The Cotton Classing Office of the Commodity Credit Corporation with classing office in Abilene, Texas, has informed the managers of the cotton gins that a penalty of six and one half ' $61 / 2$ ' cents per pound will be levied against cotton bales made up of remnants of cotton. This means we cannot put two or more remnants to make up a bale without being assessed this $61 / 2 \mathrm{c}$ per pound.

In the past we have been able to handle this condition without too much loss. but we cannot continue the prac tice with the loss of $61 / 2 \mathrm{c}$ per pound penalty.

For this reason we are asking the cotton farmers to cooperate with us and strive to avoid having remnants of cotton. Over a full season of ginning, this $61 / 2 \mathrm{c}$ penalty on remnant bales as now handled would cost lots of money.
