Our first step system of laws function effectively. If our citizens do not respect our laws by demanding punishment, impossible to enforce our criminal code. Until more of us are willing to participate in the criminal justice system by serving on juries and administeriing the punishment that fits the crime, our problems with miscounduct
will grow. will grow.
Lack of respect for our
criminal justice system is cause, in part, because cause, in part, because
there is no effective method of insuring that a person who had committed a crime will actually serve time in prison. Statictics show there is only a 2 percent probability of conviction if a person likelihood of being arrested is minimal. Secondly, even if arrested, the chances of being prosecuted are slim. Third, conviction can be complicated because of the rules of evidence. Fourth, even after conviction, probation is often likely. Fifth, the or reverse execution of a or reverse execution of a
sentence. Lastly, felons can be paroled from prison before serving the full sentence.
In recent years we have literally tied the hands of our law enforcement officials and thus have made the arrest and prosecution of criminals even more
difficult if not impossible. Their frustrations are self-evident when you talk to law enforcement offici-
