As *** for many plants approaches, home gardeners should techniques before manning pruning shears and saws.
Improper pruning can esult in poor growth natural plant forms, poor flower and fruit
production, and occasionally even death of the lant.
Following basic guide lines for pruning can ransform a tree or shrub into a beautiful plant

To begin, have a reason for pruning. Consider ear and season of the year and the need for
pruning before taking that first snip. Many times here is no reason at all for pruning if the tree is hale The dorm
November through January may not necessarily be the best time to prune every plant on your landscape. Deciduous trees and shrubs, vines,
ground covers, and everground covers, and ever-
greens probably can be greens probably can be ear. However, exceptions hclude spring-liowering forsythia, bridal wreath and gardenias, which should be pruned after hey flower. Do not prune Using mid-February. mportant proper tools is important for safety and adequate cutting. Use
hand shears for smal hand shears for smal
twigs under one-half inch twigs under one-half inch
in diameter. Long-handled lopping shears are best for branches one-half to one inch in size. Larger branches require a prun ing saw. A long-handled pole pruner or saw is necessary for cutting high ranches. May cuts flush with the runk since stubs do not heal properly. As years deterioration spreads down the trunk until the tree falls over
Seal cuts more than two inches in diameter with a pruning paint sealer. Th
