CHILDRESS - Everything is. bigger in Texas, and community cleanups are no exception as more than 100,000 volunteers take to the streets on Saturday, April 7, to declare war on trash.

As participants in the 16th annual Don't Mess with Texas Trash-Off, these proud Texans will be going to extreme measures to pick up after those who have dared to trash the Lone Star State.

"We are extremely grateful for the way our Trash-Off volunteers demonstrate their Texas pride, but it's hard work for 100,000 volunteers to pick up after 17 million people," said Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) Travel Division Director Doris Howdeshell.


Mrs. Hall, 84, died Thursday night, March 22, in the Vernon hospital following a lengthy illness.




#### **Benjamin news**


