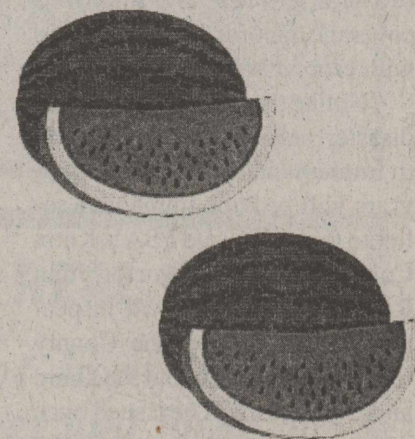
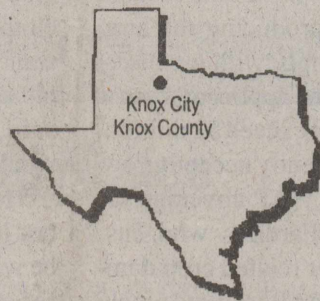

## Knox City's Farm Service Agency announces new crop loss coverage for noninsurable crops

The Noninsured Crop Assistance Program (NAP) administered by the Farm Service Agency (FSA) offers new and improved coverage opportunities beginning with crop year 2001.

"Unlike the old NAP, and other disaster programs that take time to implement, the new NAP program will provide immediate relief to farmers," said FSA's Knox County Executive Director, John Rector. "Appraisers will inspect the damaged crops, the County Committee will review the claim and payments will be issued once the loss threshold is reached." NAP covers 50% of the producer's expected production at a payment rate equal to 55% of the crop's average market price. Benefits are limited to \$100,000 per crop year for each participant.

Since the 1995 crop year, FSA has offered NAP assistance for noninsurable crops each time a widespread catastrophic loss occurred due to damaging weather. Beginning with crop year 2001, availability of NAP benefits will

be based on producers' individual crop losses, rather than on losses occurring in a large area. These guaranteed benefits, subject to a minimal administrative fee, will provide risk protection during the time when crops are most vulnerable and will be individualized based on the farmer's ability to produce the crop.

NAP covers all noninsurable, commercially grown crops produced for food and fiber, including honey, forage and grazing crops, turfgrass sod, Christmas trees, seed crops and aquaculture. Crops in Knox County that would be eligible for NAP include haygrazer, guar, watermelons, cantaloupes, pumpkins, pasture, small grain grazing and any other noninsurable crops grown in the county.

To be eligible for assistance, applicants must pay a nonrefundable administrative fee of \$100 per crop, per county. Fees are capped at \$300 per pound not to exceed \$900 for farmers with interests in multiple counties.

Applicants are encouraged to provide prior years' production data to FSA to establish a documented yield history for loss calculations and payments. To be eligible for NAP, a farmer must have risk in producing the crop and must comply with a conservation plan. The applicant's gross income cannot exceed \$2 million.

FSA is currently accepting applications for NAP coverage for 2001 crops. Farmers who sustained weather related crop damage to a 2001 NAP crop and timely reported acreage and losses may be eligible for coverage. The application period for 2001 crops will end 30 days after the Federal Regulations are published.

## Texas Department of Transportation schedules hearing for grants on transportation services

The Texas Department of Transportation is inviting representatives of local agencies and communities interested in public transportation to help plan transportation services for elderly persons and persons with disabilities. The program, known as Section 5310, provides funds to private, nonprofit organizations, public entities, and associations for transportation.

The program provides up to 80 percent of the cost for capital equipment such as buses, vans, and other paratransit vehicles used to transport elderly and/or dis-

abled persons. Also included are the purchases of vehicles for service expansions, radio and communication equipment, wheel chair lifts and restraints, vehicle rehabilitation, and purchase of transportation services.

The Federal Government, under the Federal Transit Act, appropriates the funding.

Interested private or non-profit organizations, public entities, and local citizens within the Childress District, that are located in Briscoe, Childress, Collingsworth, Cottle, Dickens, Donley, Foard, Hall, Hardeman, King, Knox, Motley,

and Wheeler counties are invited to attend a planning meeting to discuss the most cost effective use of these funds.

This meeting will be held at the Texas Department of Transportation District Office in Childress, Texas on Tuesday, July 17, 2001 at 1:30 p.m.

The District office is located on US Highway 287 West at the Lewis H. White Interchange.

members in the district one-act play contest.

He was an Honorary FFA member, initiated National Honor Society, had 100% passing rate on TAAS grades 3-6, 96% passing rate in TAAS grades 7, 8, 10; was TAAS coordinator, textbook coordinator, class sponsor, and student council sponsor.

At Gruver, he had 49 regional qualifiers, three state informative finalists and two state persuasive finalists.

As one-act play director, his students received ten Best Actor and Actress awards, 55 All-Star Coast awards, and 32 honorable mention all-star cast awards. His one-act plays won district and area in 1983 and 1984, was district winner in 1987, 1988; was regional qualifiers in 1983, 1984; and zone in 1985, 1989, 1991, 2001.

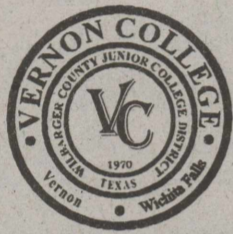

## State Comptroller Rylander announces third annual tax break for purchasing children's school clothes

(AUSTIN)—Just in time for back-to-school shopping, many clothes and shoes can be purchased tax-free August 3-5, during Texas' third annual Sales Tax Holiday, Texas Comptroller Carole Keeton Rylander announced.

"On the first Friday, Saturday and Sunday of August, no state or local sales tax will be charged on most clothing and footwear priced under \$100," Comptroller Rylander said. "The Sales Tax Holiday provides much-needed tax relief for hard-working Texas families and lets them stretch their budgets a little farther as they shop for school clothes for the kids and work clothes for mom and dad."

This year, the Sales Tax Holiday is expected to save Texans \$31.2 million in state sales tax and \$8.4 million in local sales taxes.

Cities have the option to not waive local sales tax during the tax holiday, but no community has opted out of the event this year.

The rules for the 2001 Sales Tax Holiday are the same as in previous years. They include:

- Most children's and adults' clothing and footwear priced under \$100 are exempt from sales taxes. Customers may purchase as many tax-exempt items as they wish.

- Clothing and footwear used primarily for athletics or protective wear, such as golf cleats or football pads are not tax exempt. However, tennis shoes, baseball caps, jogging suits and other athletic clothes that are commonly worn on the street are eligible for the tax exemption.

- Accessories, jewelry, watches, handbags, wallets and briefcases are not tax exempt.

- Items previously placed on layaway may be redeemed tax-free during the Sales Tax Holiday, and items placed on layaway during the Sales Tax Holiday may be redeemed tax-free later.

- School supplies and backpacks are not tax exempt.

"Earlier this year, I asked the

Legislature to expand the list of tax-exempt items to include backpacks, school supplies, sewing supplies and safety gear such as bicycle helmets and car safety seats," Comptroller Rylander said. "I also proposed expanding the tax holiday to five days to avoid the three-day traffic jam."

"However, the Legislature did not make the Sales Tax Holiday a priority, and the proposal died. Next session, I will again urge the Legislature to make Texas families and the Sales Tax Holiday expansion a top priority," Comptroller Rylander said.

During the first two Sales Tax Holidays in 1999 and 2000, Texans saved an estimated \$69.6 million, including \$54.8 million in state sales tax and \$14.8 million in local sales taxes.

## State legislature increases protection of seniors

Thanks to new state laws passed by the last session of the state legislature, people who give family members and other caregivers Power Of Attorney will have more protection if those whom they've trusted try to pull a fast one.

HB 1883 makes the person with Power of Attorney accountable for the assets entrusted to them and requires that they keep accurate records as well. "This will make it much harder for unscrupulous relatives to sell things out from under an elderly person," says Bill Cummings, the Silver-Haired Legislator who initially proposed the bill.

A second measure, HB 1813 makes misuse of Power Of Attor-

ney a crime.

In related legislation, HB 3335 requires that people who come to suspect abuse, neglect and exploitation through their employment report such suspicions. Before this bill was passed, those who worked at, say, a bank, might fear legal reprisal for violating the privacy of someone whom they suspect. The new law absolves them of this threat and in fact requires that they voice their suspicions.

Taken together, the new bills offer seniors and others significantly more protection than they had going into the 77th legislative session.

"These were necessary measures," Cummings said. "I can tell

you story after story about this kind of exploitation." Some of the abuses concerned people he knew personally, he said. His research into Adult Protective Service's statistics showed more than 30,000 confirmed cases of abuse or exploitation a year.

Cummings said he will be working closely with Adult Protective Services to see just what effect these new bills will have.

In all, 22 of the bills promoted by the Silver-Haired Legislature passed including one that regulates deceitful practices by those who offer sweepstakes (HB 2530) and another designed to protect consumers from telemarketers (HB 472).
