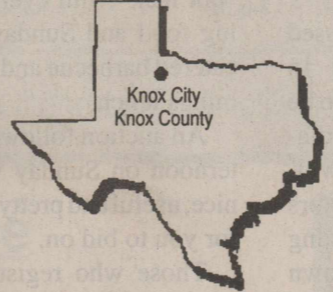

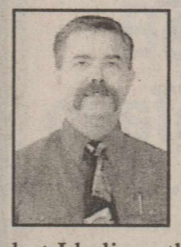
Athletic physicals to be July 25 & 26, two-a-days begin August 6

Work across town has been hectic over the past few weeks, but I believe that you are able to see the results with each passing day. Currently we are working with the County Precinct personnel to get the ditches throughout the town cleaned to allow for drainage when it rains (being the optimists that we are, this will be important within the next few weeks) and this cleaning will also allow us to utilize the new patching machine to widen the roads to allow for a safer flow of traffic in our community.

We realize that this project will cause some inconvenience to each of you as you negotiate our residential streets, but if we are able to maintain a reasonable schedule and show the progress that is desired, our hope is that you will discover much safer streets in our town.

The Street Sweeper has been repaired and is now being put into service behind the gutter cleaning effort. With this, we will be able to do a better job of cleaning up as we clean these ditches. If we are successful in this it should serve to keep the dust down and keep everyone from having to do quite as much house cleaning and dusting. Your patience with us in our effort will be greatly appreciated. As time permits we continue to

work on tree trimming in the park. A great deal of time has gone into this project and our hope is that you will all be able to benefit from this work whether you go during the week or if you only take advantage of the park during the

to do our part to make Knox City a more attractive place.

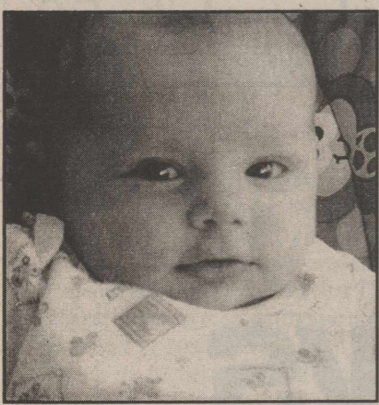
With the delivery of the patching / paving machine, plans are being formulated to put this piece of equipment to work at every available opportunity.

Once we get far enough ahead with our gutter and ditch work, maintenance personnel will begin the tremendous job of rehabilitating the streets across town. Right now we do not have the necessary manpower to keep all of these projects going at the same time, so we are trying to figure out ways to switch from one project to another so that everything is working together.

The construction of the cemetery fence has begun with the building of the brick columns that will serve as the corner posts for the entire fence. The wrought iron style fence is in the process of being delivered and as soon as it arrives we will begin erecting it. This has been a long and tedious project that has required the cooperation of many individuals and agencies for it to become a reality.

I look forward to the day when we will all be able to look at our completed fence with pride. 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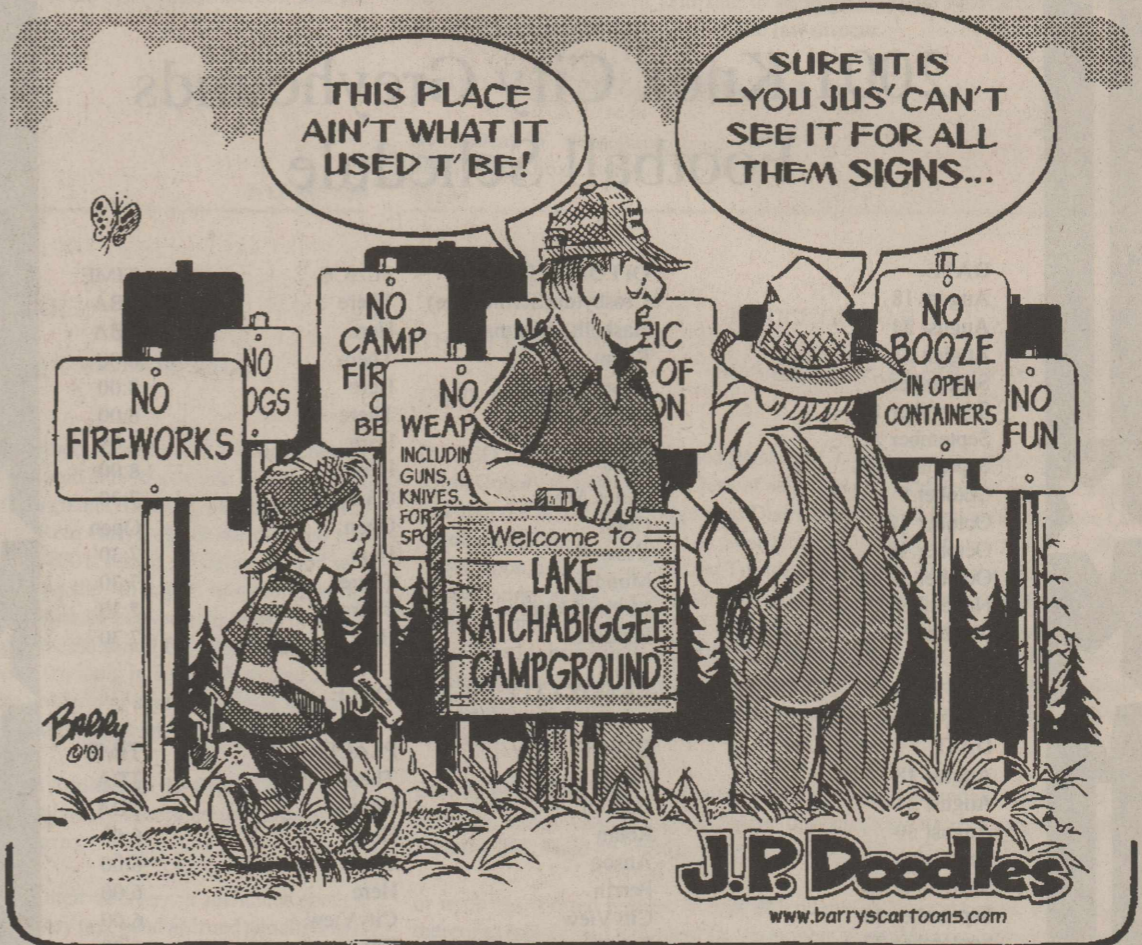

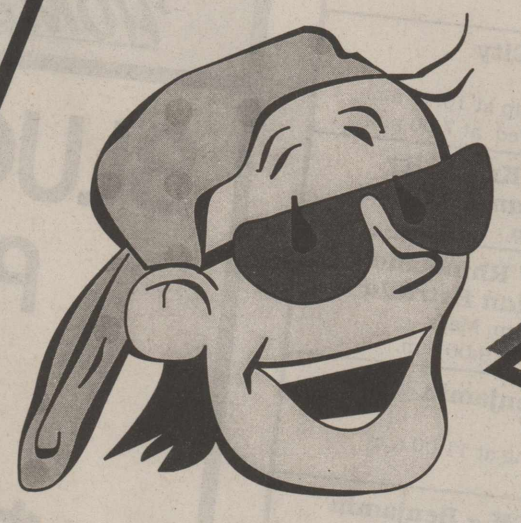
