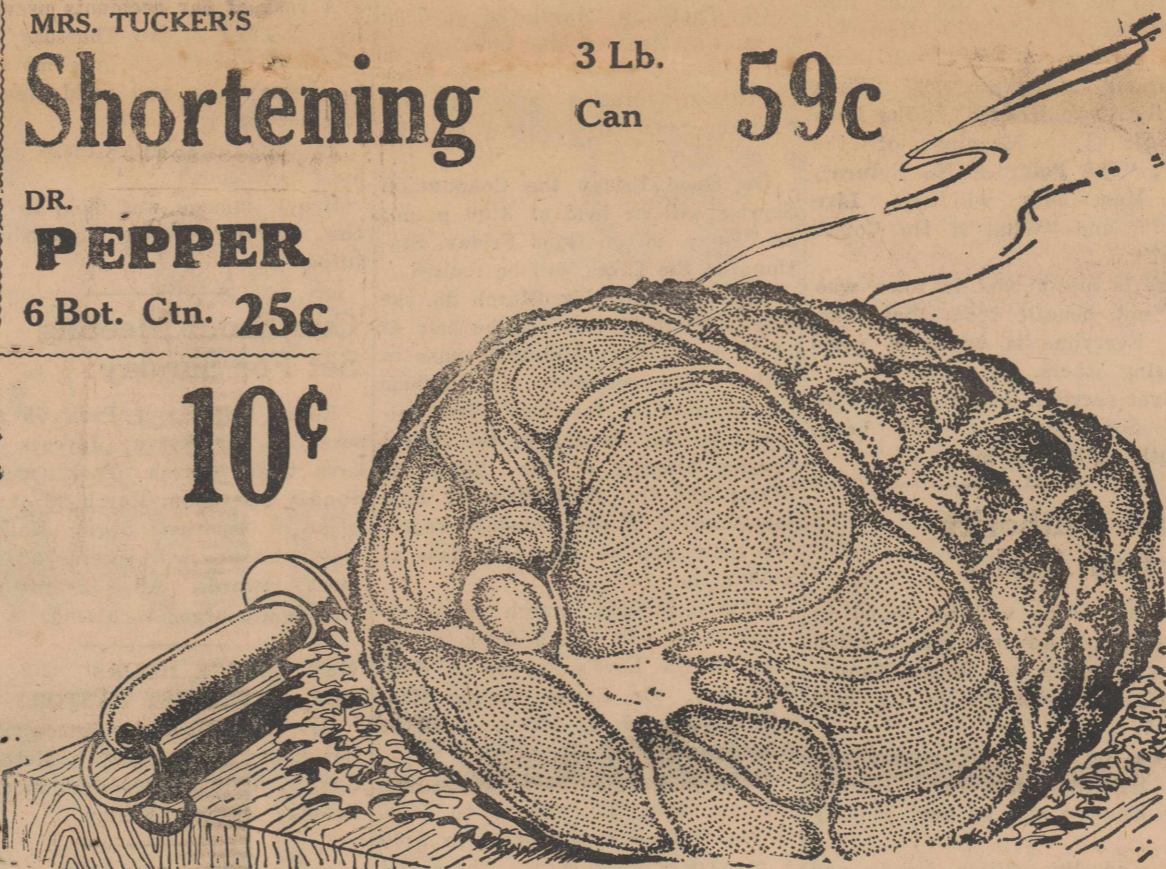

WHEREAS, the terms of two Directors will expire on April 7, 1964, and now it is deemed necessary to hold an election for the purpose of electing two Directors as required by the law above mentioned;

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF ROTAN MUNICIPAL WATER AUTHORITY:

1. That an election be held within said Authority on the 7th day of April, 1964, for the purpose of electing two Directors for said Authority, with each of said Directors to serve for a term of two years from the date of this election, or until his successor is elected and qualified.

2. That said election shall be held at the City Hall, Rotan, Texas.

3. The ballots of said election shall have written or printed thereon substantially the following:

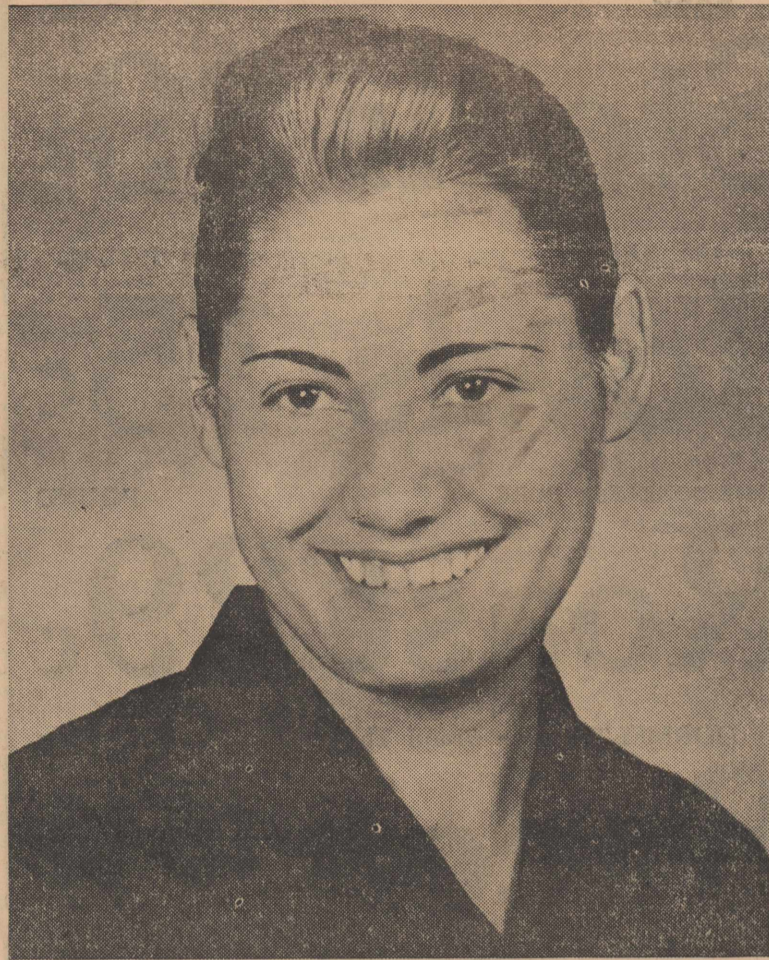

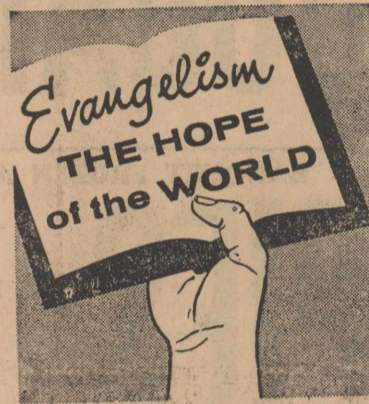

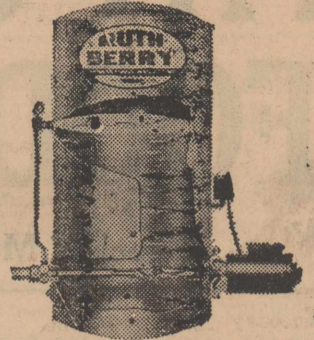

**ROTAN CHILDREN WILL STAR IN MOVIES**



Melton Barker will arrive in Rotan soon to produce a two-reel comedy, according to an announcement by Darwin Barnes, manager of the Lance Theatre. The picture will be made in Rotan and around 100 children will be used in the cast.

Mr. Barker is a veteran of this field, having spent 25 years in the business, training children and producing film with them. Mr. Barker says it will take about two weeks to get the cast together and rehearsed so that they will be able to perform for the cameras. Then, it will take around one week to do the shooting.

After the cast has been selected, there will be two or three days of rehearsals, teaching them to act before the sound camera. There will be a small charge for training. However, there will be no charge for registering and tryouts.

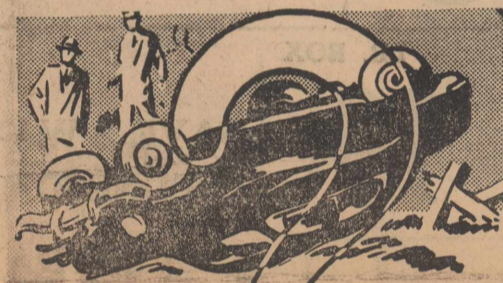

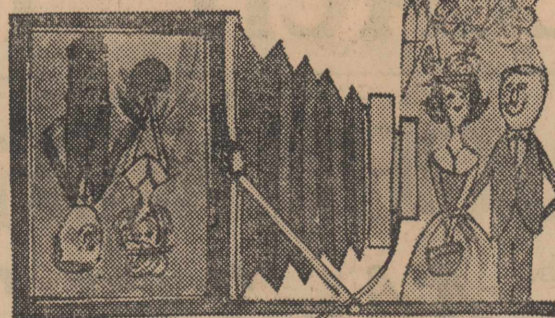

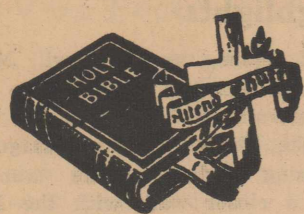

"Not now as a servant, but above a servant, a brother beloved, specially to me, but how much more unto thee, both in the flesh and in the Lord?" Philemon 16.

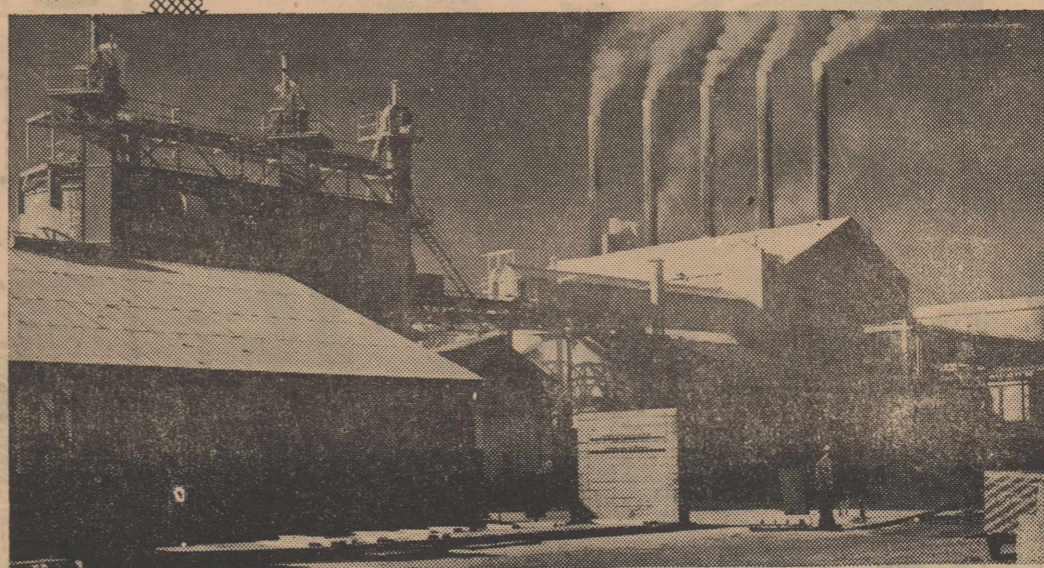

**What Does Lent Mean?**

What does Lent mean? Lent means a time of personal surrender to God. Also, is it a time of spiritual renewal of self.

What must we do in order to find spiritual renewal of self? First, we must be regular in our worship of God.

One who is regular in his worship, (which is renewed self-commitment to God,) finds an experience with God. His life is enriched. His home is strengthened. His personal faith is deepened.

One who worships regularly finds

a new power from God. He finds power for victorious daily living; power to overcome defeat; power to strengthen his life; power to help him overcome temptation.

One who worships regularly finds a growing faith in God. Many of us are like the football player who gets his uniform, but never practices. When asked why he hasn't been out to practice, he answers: "Look, I'm a football player, I have a uniform."

He has forgotten there is more to playing football than wearing a uniform. And there is more to being a Christian than bearing the name or joining the church.

Second, if we are to find spiritual renewal of self, we must be regular in our prayer life.

Prayer is many things to many people. I like the definition which says prayer is the act of putting one's self completely into the power of God's working. By the act of prayer we so subordinate our own wishes to the creativity of God that we allow him to work in and through us.

From the act of prayer we find forgiveness of our sins, resources to meet any life situation, and strength to help others.

Too often in life we concentrate on our sins rather than our Sav-

ious, on our problems rather than our power, and on our fears rather than our faith. Through prayer we can so completely yield our liv-

es to God that He can work in and through us by the act of self-commitment to Him.

Eliminations will be held March 17, and those nine students scoring the highest will represent Rotan at the U. I. L. meet in the spring.

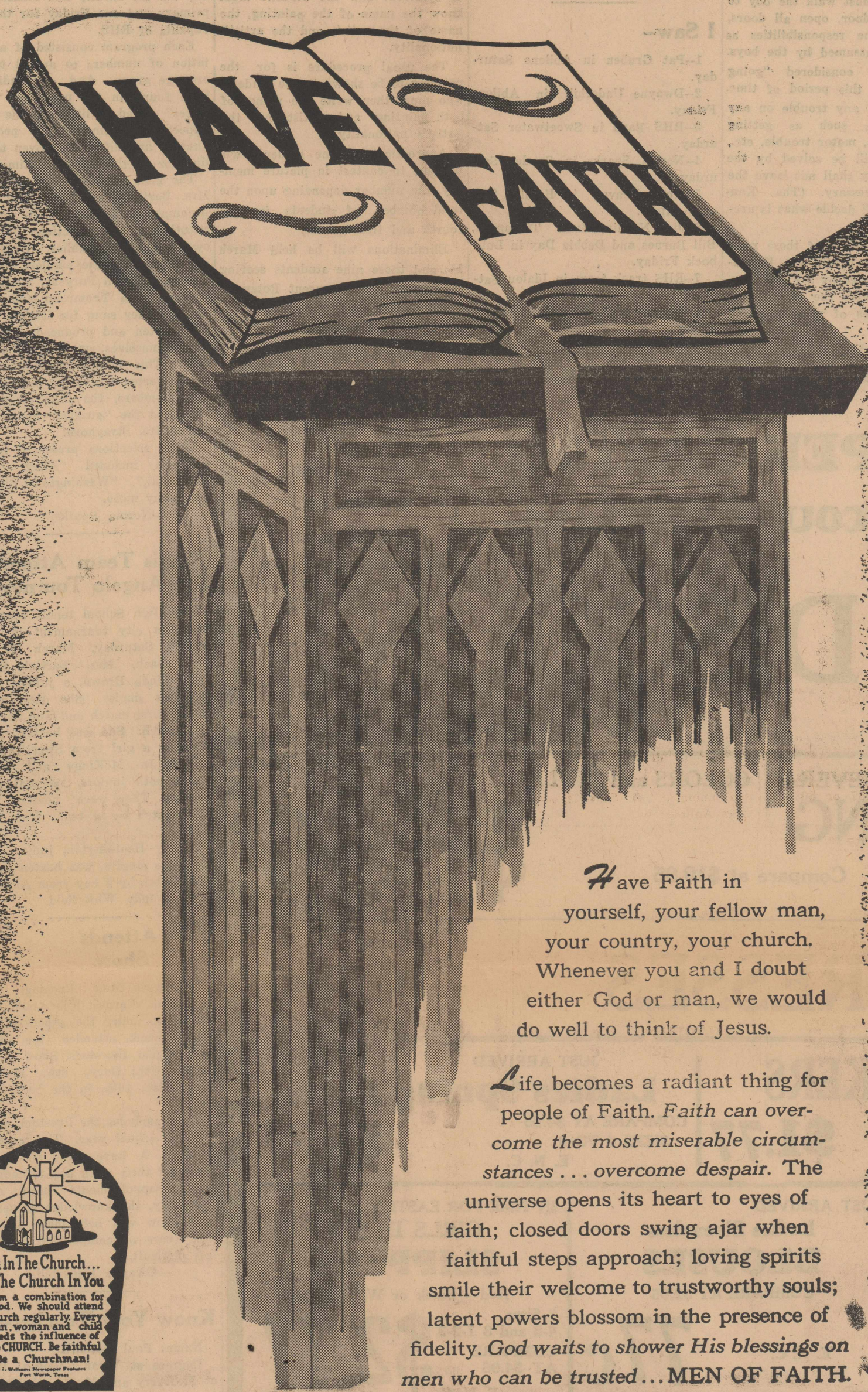
