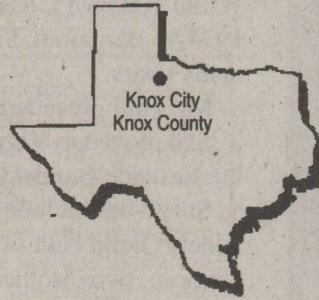


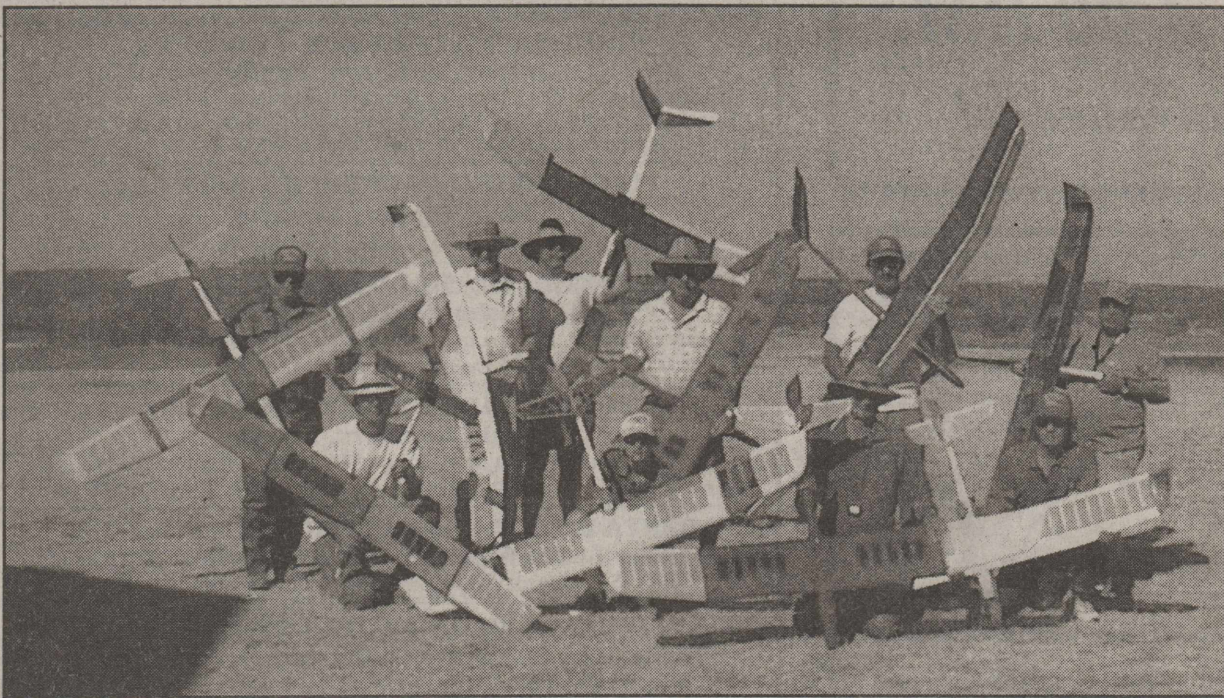

Model Sailplanes will take to the local skies this weekend as members of the Texas Chief's Model Airplane Club participate in an AMA sanctioned event on Saturday and Sunday, March 31-April 1.

## Model sailplane contest set for this weekend

The Texas Chief's Model Airplane Club is hosting an AMA sanctioned event here in Knox City this weekend, March 31 and April 1.

This will be a two day model sailplane contest and will be held at Morris and Rita Houck's driving range one half mile north of Knox City.

The club, made up of local members from Haskell, Rule,

Stamford, and Knox City anticipate drawing additional pilots from as far away as Dallas, Amarillo, and Odessa.

The two meter event will begin at 9:00 am Saturday and Open Class will begin at 9:00am Sunday.

A model sailplane is flown in the exact same manner as a full sized glider that maintains its ability to fly by searching for rising

air. The public is invited to come and observe as the contestants compete for the best timed duration flights. There will be a wide variety of makes and models to see.

There will be exhibition flights made with a cross-country model with a wing span of over fifteen feet in length. Quite an impressive model airplane to see perform.

## City, school and hospital elections are uncontested

## 'Don't Mess with Texas' trashoff is set for next Saturday, April 7

CHILDRESS - Everything is bigger in Texas, and community cleanups are no exception as more than 100,000 volunteers take to the streets on Saturday, April 7, to declare war on trash.

As participants in the 16th annual Don't Mess with Texas Trash-Off, these proud Texans will be going to extreme measures to pick up after those who have dared to trash the Lone Star State.

"We are extremely grateful for the way our Trash-Off volunteers demonstrate their Texas pride, but it's hard work for 100,000 volunteers to pick up after 17 million people," said Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) Travel Division Director Doris Howdeshell.

"Other Texans talk about their state pride, and I challenge them to put that pride into action year-round by keeping our highways litter-free," she continued.

In Knox County, there are two

Adopt-a-Highway groups who keep eight miles of road clean during the year.

The groups participating in the Trash-Off on April 7 are Knox City Lions Club and Knox City Chamber of Commerce.

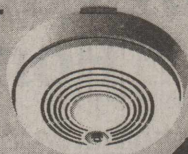
"Currently Adopt-a-Highway volunteers clean only 10 percent of the state's roadways, and state tax dollars must be used to keep the remaining stretches clean," said Barbara Seal, Childress TxDOT Adopt-a-Highway Coordinator. "Adopting a highway not only helps keep our state beautiful, it also allows tax dollars to be used for road improvements and beautification instead of trash pickup."

Don't Mess with Texas Trash-Off volunteers will pick up an estimated 2 million tons of litter in time for the spring wildflower season.

This massive statewide cleanup is organized by TxDOT.

**Hip Implant?**

Sulzer Orthopedics has recalled its Inter-Op acetabular shell for hip implants manufactured in the United States.
