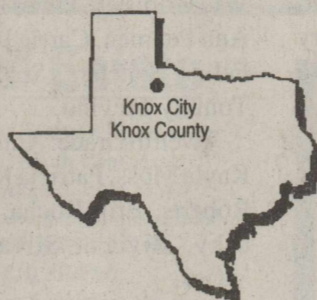

Heart business drive collects \$1905 for 2001

June Tankersley, chairman, reports \$1905.00 was collected in the 2001 American Heart Association business drive.

Heart disease is the national's No. 1 cause of death. Learn the warning signs: (1) uncomfortable pressure, fullness, squeezing or pain in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or goes away and comes back, (2) pain that spreads to the shoulders, neck or arms, (3) chest discomfort with light headedness, fainting, sweating, nausea or shortness of breath.

Stroke is the third largest cause of death in America today.

Warning signs include: (1) sudden numbness or weakness of face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body, (2) sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding, (3) trouble seeing one or both eyes, (4) sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination, (5) sudden severe headache with no known cause. Get emergency help fast if any of these warning signs of heart attack or stroke occur.

Haskell-Knox Underground Water District in process of registering existing wells

The Haskell-Knox Underground Water Conservation District is in the process of registering the existing wells in Haskell, Knox and Baylor counties.

Chapter 36 of the Texas Water Code provides that the District shall locate and register all wells in the District.

Existing wells are exempt from spacing requirements under a "grandfather" clause.

The best way to make sure that a well falls under this classification is to register it.

Registration forms will be available at the district office at 135 North Munday Avenue in Munday, at the county extension offices in Haskell, Knox and Baylor counties and at the county tax appraisal district offices of Haskell, Knox and Baylor counties.

Wells located in the city limits can be described adequately by using the street address on the form. Wells located outside city limits can be located by using the legal description on a tax form. Where a farm is in one block, FSA farm numbers can be used for location.

Where there are several wells on a farm, the registration form has a grid where all the wells can be located. The wells will be precisely located by latitude and longitude with Global Positioning Systems (GPS) operated by the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation.

Immunization clinic to visit here March 1

The Texas Department of Health will conduct an Immunization Clinic in Knox City at the Community Center / Housing Authority on Thursday, March 1, from 10:00 - 11:30 a.m. and 1:00 - 3:30 p.m.

Immunizations offered include DTaP, Hib, Polio, Measles, Mumps and Rubella and Hepatitis B for infants as well as all school immunizations.

The Td immunization is available for all adults not having one in 10 years.

The Hepatitis series was required for Kindergarten entry this year and was required for 12 years old on August 1, 2000.

Parents are asked to check their child's immunization record for this series.

The varicella (chickenpox) vaccine is available to anyone age 1 thru adulthood that has not had the chickenpox.

For those children in need of this immunization, parents are asked to call to reserve a dose as only the proper amount will be reserved.

Using the resources of the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation (TBWEF) to locate these wells will be the most cost-effective method for the District.

This will eliminate the overhead of buying equipment and hiring and training personnel for what will be a one-time activity.

It does require that the greater part of the paperwork must be completed before the TBWEF personnel can go into the field. To do the work efficiently, a sector must be designated that has 50-100 wells located near one another for a TBWEF employee to be sent out to map the wells.

It is important that all wells in the District be registered, if the well is producing or not. Even if a well is dry at the present time, with the lowered water table, it is important that the well location be known. Any pathway to the aquifer is a potential source of pollution. Knowing the location of a well can be invaluable in tracing the path and extent of any discovered contaminant in the future.

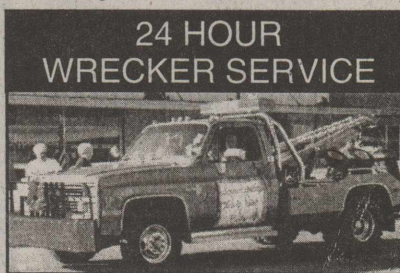

The Texas Department of Health will conduct an Immunization Clinic in Knox City at the Community Center / Housing Authority on Thursday, March 1, from 10:00 - 11:30 a.m. and 1:00 - 3:30 p.m.

Immunizations offered include DTaP, Hib, Polio, Measles, Mumps and Rubella and Hepatitis B for infants as well as all school immunizations.

The Td immunization is available for all adults not having one in 10 years.

The Hepatitis series was required for Kindergarten entry this year and was required for 12 years old on August 1, 2000.

Parents are asked to check their child's immunization record for this series.

The varicella (chickenpox) vaccine is available to anyone age 1 thru adulthood that has not had the chickenpox.

For those children in need of this immunization, parents are asked to call to reserve a dose as only the proper amount will be reserved.

Participants are asked to bring immunization records and social security numbers.

A parent, adult family member or legal guardian must accompany a minor.

All services provided by the Texas Department of Health are provided on a sliding fee scale but no one is denied services due to an ability to pay.

Activities of proactive citizens for the benefit of everyone

Spring cleaning time has begun for many of us around town and the employees of the city are no different. The street sweeper is continuing to run and has almost completed the north end of town on its preliminary cleaning. The maintenance employees are putting forth a consistent effort in continuing to pick up the brush that we have accumulated from our winter storms along with the trimmings that individuals have not been able to haul to the convenience center themselves. Our hope is that once we have completed the trimming and pick up of the remaining streets that a consistent schedule of brush pickups can be established that will be of benefit to everyone.

Work and negotiations on the cemetery fence project continues at what sometimes feels like a snail's pace, but progress is coming about. Once all of the right-of-way and easement issues are resolved with the Texas Department of Transportation and the utility companies involved we will be letting out bids for the concrete work that the new fence will be built on. There are a number of other improvements that we hope to accomplish in the cemetery, but the city needs your help. Anyone who has the ability to volunteer regular time to work with us in organizing and maintaining the records of the cemetery is urged

to contact us at City Hall for the details of what is needed as far as time and skills to manage the overall operation of the cemetery organization.

Our hope is to establish a cemetery foundation that would be able to manage the operations of this important resource to our community. This may be fairly extensive in the beginning, but once all of the records and mapping are done, the operation should be very manageable.

The various entities within the City are also looking into obtaining some patching and paving equipment that will enable us to begin the much needed repairs and rehabilitation of our residential streets. Up to this point we have not had adequate resources to accomplish this, but everyone involved with this is very interested in finding the best possible way for us to be able to manage this nearly overwhelming obstacle to our reviving all of our streets to a condition that we can again be proud for the visitors to our town to see.

A proposal presented to the City Council on the use of the vacant lots across from City Hall has been accepted. Kim Clonts and Jane Penman presented the winning proposal to convert the lots into a natural garden type of park which included the possibility of

utilizing the old train depot as a centerpiece of the design. Along with the relocation of the depot is the proposal to convert it into a public library. Their four phase plan of operation will enable us to utilize the brick from the demolition of the old buildings for walkways, patios, and a combination bandstand/gazebo for public use. The efforts of these two women on our behalf should begin to show as the surveying and initial construction should begin later this spring.

Finally, we would like to encourage anyone interested in serving your community to look at the possibility of running for a position on the City Council. This year we are all faced with the responsibility of selecting three people to serve as trustees of the city as council members. The positions open are mayor and two council member positions. Up to this point we feel that we are moving in the right direction for our little community, but your active participation is needed to help keep things happening. If you feel that you can be a benefit to our community in one of these positions please come by City Hall and pick up the necessary forms to be completed that will enable you to be one of the leaders in our constant efforts to maintain and improve Knox City for everyone.

We would like to thank everyone for the prayers, flowers, hugs, visits, food, phone calls, cards and everything else that was done for us.

UWCD legislative update

The Haskell-Knox Under-ground Water Conservation District is in the process of attempting to obtain passage of legislation to change the Board of Directors of the District to include directors from Haskell, Knox and Baylor counties. This legislation would also change the name of the district to the Rolling Plains Groundwater Conservation District.

These changes are embodied in two identical bills filed in the Texas Legislature as House Bill 1232 filed by Rep. David Counts and Senate Bill 611 filed by Sen. Tom Haywood. These bills were referred to the Natural Resource Committees of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

On February 20, 2001, Senate Bill 611, sponsored by Senator Tom Haywood, was passed out of the Senate natural Resources Committee and sent to the floor of the full Senate.

On February 21, 2001, House Bill 1232, sponsored by Representative David Counts, was passed out of the House Natural Resources Committee and sent to the floor of the full House of Representatives.
