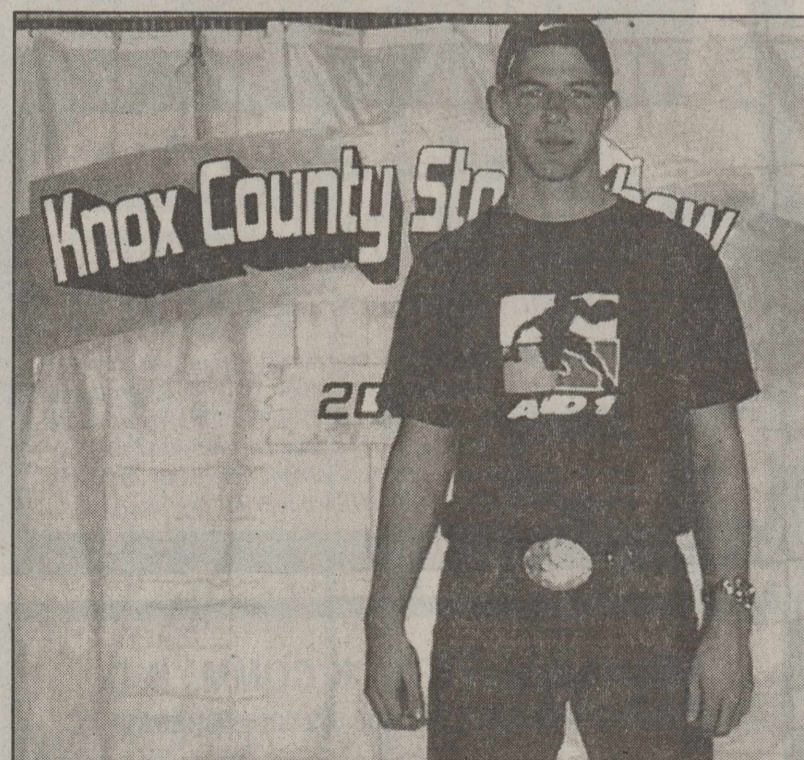

Texas Midwest Day planned in Austin Feb. 21

Texas Midwest Community Network announces plans for Texas Midwest Day in Austin on February 21, 2001.

A full day of activities will give community leaders from the region an opportunity for recognition with state legislators and state agencies as they exemplify the importance of communities working together to accomplish what one community can not do alone.

"Generally speaking, rural communities are at a disadvantage when it comes to influencing state lawmakers. By joining together," says TMCN Executive Director Nicki Harle, "a larger group of rural delegates get more attention and presents a stronger voice in Austin."

TMCN encourages citizens throughout the region to take part in a special day of recognition, which includes resolutions in the Senate and House of Representatives, a photo session with legislators from the region, tour of the Governors' Mansion and a Tailgate reception for Legislators to climax the day.

Several communities in the region are planning day-trips by charter bus. Others are forming caravans to drive to Austin and back the same day. The more citizens attending from the region, the better the message will be heard for rural Texas. TMCN identifies five important reasons to make the decision to participate:

- strengthen participation from our region in the legislative process
 - honor the eleven Legislators from this region
 - bring attention to issues of concern in the region
 - inform elected officials about the many positive attributes of the Texas Midwest
 - demonstrate a strong voice for rural Texas

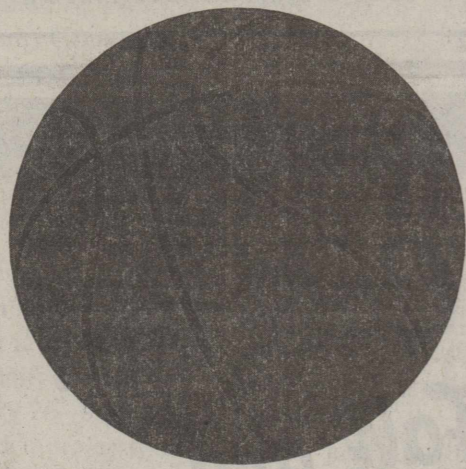
