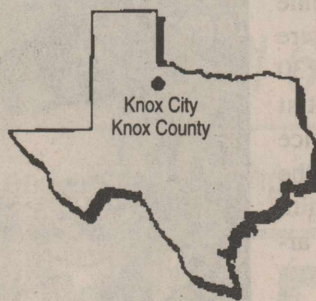

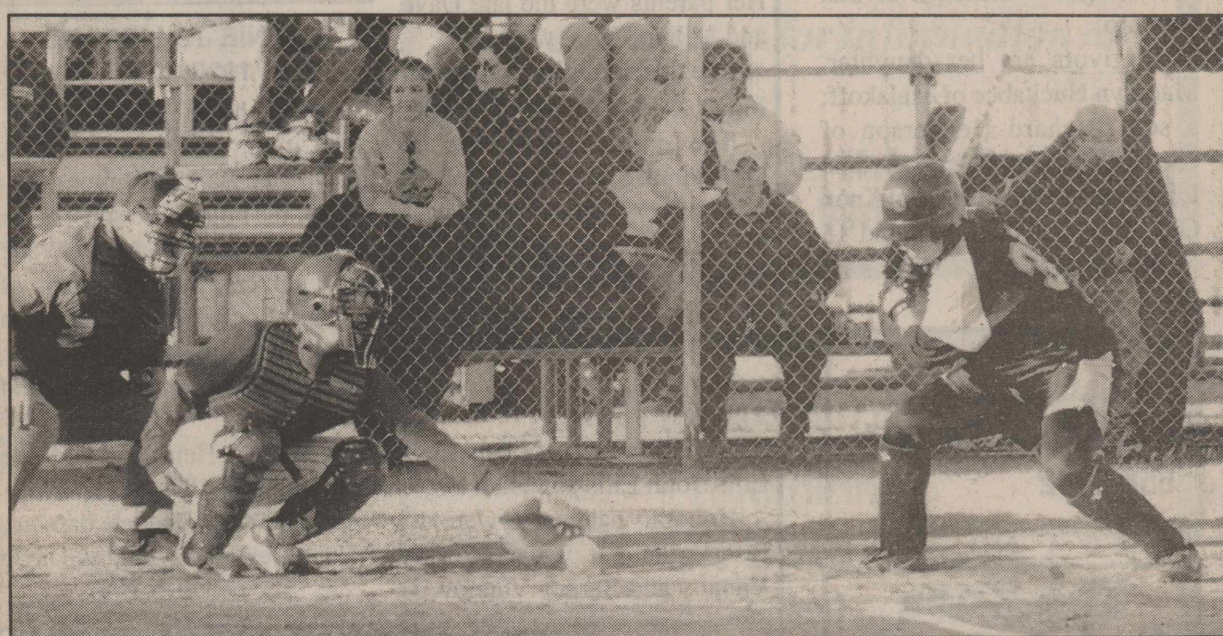

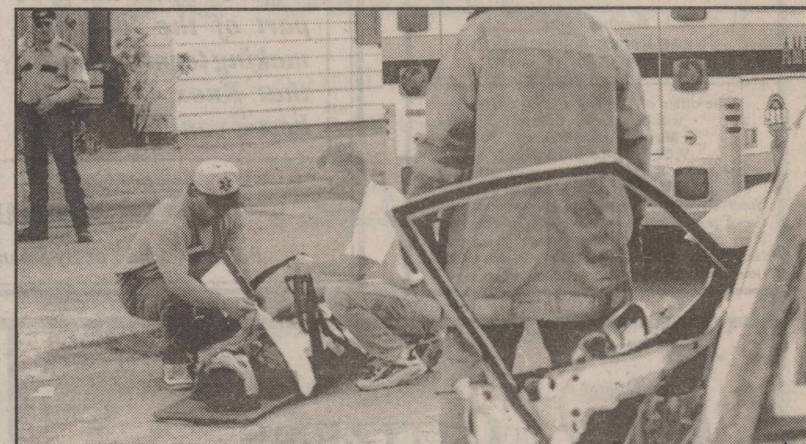

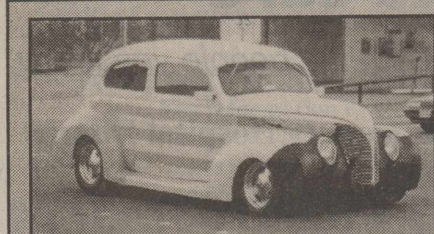
TxDOT safety awards are presented

Former resident Ken Frizzell dies Monday in Santa Barbara, California

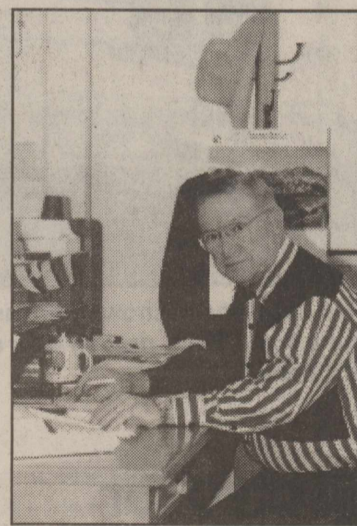
