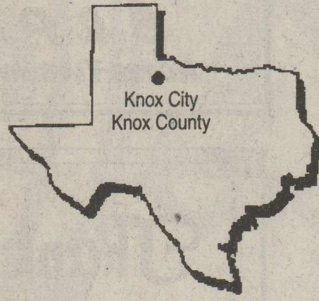

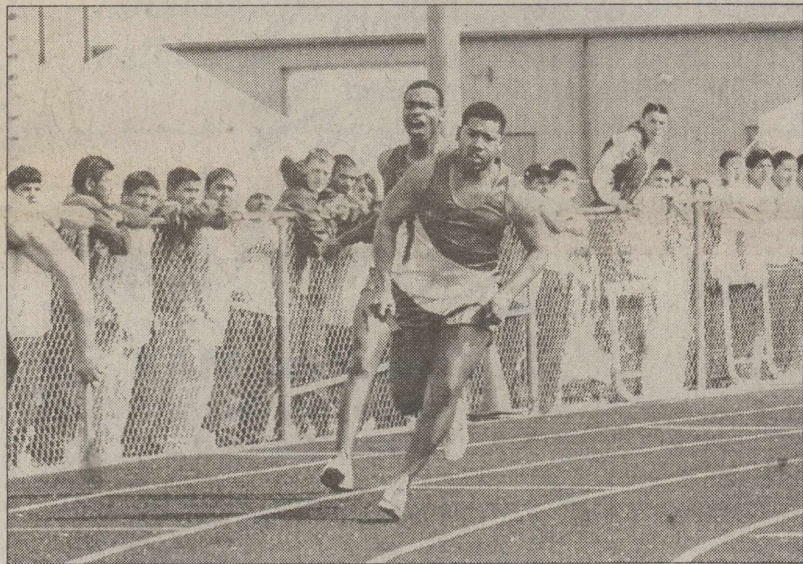

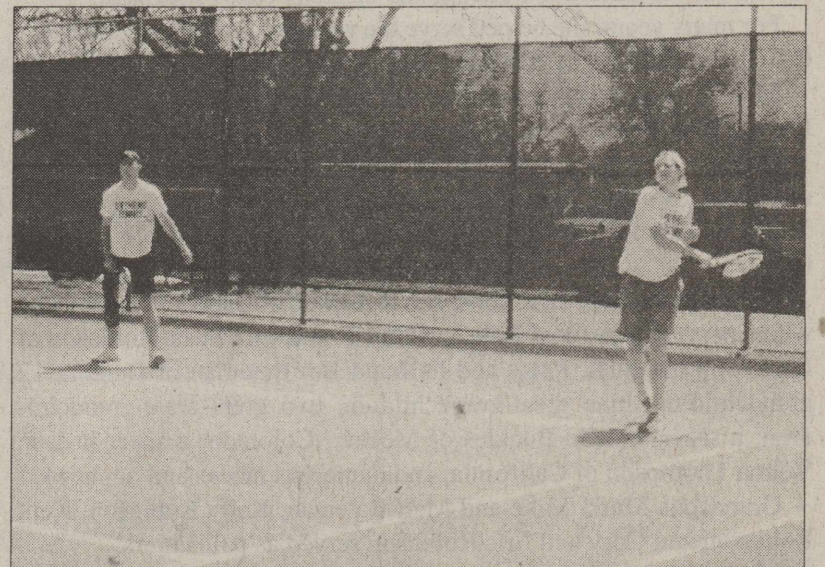

Public meeting to discuss bond election planned for Monday, April 15 at 7:00 p.m.

In W.R. Baker Auditorium, KC School campus

The Knox City-O'Brien CISD will hold a public meeting on Monday, April 15, at 7:00 p.m. in the W.R. Baker Auditorium.

The purpose of this meeting will be to discuss the bond election scheduled for May 4, 2002.

Jeff Robert from First Southwest Company will present information regarding the State Facilities Allotment and how it will impact funding for the Knox City-O'Brien CISD bond issue.

The State Facilities Allotment requires the state to pay approximately 71% of the bond payments if the bond issue passes and the state approves the facilities allotment funding. However, the bonds will not be issued unless the district is approved for the State Fa-

cilities Allotment.

If the voters approve the bond, the District will utilize the funds by improving the heating/air-conditioning system, lighting, and handicap accessibility at the three Knox City-O'Brien CISD campuses. The improvements will provide greater energy efficiencies of the campuses thus reducing the District's energy costs.

Everyone is encouraged to attend the informational meeting regarding the bond election as well as express any concerns they may have.

Anyone unable to attend the meeting but need additional information is encouraged to contact Louis Baty at the school administration office.

Other high schools represented were Petersburg, O'Donnell,



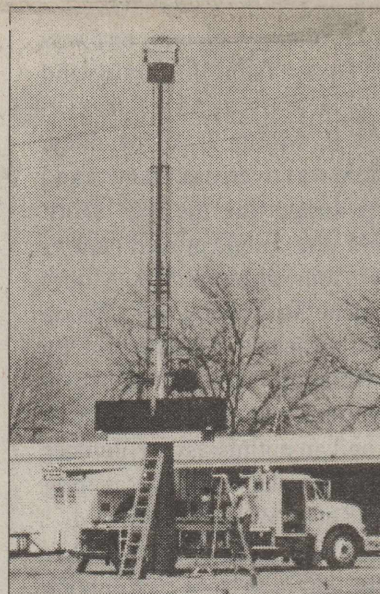

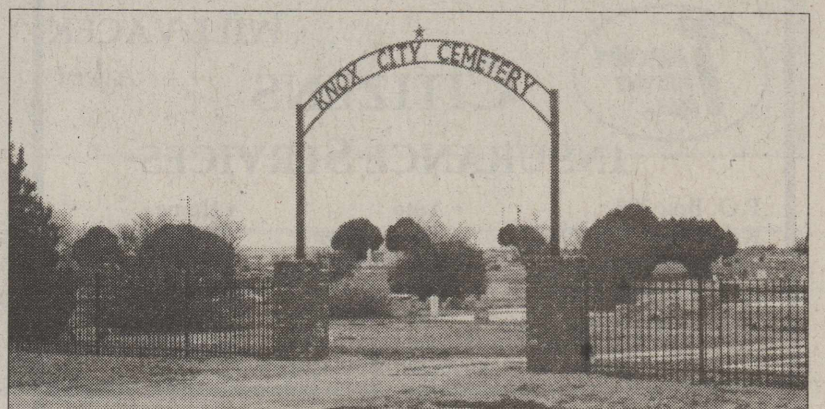
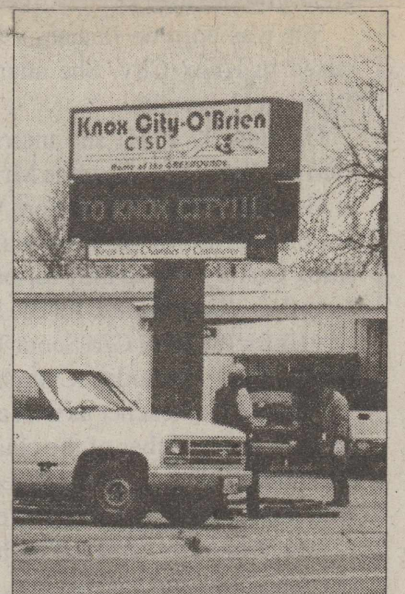
Paducah, Aspermont, Lorenzo, Roby, Roscoe and Rotan.

The two day UIL Regional Golf Tournament will be held in Levelland on April 22nd and 23rd.

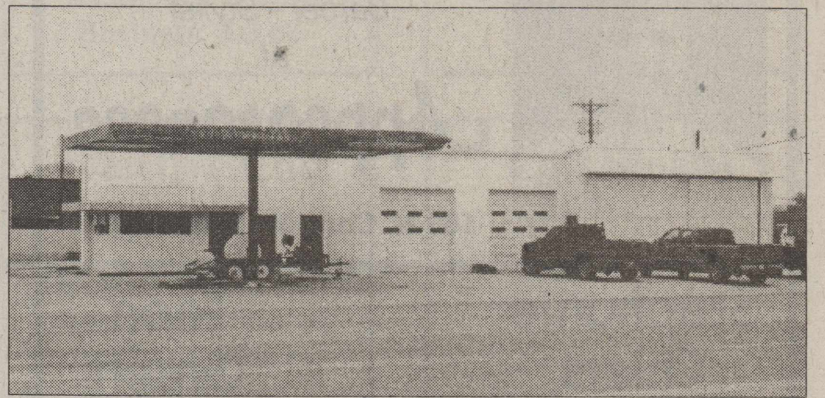
Views from around town

Mrs. Robinson, 91, a lifelong resident of Knox City, died April 7, 2002, in Hendrick Medical Center in Abilene.

Born March 30, 1911, in the League Community, northeast of Knox City, to Henry and Bettie Thompson, she married Guy Robinson in June 1930.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Guy in February 1977; her parents; one son, John (Duck) and daughter-in-law, Betty Robinson; three brothers and five sisters.

Affectionately known throughout the community as Ruby, she was known for the beautiful wedding and birthday cakes she made.

'Eat Well For Less' program to begin April 11 in Knox City

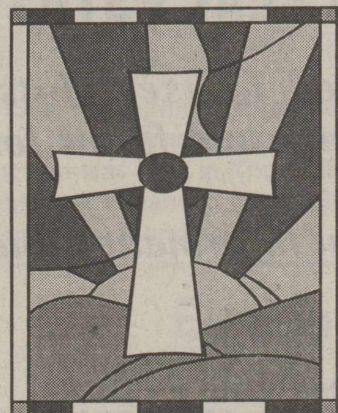

A six-part series, "Eat Well For Less" will begin on Thursday, April 11. This series will be held each Thursday for six weeks from 1:30 to 2:30 p.m. at the Department of Human Services Conference Room at 606 East Main St., Knox City.

This free program series will help participants be healthy, prepare food safely, and save money. The first meeting on April 11 will address "Healthy Eating". Eating using the Food Guide Pyramid will be discussed and participants will begin the process of food budgeting. Other topics to be taught during the series include information on carbohydrates in the diet, food safety, budgeting, menu planning and shopping strategies.

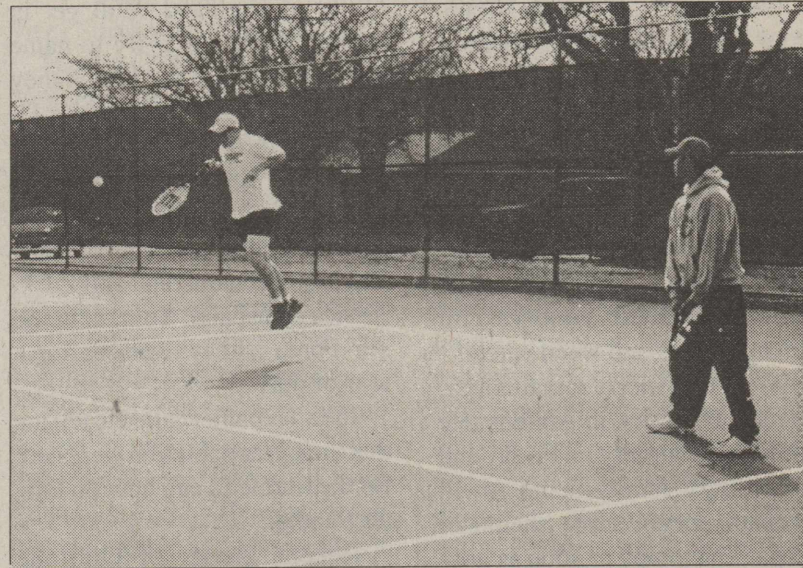
