### GRAND JURY RETURNS INDICTMENT CHARLES HOLT NOW FREE ON BOND

The Fisher County Grand Jury returned three indictments last Friday. In two of the three cases the names of those involved were released. In the case of the mysterious high ranking agriculture department employee, the grand jury returned a sealed indictment.

This sealed indictment kept the veil of secrecy around the high ranking official for an additional 72 hours. Texas Ranger W.D. Vicker supposedly mailed the sealed indictment to

Austin Ranger headquarters late last Friday afternoon. Under normal circumstances the indictment would have been served by Austin Ranger officials and the subject arrested.

Last Monday night at approximately 10:00 Charles Holt and his attorney, Temple Dickson of Sweetwater, voluntarily appeared before Fisher County Deputy Sheriff Mickey Counts. Holt was technically placed under arrest and charged with "theft over \$200, a felony." It was almost five weeks

after the alleged theft took place before Charles Holt was finally arrested and charged. Then it was not a patrolman or Texas Ranger or even a Deputy Sheriff that went out and seized Holt, he turned himself in to the resident Deputy Sheriff just a few blocks from where the alleged transfer of \$1,269.00 took place.

Holt sold Bob Terry, owner of Roby Aero Spraying, 4 barrels of Cynthion insecticide for \$1,269.00. The sale took place on or about September 29, and with full knowledge of law enforcement officials.

According to Terry, Holt contacted him and offered to sell four barrels of boll weevil control insecticide that was in storage in a small town south of Big Spring, Texas. The chemical was supposed to be left over from a previous state spraying job.

Holt asked Terry how much he would pay for the chemical and then accepted Terry's price of \$6.00 per gallon. The average wholesale price of the insecticide is from \$12.00 to \$14.00 per gallon.

Immediately after Holt agreed to sell Terry the chemical the Roby flyer contacted Fisher County Attorney Rudy Hamric for assistance in making the

purchase. Terry had a strong suspicion that Holt was going to sell him chemicals that rightfully belonged to the State of Texas.

Holt would not accept a check for the purchase, so Mrs. Bob Terry went to the Citizens State Bank for cash. After cashing the check the serial numbers of the bills were recorded.

Charles Roscoe Holt, age 44, is originally from Childress, Texas. He was born on May 10, 1932. He has been with the Texas Agriculture department since June 1, 1966. His title is Head State Entomologist. According to an employee of the State Agriculture Department, he has four or five state entomologists under him.

Counts indicated that Holt and Attorney Dickson entered the Fisher County Court House at approximately 10:00 p.m., and were on their way out 20 minutes later. Holt was fingerprinted, had a mug shot taken, posted bond in the amount of \$3,500.00 and was released. The two other cases involved Anastacio Campos and Gilbert Castillio. They were both indicted for destruction of private property-criminal mischief. The last case involved Mr. and Mrs. Ronald Richardson of Sweetwater. They were in-

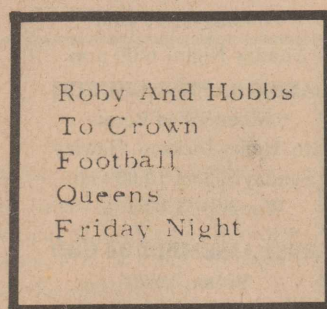
dicted for burglary of a vacant building belonging to Thomas Walker.

The next official move in the case of Charles Holt will be up to Holt's attorney, Temple Dickson, and District Attorney Frank Ginzell.

According to David Ivie, Director of Agriculture and Environmental Services Division in Austin, Holt is in charge of monitoring the pest regulation program (boll weevil) and has eight people directly under his jurisdiction. Five of those people are entomologists and three are

staff members.

Holt was suspended on Monday, October 4, 1976 by Commissioner White.

### Rain Slows Harvest

The cotton harvest had gained a good momentum but rains this week have brought it to an absolute standstill, reports B.B. Manly, Jr. of the USDA Cotton Classing Office, Abilene.

Prices paid for cotton were very good, and range from 60 to 71 cents per pound, depending on the quality. Grade 41, staple 31, and mike 3.5-4.9 brought around 67 cents per pound. Generally, firms paid 35 to 35.50 cents above the Government loan rate.

Around 8,000 samples were processed during the week ending October 29, bringing the total to 15,000 for the season. About 7,000 had been processed by this

date last year.

Cotton qualities showed little change from a week ago. Predominant grades were 41 with 41 percent; 42 with 18 percent; 51 with 15 percent; and 31 with 12 percent. Twenty-seven percent was call bark. The predominant staples were 31 at 52 percent; 32 with 26 percent, and 30 with 13 percent.

Micronaire readings were 87 percent in the premium category with 7 percent above and 6 percent below.

The average breaking strength on the Pressley Zero Gauge was 83,000 pounds per square inch.

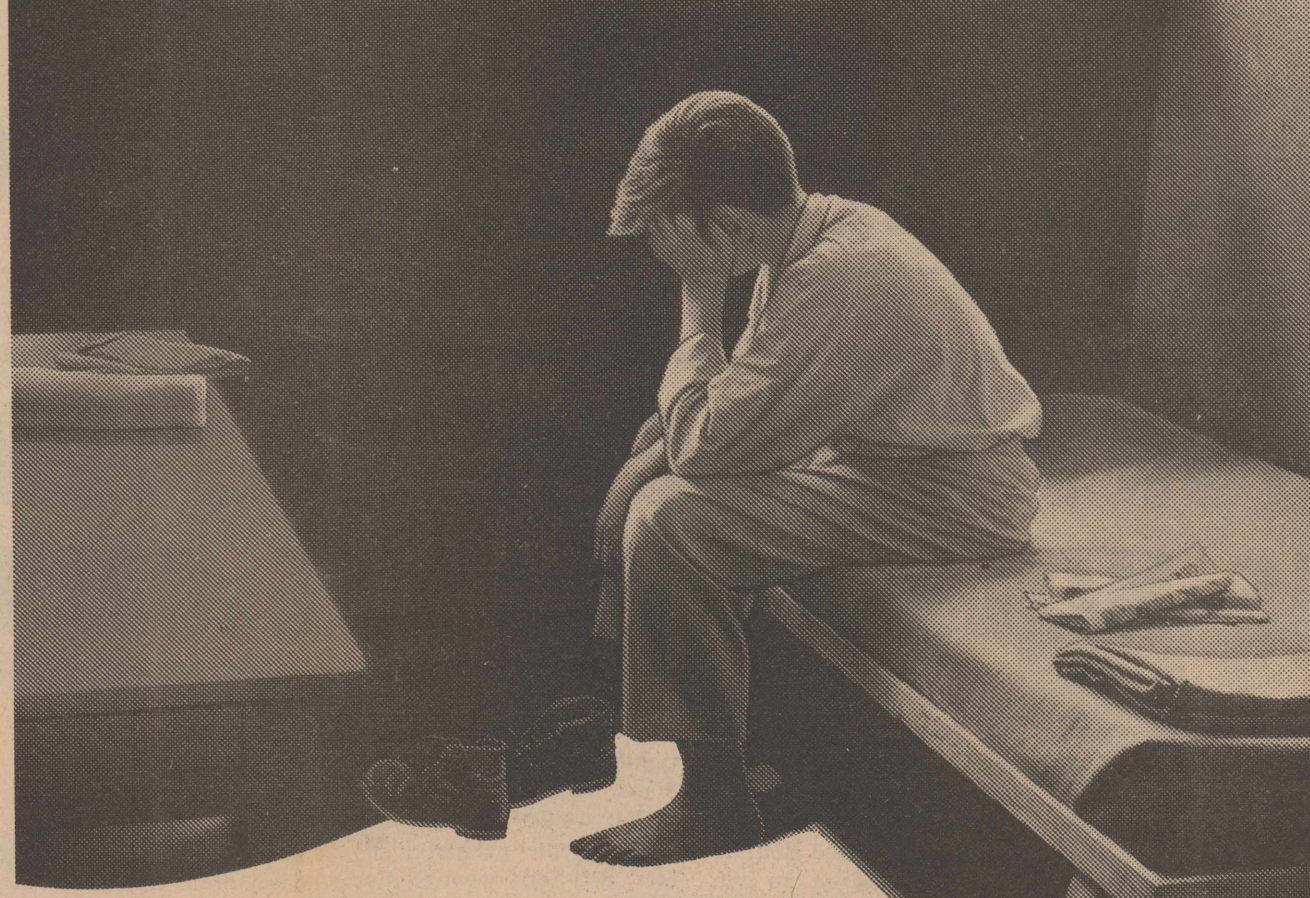

### Savings Bond Report Given

August sales of Series E and H United States Savings Bonds in Fisher County amounted to \$1,966. Sales for the eight-month period totaled \$27,759 for 46% of the 1976 sales goal of \$60,000.

Texas sales during the month amounted to \$26,412,532, while sales for the first eight months of 1976 totaled \$188,888,470 with 69% of the yearly sales goal of \$272.4 million achieved.

### Hobbs HDC Club Meeting

The Hobbs Home Demonstration Club met in the home of Mrs. J.P. Phillips Oct. 28.

Mrs. Turner Houghton, president, presided and called the meeting to order at 2:30. Thought for the Day: Remember when you throw dirt you lose ground.

Mrs. Clarence Anderson called the roll which was answered with "my favorite wild game dish". She also read the minutes of the last meeting.

Mrs. Dale Cave was in charge of the program on wild game. She stated, "The quality of game meat depends on how the game is handled from the time of kill until served on the family table. Game foods properly dressed and prepared can add pleasant variety to the family menu. Since the first hunter took weapon in hand to search for game, experience has accumulated in the field dressing and preparation of game for eating. We have dark meat such as duck, goose and dove, and quail for the light meat."
