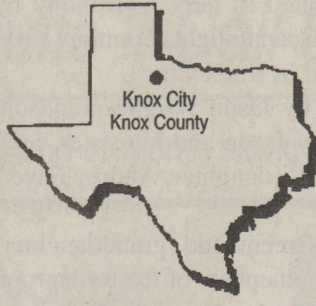

Winter arrives in Knox City with an icy blast



WHEN SNOW AND ICE moved into the area early Tuesday morning, it did not take long for emergency workers to be called out. In the above photo, this one vehicle rollover happened between Knox City and O'Brien on Highway 6. Rochester police and Knox County EMS personnel responded to the accident. In the above photo that happened minutes later, Knox City Police Chief Harry Steen and City Manager Mike Burkham direct traffic on South Central while Clint Lewis from Lewis Paint and Body moves a pickup truck away from the telephone pole it slammed into.

While weather forecasters were saying snow and ice, most of the predictions called for winter moving into the area on Tuesday evening. True to form, Knox County's first blast of winter moved in earlier than expected and provided a surprise to area residents when they woke up early Tuesday morning.

While snow and ice this early in the season usually do not accumulate like in other areas of the country, Tuesday morning's storm provided some very slick conditions for those who had to be out driving. Emergency personnel had responded to a rash of vehicle accidents by mid day, including two separate vehicle rollover accidents. EMS personnel were also involved in transporting patients from the local hospital to larger hospitals in Abilene and Wichita Falls, the trips especially dangerous with the weather conditions.

With the wind at 15-20 miles an hour almost all day on Tuesday, the blowing snow and sleet dropped visibility throughout the day. At one point, drivers west of Knox City reported they could not see the front end of their vehicles. Even as late as mid afternoon, visibility inside the city was limited to a few blocks.

School sports events were called off because of the winter storm. Knox City was scheduled to host Rotan for basketball games Tuesday afternoon, but according to Mrs. Judy Lain at the high school office, sporting events were called off until further notice.

The weather conditions even effected the publication of this issue of *The Knox County News*. Our normal press time is early Wednesday mornings in Vernon, but driving conditions prevented the trip until Thursday.

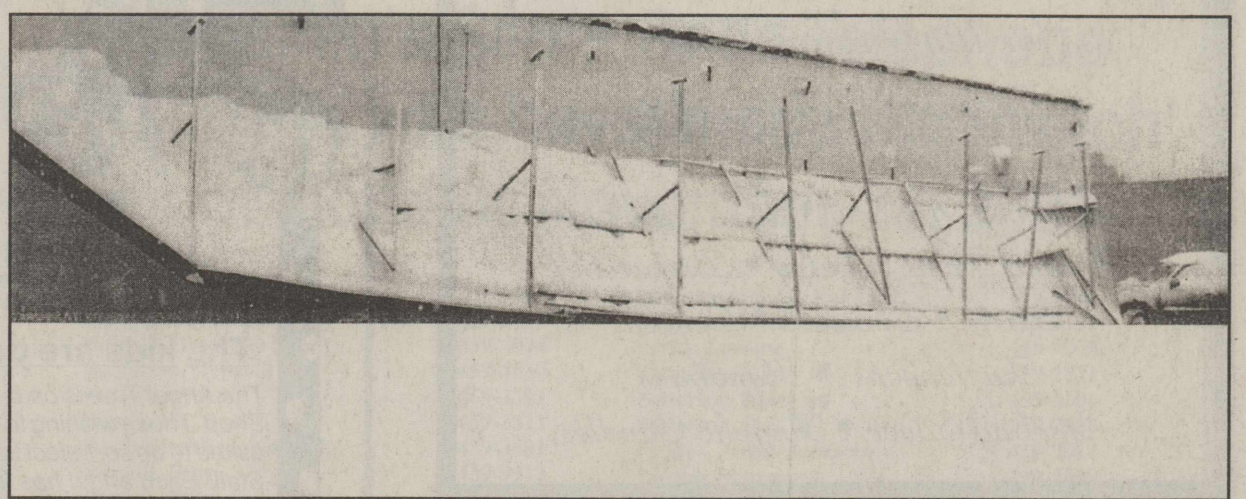
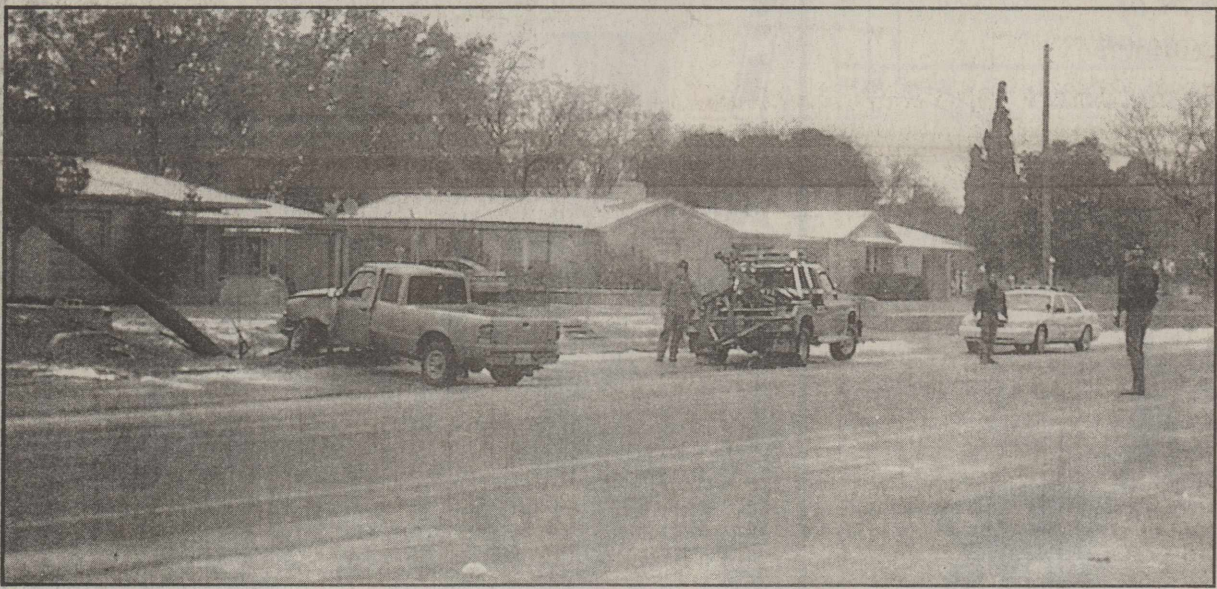
Since it looks like Christmas, it's time to start thinking about the annual Christmas Tree project for the Child Welfare Board

Food pantry gearing up for holidays

The Knox County Food Pantry volunteers are busy gathering for the Christmas Holidays. The Knox City School student body will begin gathering canned goods soon to help with the extra needs at this time of the year.

The Knox City Food Pantry is a non-profit organization that distributes food to families and shut-ins in Knox County. Most of the food comes from the Wichita Falls Area Food Bank, whose motto is "Preventing hunger by preventing waste!" Each month volunteers go to Wichita Falls to pick up surplus food. Sometimes as much as 2000 pounds of food can be purchased for a very minimal amount. Other volunteers work diligently to unload food, stock shelves, and distribute food. The food is distributed once a month. Every third Monday, the shut-ins are served and every third Thursday the public is served.

The food pantry operates on a donation basis only. Every month more people seek help from the pantry. The pantry cannot stay open without the support of everyone in the community. Volunteers and donations are needed each month to keep this ministry going. Volunteers ask that with the Christmas season approaching to remember the food pantry with prayers and donations. These are expenses for electricity and water besides the expense of processing food orders.

The KC Food Pantry acknowledges all donations made to the food pantry this year. Contributions have been made in memory of loved ones as well as generous donations from businesses. Other donors have included the Boy Scouts of America, the Circle Club and Baker Chemical.

Immunization clinic to visit in Munday on December 6

The Texas Department of Health will conduct an Immunization Clinic at the Perry Patton Community Center in Munday, Thursday, December 6, from 10:00 to 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 to 3:00 p.m.

Immunizations offered include DTaP, Hib, Polio, Measles, Mumps and Rubella and Hepatitis B for infants as well as all school immunizations.

The Hepatitis B series was re-

quired for Kindergarten entry this year and was required for 12 years old on August 1, 2000. Parents are asked to check their child's immunization record for this series.

The varicella (chickenpox) vaccine is available to anyone age 1 thru adulthood that has not had the chickenpox. For those children in need of this immunization, parents are asked to call to reserve a dose as only the proper amount will be reserved.

Participants are asked to bring immunization records and social security numbers. A parent, adult family member or legal guardian must accompany a minor.

All services provided by the Texas Department of Health are provided on a sliding fee scale but no one is denied services due to an ability to pay.
