BRO. W. E. WHITTEMBERG sends the following letter for publication. It certainly ought to settle the question:

STATE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE, TOPEKA, KAN., May 25, 1887. W. E. Whittemberg, Esq., Honey Grove, Texas--Dear Sir: Yours of the 20th instant, asking for information as to the workings of the prohibition law in Kansas, received.

Notwithstanding the expressed opinions of the "whiskytits" that Kansas would lose its people, trade and fine appearance if the saloons were closed, it can be truthfully said that the State was never more prosperous than at present, and a larger per cent of the people who are settling within her borders come on account of the determination of her people to make prohibition law.

On the other hand, it is well known that if the prohibitionists were sufficiently venal to bribe orators or newspapers, they have not the funds. Yet the press of Texas is by an overwhelming majority in favor of the amendment, and this, too, without money and without price.

THE News (Dallas and Galveston) ought to be delighted when the fourth of August has come and gone. As the boys say, it seems to be "running out of soap" for the leading editorial it is called upon to furnish anti-prohibitionists daily.

Master Kansas State Grange P. of H. Mr. Sims is also Secretary of the Department of Agriculture of Kansas.

PROHIBITION was discussed at the Taylor picnic, June 25, by Dr. Robinson and Capt. J. Moore, of Austin; Col. Herring, of Waco, and Joe Stewart, of Austin, ladied out whisky "reason" and lager beer "philosophy." Three thousand people listened.

Two prohibition clubs were organized at Albany the past week--one for the town and one for the county. Such men as the following are officers: Capt. McNulty, Edgar Moore, Dr. W. C. Mood, Judge J. L. Fisher, Samuel Spears, O. D. Cheatham.

SOME big prohibition guns were fired at the Henderson barbeque, June 25. Capt. R. M. Wyane, of Fort Worth; Col. Geo. P. Finlay, Galveston; Col. W. S. Herndon and J. M. Duncan, of Tyler; and Gov. Webster Finligan, of Henderson.

ONE of the largest audiences ever collected in Clarksville listened to prohibition speeches from Capt. H. N. Lightfoot and Hon. D. B. Culbertson, June 25.

REV. C. V. RIDLEY reports Montgomery for the amendment. He spoke at Navasota Monday night.

M. B. TEMPLETON, of Waxahachie, made Hon. Barnett Gibbs feel bad in a discussion at Midlothian, June 21.

IT is asserted that seventy-five per cent. of the lawyers of the State are for prohibition.

Railroad Earnings. The gross earnings of 102 roads for May, as compiled by the St. Louis Republican, make a favorable showing--the totals having been \$39,102,262 in 1887, and \$22,594,551 in 1886, an increase of 73.57, 80.1, or 15.7 per cent.

THE prohibition law in Kansas is a success and does prohibit. Taxation is not increased, and the general prosperity of our people is promoted thereby. No open saloons are to be found in the State, and but few drug stores or other places where liquor can be obtained for other purposes than contemplated by the law.

A New Boycott. ST. LOUIS, June 24.--At to-day's session of the Travelers' Protective Association of the United States, resolutions were unanimously adopted demanding from all railroads the sale to commercial travelers of 1,000 and 5,000 mile tickets at materially reduced rates.
