City Secretary Billie Lois Wetsel indicated that the Roby City Commission discussed the area of solicitors and salesmen at their meeting for July that was held last Friday, July 8th.

In the discussion, the Roby Commissioners instructed Jimmy Hayes, city manager, to review the model ordinance book and make recommendations back to the commission in August concerning the possible revision of the current solicitors license.

As the current ordinance reads, all solicitors and magazine salesmen are prohibited from selling door to door with the exception of local citizens and organizations.

In other action the commission approved the purchase of four additional stop signs to replace four existing signs and approved paying the expenses of two firemen to attend the fire training

school at Texas A&M University.

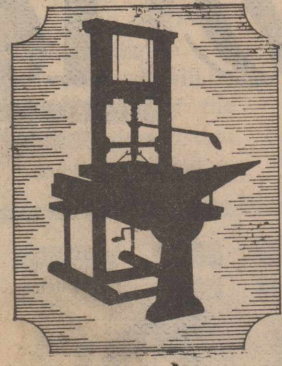

Weaver is assigned to co-ordinate all National Gypsum bargaining for the union.

Local union members met with Balliet and K.L. Swanson of Irving, both union representatives, last Monday night. "We had an exceptionally good turnout", indicated Balliet with respect to the large number of local union employees that showed up for the meeting.

said, "is to help raise the money to purchase a kidney profusion machine."

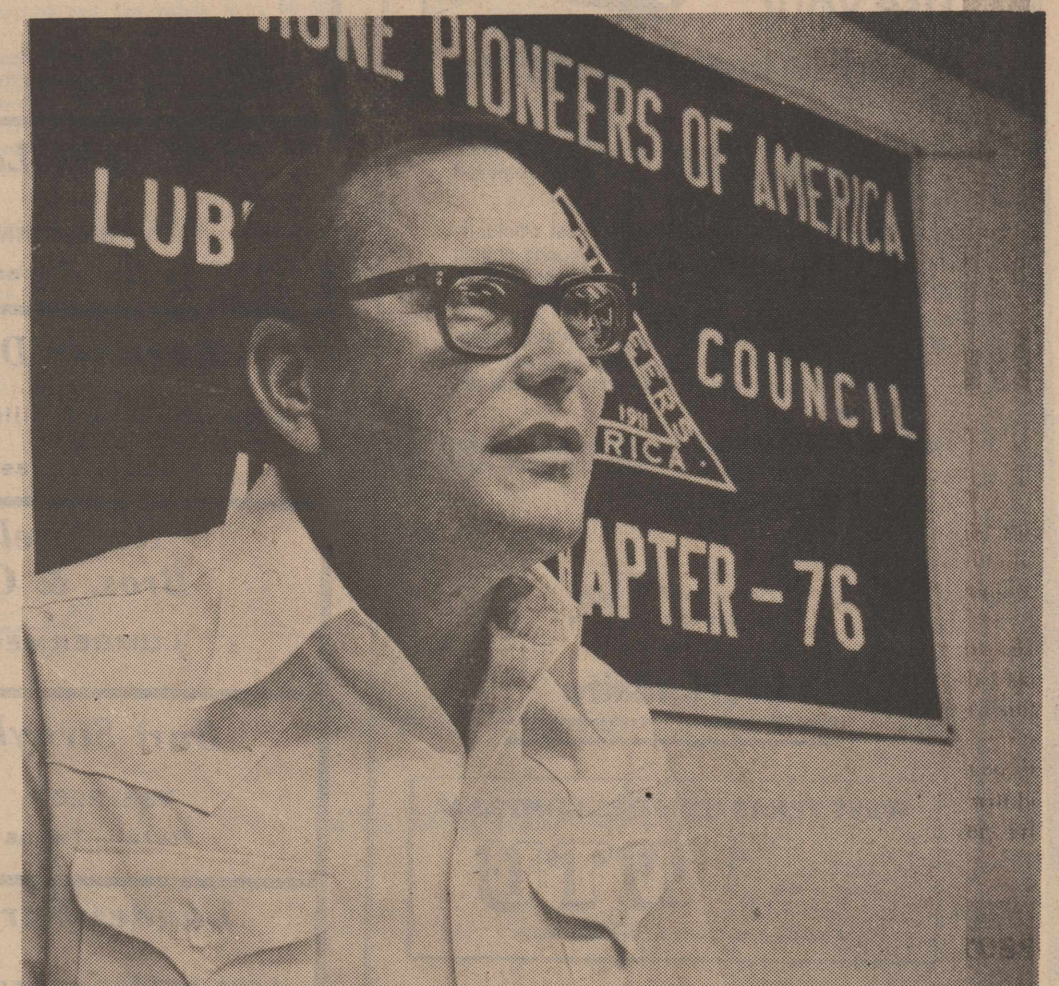
The profusion machine keeps a donor's kidney alive until a transplant can be arranged.

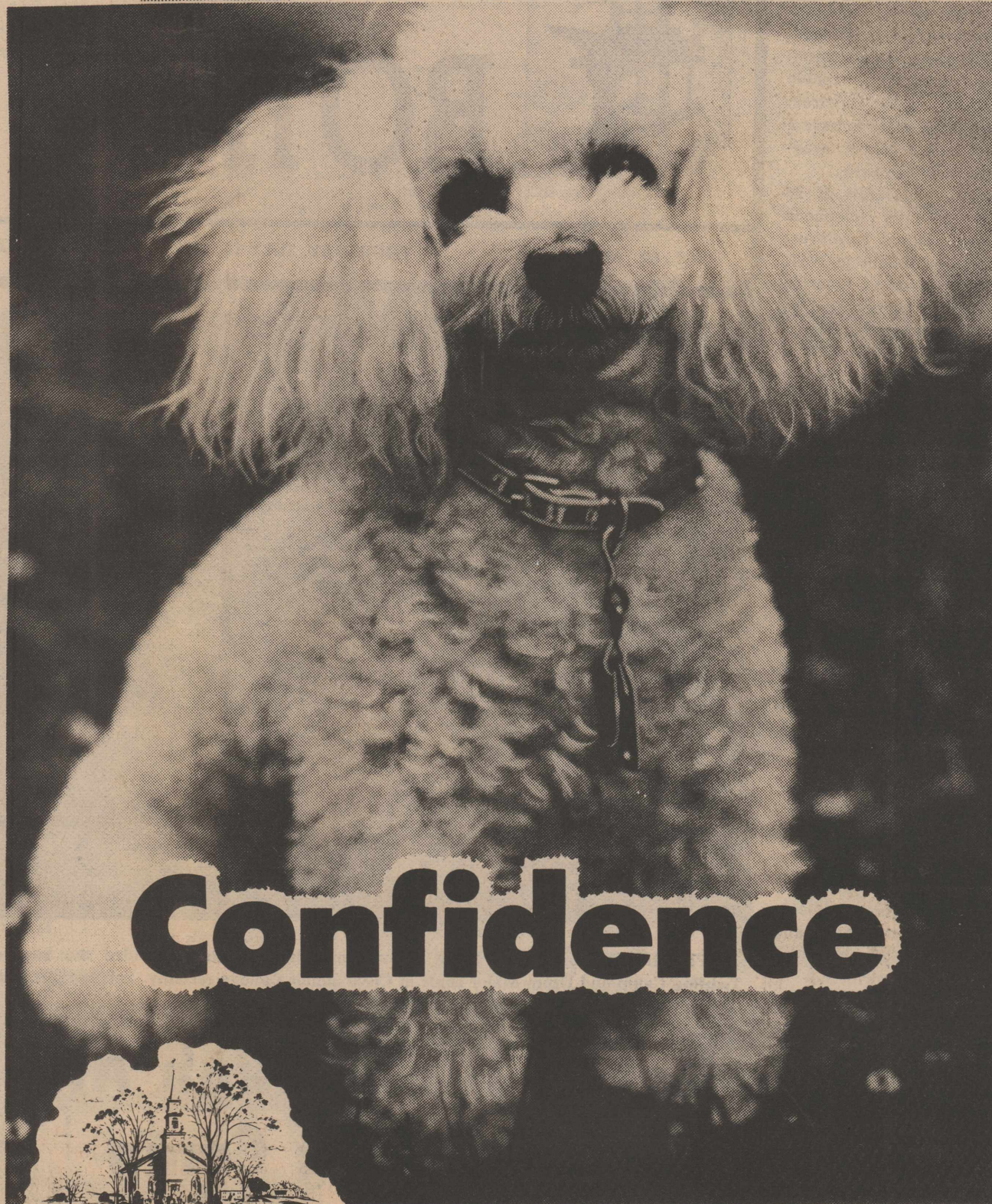

There will be two very important aspects to this meeting, according to Steve Carriker, president of the group. First, John Keith of Texas Farmers Union's Green Thumb employment program for senior citizens will be meeting to lay the groundwork for expansion of this very successful program into Fisher County. 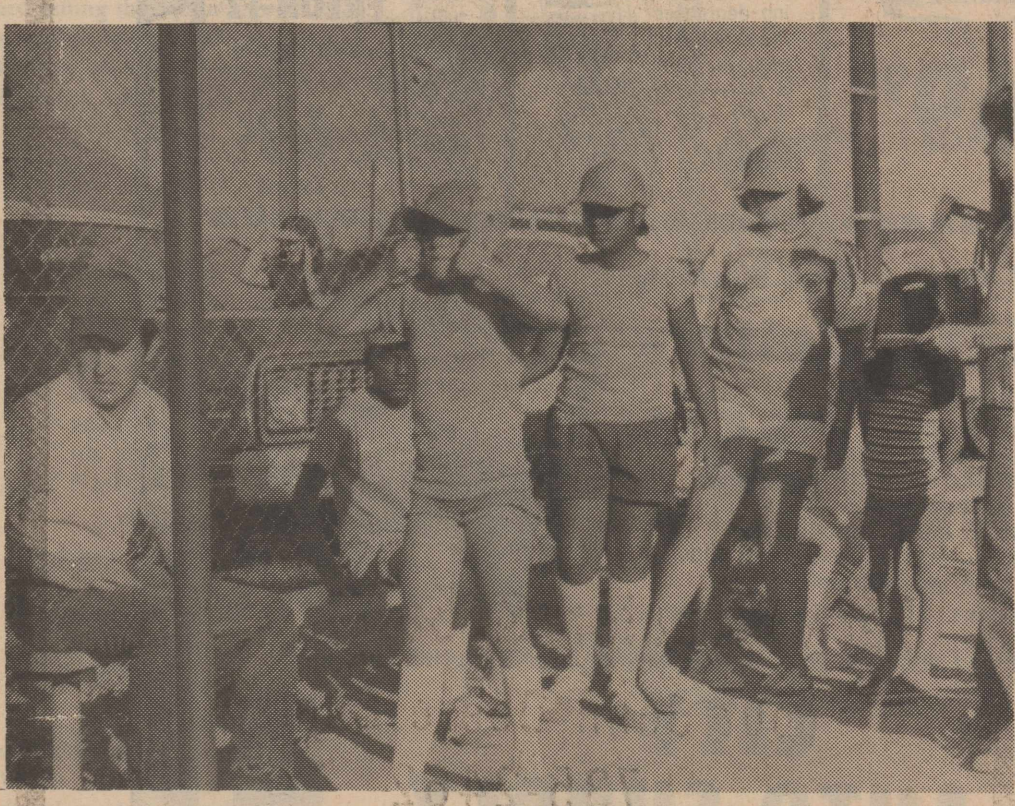
