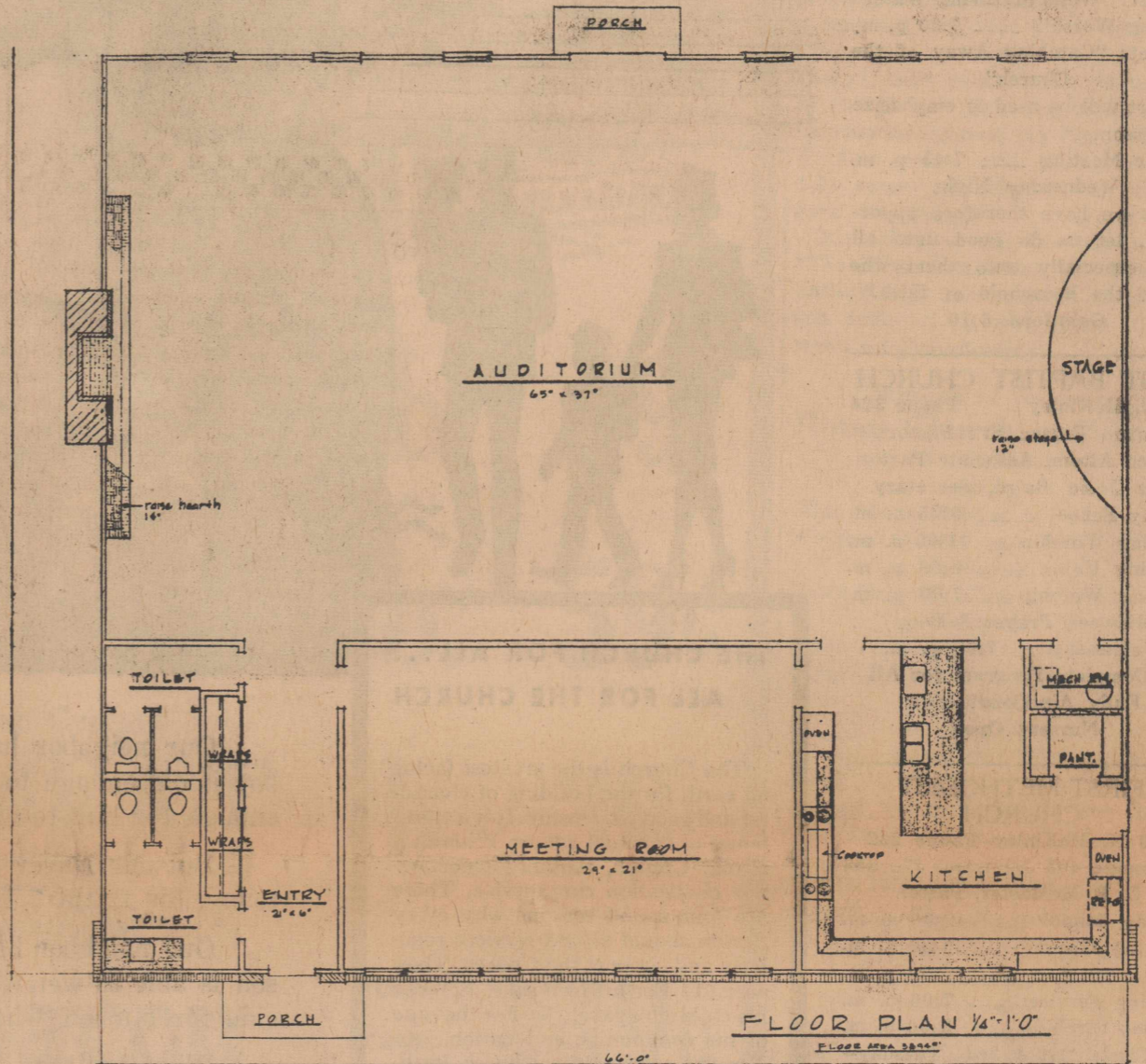

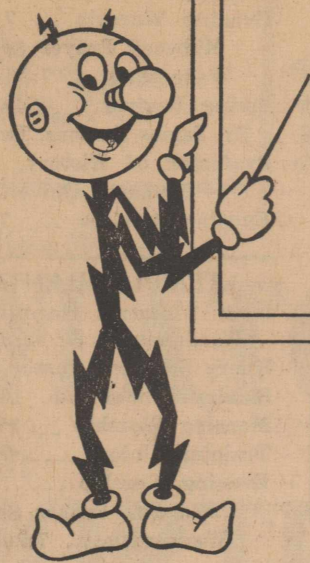
