


POSSE RODEO GETS UNDERWAY

S.S. And All Welfare Plans Are Confused

Frequently someone comes in asking questions about the "Welfare program you operate." So much confusion exists about the role played by the Social Security Administration, that some direct information about what we do should help those who do not understand.

Congress placed upon the Social Security Administration the full responsibility for administering the Aged, Blind, and Disabled portions of the programs which previously were administered by the State Department of Public Welfare.


Since January 1974 these programs the State operated have been run by the Social Security Administration as the Supplemental Security Income program.

Another area of confusion that developed when the Supplemental Security Income Program started was with the Texas Medicaid Program. The Social Security Administration does not administer the Medicaid program. It is still a State program administered under

the Medicaid program. Department of Public Welfare. Through an agreement between the Social Security


Administration and the State of Texas, anyone eligible for SSI is automatically eligible for Medicaid. For this reason many people mistakenly think that the Social Security Administration administers

McCaulley Has Local Named Rodeo Leader

Ms. Diltizie Edmondson of McCaulley has been appointed a spokesman in the Girls' Rodeo Association by Jeana Day Felts, director of the organization's Texas region.

The local woman will work with judges and represent members in all GRA rodeo events that might take place in Texas and Oklahoma.

The association, headquartered in Spencer, Okla., has more than 600 members, with another 1500 contesting on a permit basis, not yet having qualified for full membership. The association was organized in 1948 for the mutual protection and benefit of female professional rodeo contestants.

Last year, members participated in more than 550 barrel racing events across the nation, as well as in nearly 30 all-girl rodeos. In addition to barrel racing, GRA-approved events include bareback bronc riding, bull riding, steer undecorating, goat tying, team roping and calf roping.

Ms. Edmondson became a GRA member in 1968. From a rodeo family, she competes in all events.
