Sometimes a Chinaman will subject himself to considerable self-denial in order to help his friends. I give one instance of their kind: A few days ago a cook approached his master and asked him for an advance on his wages, as he was much in need of money.

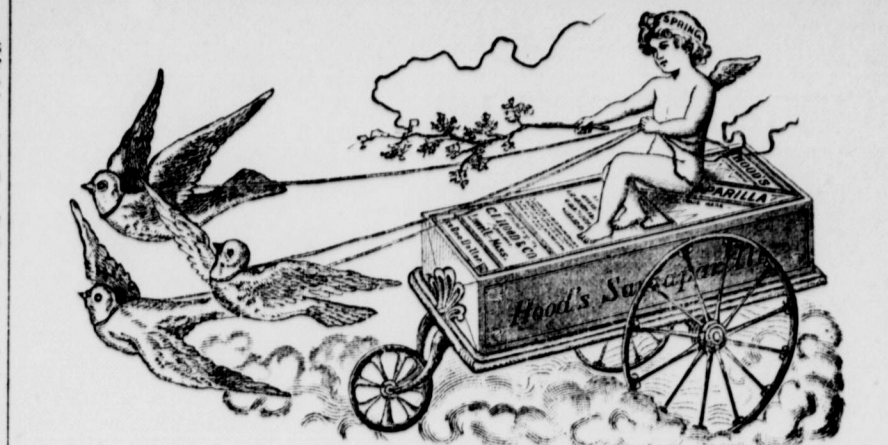

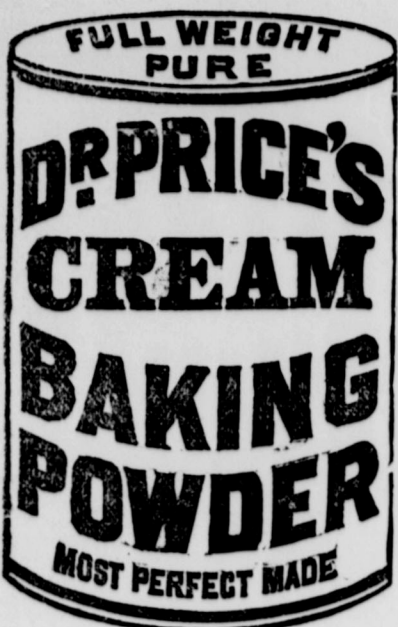

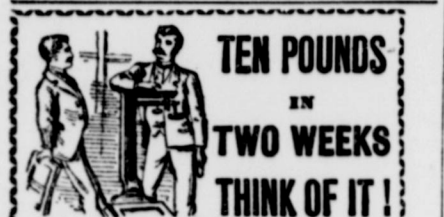
