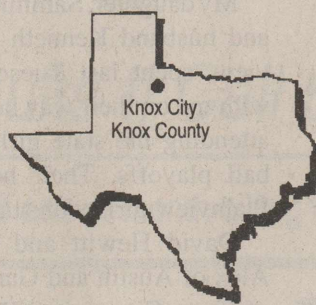

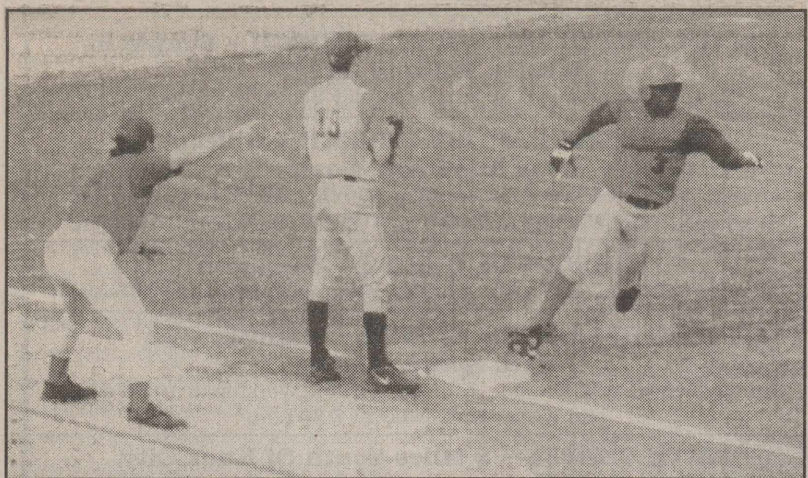

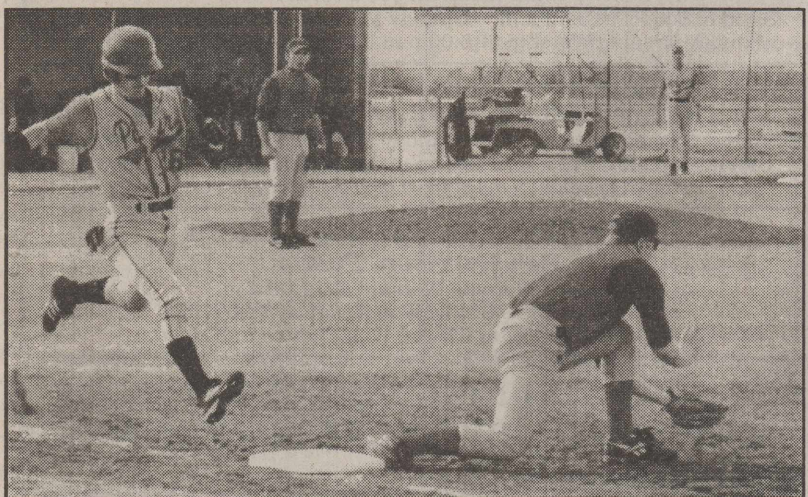

Heart disease is the nation's No. 1 cause of death. The old, the young, men and women, white, black, Asian and Hispanic are all at risk. About half of the deaths from heart disease are from heart attacks, with at least 250,000 people dying before they get to the hospital. But many of those deaths can be prevented - by acting fast!

Half of all people having a heart attack wait more than two hours before getting help. Some people feel it would be embarrassing to have a "false alarm." Others are so afraid of having a heart attack that they tell themselves they aren't having one. These feelings are easy to understand, but they're also very dangerous and could cost you your life.

State officials approve \$108,560 for Knox City pedestrian and bike trail enhancement project

State officials have approved \$108,560 for the Knox City Pedestrian and Bike Trail project.

The project is one of 10 transportation enhancement projects totaling nearly \$12 million selected by the Texas Transportation Commission during its

monthly meeting.

Last month, the Commission approved more than \$143 million for transportation enhancement projects.

The Statewide Transportation Enhancement Program funds non-traditional transportation projects

such as those involving bicycle and pedestrian facilities, landscaping and scenic beautification, historical preservation and environmental mitigation.

Projects are evaluated for quality, transportation value and benefits.

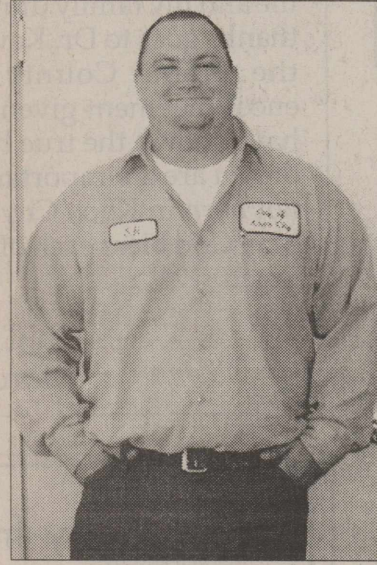
Notes from City Hall

As most of you know, the City of Knox City has undergone several personnel changes in recent months. In addition to changes in personnel, new policy and procedures for our departments daily operation have been adopted as well. Our goal for these new practices is to provide equal and expedient service to all of Knox City's citizens in a productive manner.

When these sort of changes in staff occur, projects implemented by previous administrations are sometimes left unfinished due to lack of communication or information concerning prior commitments to our community and its citizens.

Some of the projects we are currently working on are an affective approach to repair the street and drainage problems, brush and debris removal in public right of ways and infiltration and water loss within our infrastructure.

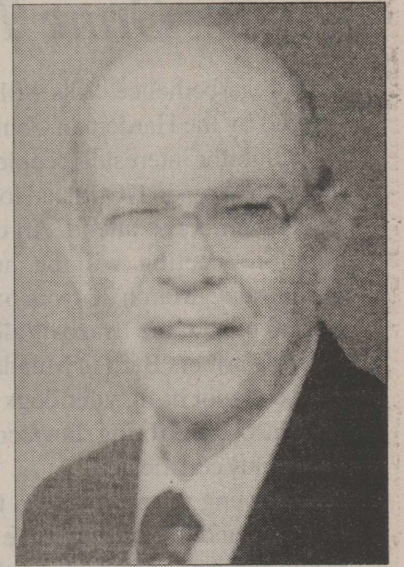
He was a member of the First Baptist Church in Knox City and ran the church's sound and television equipment for many years.

She was a member of the First Baptist Church.

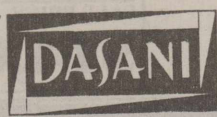
She was preceded in death by her parents, Herman and Della; three brothers, James, Hobert and Clarence, and one sister, Lucille.

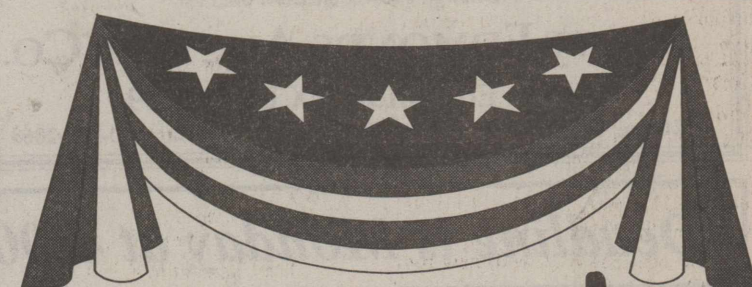

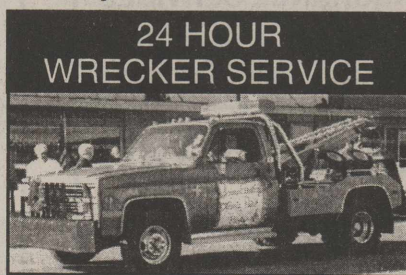
