

COURAGE TO FAIL

One of the bravest planes of life upon which we can live is that plane where we live with "Courage to Fail". This sounds strange to us because the American way of life is described by words like "success" and "winner". We do not think of the words "courage" and "fail" being used to compliment each other. Why do people quit something that they have started? Is it because of failure? No! For all of us have failed but not all of us have quit. Also, outdoor cooking is a real energy saver and makes food flavors better, especially in the summer, or when weather permits. All appliances should be flat bottomed and straight sided so the heat will be even. Pots and pans should have tight fitting lids and use as little water as possible and cook on low burners. Ovens should be preheated only long enough to start cooking. Don't open oven door until time is up on what ever you might be cooking. Also, cooking several dishes in the oven conserves energy. Electric ovens can be turned off 5 minutes before cooking time is up and still have enough heat to finish. She said it was

More dependence is being placed on the honeybee these days to pollinate the \$50 million crop of cucurbits in Texas. About 79,000 acres are grown annually. They are grown in every county of the state, if not commercially, then in backyard gardens.

Cucurbits--watermelons, cucumbers, cantaloupe, pumpkin, squash, and gourd,--all belong to the same plant family which absolutely depends on insect help to transfer pollen from male flowers to female flowers.

Only female flowers can produce fruit, but to do so each female flower must receive pollen from a male flower. Once transferred, the pollen fertilizes the immature seed causing it to be fertile and grow. Unfertilized fruit abort when vialbe pollen is not transferred.

"Most cucurbit flowers are open for only one day, and since honeybees account for about 85 percent of all flower pollination, the importance of this insect to this plant family is vital."
