

Tim Carrillo Wins Area PP&K, Florida Next Stop

Tim Carrillo, 12-year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Paulo Carrillo, represented Rotan in the area finals of the Ford Punt, Pass and Kick competition last Sunday afternoon at Texas Stadium in Irving. He competed against Robin Roberts of Ardmore, Oklahoma and

won with a score of 340 ft., 10 feet better than his competition.

Mr. and Mrs. Paulo Carrillo and Mr. and Mrs. Ray Brown, owners of the local Ford dealership, accompanied Carrillo to Irving.

Carrillo now moves on to the Division Competitions on December 16 at Tampa Bay, Florida. He is to perform, with thirteen other 12-year old winners, each representing National Football Conference teams in the NFL, at the halftime ceremony between the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Kansas City Chiefs.

Mr. and Mrs. Paulo Carrillo will accompany their son to Florida.

Carrillo will compete with 13 other Area Champions in his age group for

the right to represent the Division at the National PP&K Finals which will be held at Super Bowl XIV on January 20, 1980. A preliminary run-off will be held prior to the game to narrow the field down to two competitors in each age group. These 12 youngsters will then compete just prior to, and during the game to determine the 6 division champions.

This is the 19th year that the Ford dealers of America have sponsored PP&K competitions. No other Rotan youngster has advanced to the division finals.

Carrillo was fitted with a Dallas Cowboy uniform, complete with pads and helmet, and will wear this uniform at the Florida competition.

Sepeda Makes 8A All District First Team

Twenty-five first team All District players were named by the seven coaches of district 8A, with only one player from Rotan's district winning team making the elite list. Rotan did manage to get seven boys named to the second team All-District squad with honorable mention going to seven other local players.

Rotan senior Eli Sepeda was a unanimous All-District pick as a defensive down lineman on the first team. He holds the distinction of being the only Rotan player to capture first team honors from the 10-0 1979 season.

Offensive second-team honors went to Mark Cade, senior, center position; Alva West, junior, guard position; David Thornton, junior, receiver position; Byron Weathersbee, junior, quarterback position; and Mark Nowlin, senior, at the running back position.

Defensive second team honors were given to Willie Hayes, junior, linebacker position; and Kip Pease, sophomore, secondary position.

A total of seven Rotan players were given honorable mentions on the All-District team. They include: Wes Counts, junior, offensive guard; Kieth Mullins, junior, running back; Mike Morrow, junior, and Alva West, junior, at the defensive down linemen position; Julio Carrillo, senior, defensive end; Bob McArthur, senior, linebacker position; and Gary Don Harkey, senior, defensive secondary.

Baird and Hamlin took the lion's share of the first team spots. Baird had 7 players named to the first team while Hamlin landed 5 first team players on the squad.

Baird captured most of slots on the first and second team all-district teams with a total of 10 players named. Rotan, Jim Ned and Hamlin tied for second with each school getting 8 players named.

Five of the eight players named to the first and second team squads will return in 1980. Juniors Byron Weathersbee, David Thornton, Willie Hayes, and Alva West, together with sophomore Kip Pease will be back

next year. Seniors Mark Nowlin, Eli Sepeda and Mark Cade finished out their high school football career with this year's 8A district winning team. Honorable mention players returning next year include juniors Kieth Mullins, Mike Morrow, Alva West and Wes Counts.

HOME ECONOMICS

Court House Roby

This year's bumper pecan crop will allow the wise shopper to hedge on future availability and prices by refrigerating nuts this winter for future use.

With proper refrigeration, pecans can be stored a long time without becoming discolored, rancid or stale.

Pecans can be stored as shelled kernels or in-the-shell in several locations, including kitchen cabinets at room temperature, refrigerators or freezers. Each has a different storage life.

Shelled kernels may be stored in the cabinet (70 deg. F) for 3 months, refrigerator (50 deg. F.) 6 months, freezer (0 deg. F.) 2 years. In-the-shell nuts may be stored 4 months in the cabinet, 9-18 months in the refrigerator (50 deg. F) or 2 years plus in the freezer (0 deg. F.).

Storage areas should be clean, dry and free of odors, have some air circulation and be out of contact with ammonia gas. Unshelled nuts will store for about twice as long as shelled nuts. Although shelled pecans weigh less and take less space than unshelled nuts, they absorb moisture and flavors readily, become "dirty" and stale easier, and consequently require good packaging and more careful handling. Pecan kernels will lose quality in storage; therefore, the lower the storage temperature, the longer their quality is retained.

Pecan growers normally air-dry nuts in-the-shell after harvesting. However, pecans harvested in early November or during wet weather should be air-dried in a well-ventilated area before storage. This will help prevent mold on the shell surface as well as inside kernels while in storage.

Texas pecans give a fancy touch to ever sort of holiday taste treat. This year, say "Make mine Texas pecans" since the Lone Star State produced its largest crop ever.

Then fancy up the holiday season with these

quick-'n-easy ideas:

Serve sour cream with pecans on meat or baked potatoes.

For waffles, biscuits or muffins, stir pecans into blended dry ingredients before adding the liquid.

Add pecans to meat, poultry or seafood salads.

Try slivered or sliced pecans in tossed vegetable salads.

Roll ice cream balls in chopped pecans. Freeze balls separately until set.

Use toasted, chopped pecans as a quick topping for cream pie or ice cream pie.

Sprinkle cupcakes with pecans before baking, and skip the frosting if you like.

For a spread on crackers or celery, add finely chopped pecans to cream cheese that has been blended with a little milk.

Perk up your vegetable souffle by adding finely chopped pecans along with the vegetables.

Rotan Catholic Church Will Celebrate 50 Years Of Service With Special Mass

On December 8, 1979, St. Joseph's Catholic Church of Rotan will celebrate fifty years of worship and service with a Mass offered by Bishop Joseph Fiorenza, newly ordained Bishop of San Angelo, with the pastor, Father John Hoorman, celebrating Mass with him. This Mass will begin at 6:00 p.m. with the

public invited. After the Mass of worship and celebration, the Bishop and the pastor will join the people of the congregation at a shared dinner in the Rotan Community Center when active members will be specially honored. The celebration will continue after the Bishop has returned to San Angelo that night.

Catholic priests came occasionally to Rotan as early as 1909, to visit the Catholic families "in the shadow of Double Mountain" and offer Mass for them in homes of the faithful. Some of these priests came from as far as Dallas. Later priests came from Abilene, Sweetwater and Hermleigh. In 1929, a small frame structure was

built "on the flats" over close to the home of

Modesto and Demetra Yanez, which served as the house of worship until 1942, when the present structure was built, under the pastorate of Father John Borkowski. Father Borkowski died while building the rectory, and is buried in Rotan cemetery. The present pastor, Father John Hoorman, arrived on July 30, 1971. Almost immediately the

people urged that the church be remodeled, which was done during the following winter with the men of the parish working under the direction of Antonio Yanez. In the fall and winter of 1978-79, the men of the parish added five new classrooms onto the parish hall under the direction of Jessie Montez, for the religious instruction of the young people.
