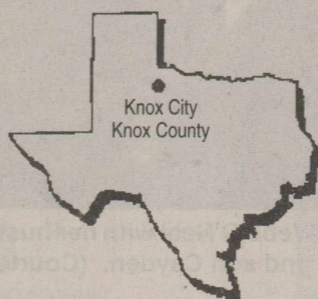

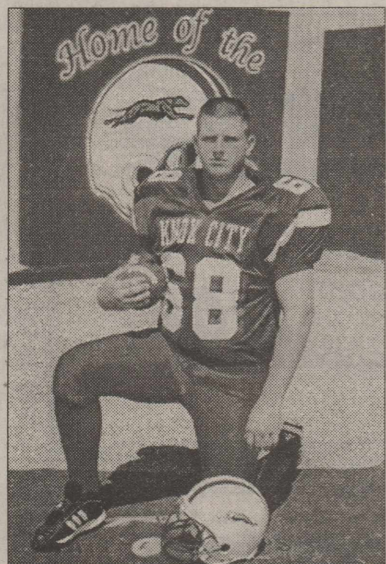

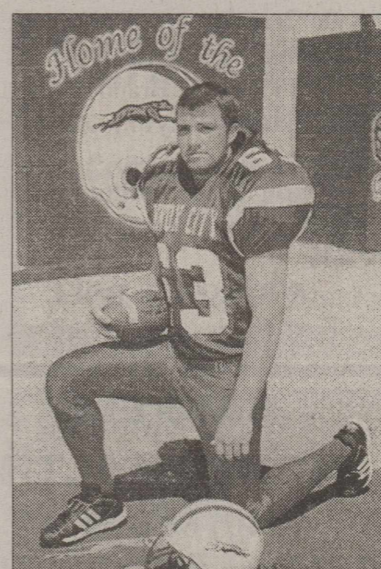
## Grimsley, coaches leave for FCA All-Star Game

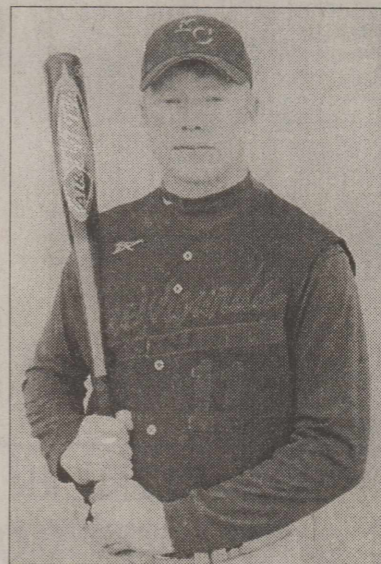
## Shawn Speck receives post season honor

and assists in many other ways. In the fall each year the Hospital holds a banquet honoring these wonderful people.

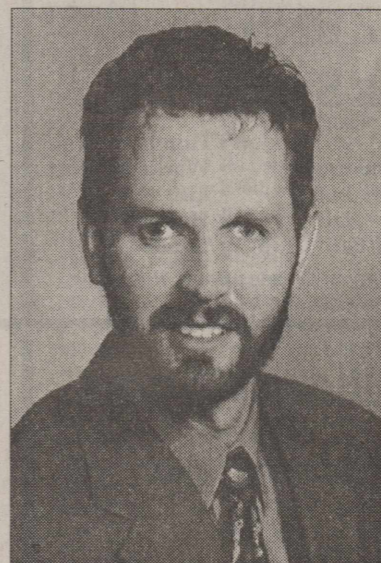
## Former resident and wife are new missionaries

Lance and Sarah Knight Cypert have joined more than 5,100 Southern Baptist International Mission Board workers sharing Christ in 185 countries and among 1,125 ethnic people groups. The Cyperts were among 67 people appointed May 21 by the International Mission Board during a service at its Missionary Learning Center in Rockville, Va. The new missionaries will fill diverse job assignments that range from starting churches to using sports, education and music as tools of ministry.

In 2001, International Mission Board missionaries and their overseas partners baptized 395,773 new believers. They started 5,775 churches and reported more than 5.8 million members in 61,569 churches overseas.

The Cyperts will minister among the 200,000 Criollo people of Argentina. He will lead a team in starting a church-planting movement; she will conduct outreach through church and home.

Since 1999, Cypert has served as pastor of First Baptist Church in Quitaque, Texas, where the family lives. He previously served as

youth minister of First Baptist Church in West Memphis, Ark.

Cypert was born in Knox City, Texas, to Lyndol and Jere Cypert, now of McKinney, Texas. He received the bachelor of biblical studies degree from Hardin Simmons University in Abilene, Texas, and a master's degree from Mid-America Baptist Theological Seminary in Memphis, Tenn.

Sarah Cypert was born in San Antonio, Texas, to Carroll and Alice Knight, now of Austin,

Texas.

Cypert's call to international missions came while he attended an associational men's supper. Mission-focused classes at Mid-America seminary further convinced him that he and his family would eventually serve God overseas. "I have constantly been alert to what God is doing in overseas work, and my heart is thrilled," he said.

ing a burden on her heart for missions during her husband's years at seminary. But she pushed the thoughts aside and refused to consider missionary service. Several years passed before she once again felt God urging her to commit to missions. This time, she and her husband both accepted God's will for them to serve overseas. "My calling is to serve the Lord in any capacity in which He would have me serve," she said, "and to follow Him in complete obedience."

The Cyperts have two children: Katelyn Tess, born in 1990; and Jesslyn Briona, born in 1992. The family will return to the Missionary Learning Center for orientation in July before going to Argentina.

With nearly 16 million members, the Southern Baptist Convention is the largest evangelical denomination in the United States; its International Mission Board is the largest evangelical missionary-sending agency.

### COLIFORMS

#### What are Coliforms?

Coliform bacteria are used as indicators of microbial contamination of drinking water because they are easily detected and found in the digestive tract of warm blooded animals. While not themselves disease producers, they are often found in association with other microbes that are capable of causing disease. Coliform bacteria are more hardy than many disease-causing organisms; therefore their absence from water is a good indication that the water is bacteriologically safe for human consumption.

Fecal coliform (mostly E-coli), is a portion of the coliform bacteria group originating in the intestinal tract of warm-blooded animals that passes into the environment as feces. Fecal coliform is often used as an indicator of the fecal contamination of domestic water supply.

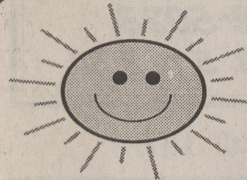

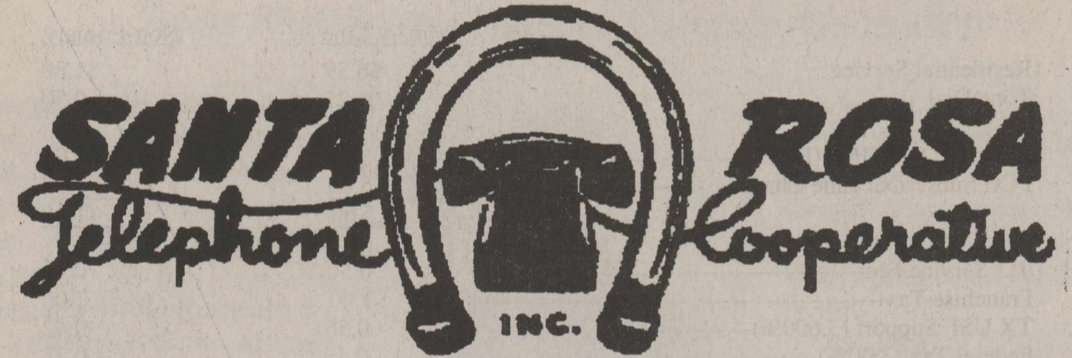

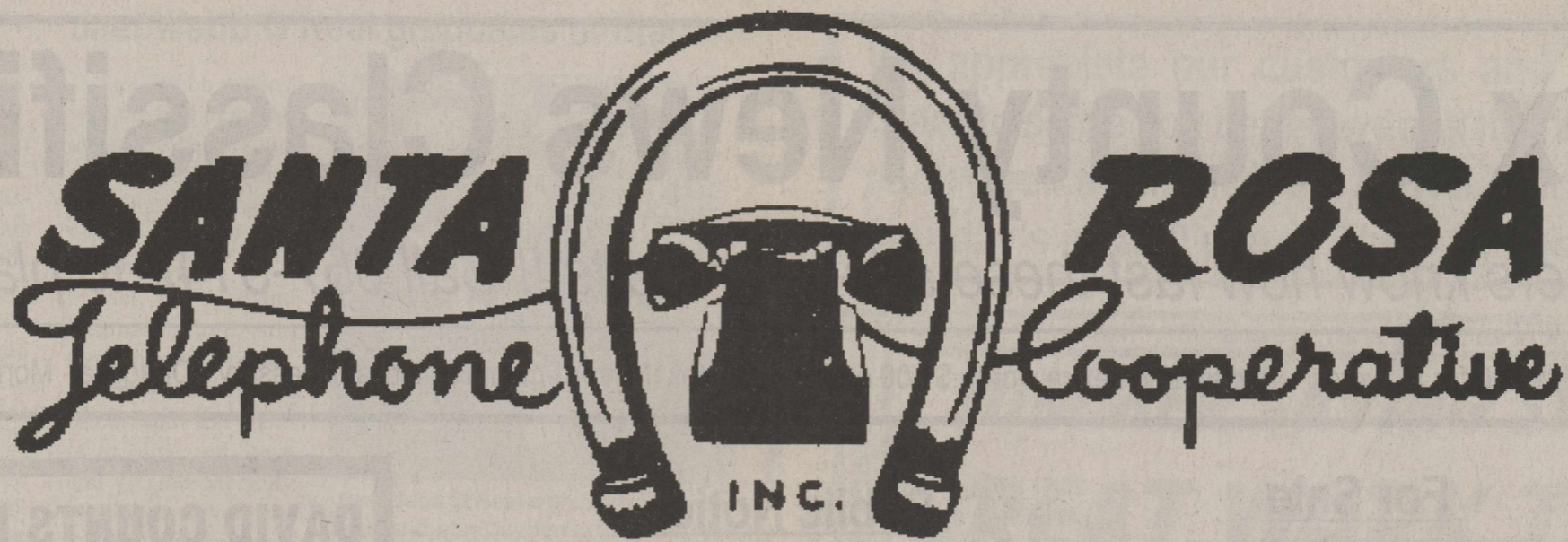
