### County Agent News

Populations of the pecan nut casebearer seem to be dereloping ahead of schedule this spring in Texas. John G. Thomas, Extension entomologist at Texas A&M University, said reports from entomologists and county agents in different areas of the state indicate the most destructive insect pest of pecans appears to be about 10 days ahead of last year's first appearances.

Thomas added reports from Denton, Stephenville, and survey entomologist from Texas A&F strongly indicate an early emergenc of moths his season. He emphasized that pecan growers should check their banded trees very closely for the presence of casebearer pupae. If they are found, they should be removed and placed in the emergence containers or cages, Thomas said.

The entomologist said the bands should be replaced on the trees to catch any late pupating larvae. The determination for the need of a second application of insecticide for casebearer control can be established from these

Thomas explains the early population observations do not in themselves mean that control application schedules will be earlier. However, he adds, it is very likely that moth emergence and egg laying will be 5 to 10 days earlier than normal.

The Extension entomologist reminds that pecan producers should get their spraying equipment in good working condition and arrange for the needed chemicals or make arrangements with a commeria applicator so spraying can e done on schedule.

Since timing of the spray chedule is so important Thomas urges pecan growers to keep in touch with the local county agent in order to know when to apply the control measures.

### **Checklist For** Home Errors

Errors in building or guying a home can haunt you for many years, cautions Mrs. Jane Berry, housing and home furishings specialist at Texas A&M University.

Before you buy or build, make a list of your family's needs and check them off one by one. This can reduce the probability of your making a mistake.

Here are a few points to consider:

1) Can you afford the house you have chosen? Have you realistically weighed All family living costs? Have you left leeway for possible increases in living costs? Taxes? If you have small children, have you included in your calculations the rising costs of their needs as they grow older?

2) Do you suffer from allergies? If so, was this taken into consideration in heating and cooling the house?

3) Is there an easy escape out of each room in the event

4) Are there anti-slip surfaces on stairs, baths, showers, et cetera?

5) Are there hand railings on stairways and protection against doors opening directly onto stairs?

6) Does the house have fire walls and doors in such hazard areas as the central heating unit?

7) Have you selected the best financial plan for your situation?

8) What about the water supply and sewage disposal facilities?

9) Is the floor plan designed to fit the way you live? This varies greatly from family to family, depending on the stage of the family

10) Does the house have adequate storage?

Mrs. Berry emphasized that these are only a few factors you should watch in building or buying a house. No house is right for everybody, and the wrong one can be an expensive-long-lived mistake.




