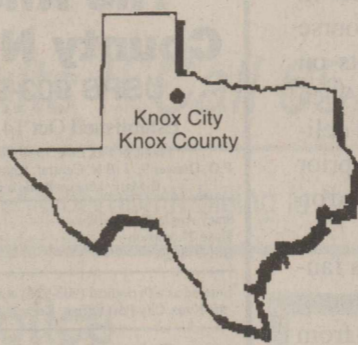

Texas Forest Service urges caution with July 4 fireworks due to extreme fire danger

Vegetation in south and west Texas is extremely dry and fire-prone, but dry vegetation also exists in other areas of the state as well. With summer heat expected to continue to take its toll on vegetation across the state, state fire control leaders urge everyone to take extra precautions when using fireworks to celebrate our nation's birthday next week.

When dry weather coincides with the Fourth of July holiday period, irresponsible fireworks use increases the likelihood of wildfires," says Bobby Young, associate director for forest resource protection with the Texas Forest Service in Lufkin. "The threat of wildfires is highest in the southern half of the state; but even in the rest of the state where danger is generally low to moderate, vegetation will dry rapidly and be-

come increasingly fire-prone if hot, dry conditions persist for any length of time.

Young noted that in some areas of the state, early season rains produced abundant vegetation. If this vegetation dries out, it could fuel intensely burning wildfires that could be very difficult and dangerous for firefighters to control, he said.

The state fire control leader offered several suggestions for safe fireworks use. Adhere to all county and city fireworks laws. Use fireworks outdoors, in a safe area away from dry grass and buildings. Follow directions carefully - with close adult supervision. Keep a bucket of water, wet towels and a garden hose handy. Never shoot fireworks from metal or glass containers and never experiment with homemade or al-

tered fireworks. Other fireworks safety tips can be found at the following Internet website: www.texasfireworksafety.com.

Young also suggested additional outdoor fire safety tips including: comply with any outdoor burning bans, establish firebreaks around burn barrels and around brush piles to be burned, and avoid burning on dry, windy days. Avoid using welding and other spark-producing equipment around dry grass. Keep vehicles out of tall, dry grass that might contact hot exhaust systems. Dispose of smoking materials properly.

The Texas Forest Service asks that everyone help make the upcoming Independence Day holiday and the rest of the summer safer and more enjoyable by practicing good outdoor fire safety.

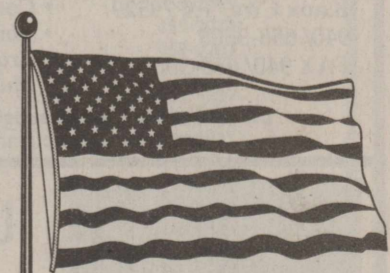

Cowboys and cowgirls of the past, present and future will fill the authentic rodeo arena for the grand entry introduction to the performances each night at 8 p.m. of the World's Largest Amateur Rodeo. 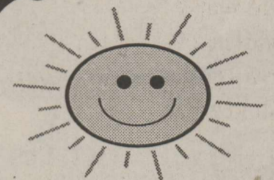

Brazos River Authority advises of potential health risk for lake and river swimmers

The report of three deaths last summer from a rare form of meningitis has prompted the Brazos River Authority to alert those who plan to swim in Texas lakes and rivers to avoid stagnant water.

The infection, **primary amebic meningoencephalitis** or **PAM**, is caused by a common microorganism or ameba found in almost all untreated (non chlorinated) surface water and in soil.

The ameba that causes the infection thrives in fresh water when temperatures are high, usually above 80 degrees. According to officials with the Texas Department of Health (TDH), the combination of lower water levels, high water temperature and stagnant or slow moving water produces higher concentrations of the ameba in the water.

Last summer, PAM infections in Texas involved children from Texas who had been swimming in lakes.

The PAM infection occurs when water containing the organ-

isms is forced into the nasal passages - usually from diving or jumping into water or water skiing. The ameba then make their way into the brain and spinal cord. PAM is not spread person to person.

Symptoms of the infection include severe headache, high fever, stiff neck, nausea, vomiting, seizures and hallucinations as the condition worsens. Though the disease is rare - affecting only about one to three people a year in Texas - for those infected, death usually occurs within a week. Swimming pools that are properly cleaned, maintained and treated with chlorine generally are safe, as is salt water. The TDH recommends that people never swim in stagnant or polluted water and take "No Swimming" signs seriously. Also, people should hold their noses or use a plug when jumping into lakes, rivers, ponds or other bodies of fresh water and avoid swallowing water when swimming.

DTaP, Polio, MMR and Chickenpox vaccines will be provided as well as other immunizations for adults, infants and children.

A parent, adult family member or guardian must accompany a minor. Parents are asked to bring immunization records as well as Social Security card for their child.

Services at the Department of Health are offered on a sliding fee scale, but no one will be denied services.

Grilling outdoors safely

Outdoor grilling is a popular way to prepare food during warmer weather while enjoying the company of family and friends. However, grilling does "open the door" to foodborne illness if proper cleanliness and preparation measures are not followed. Also, excessive smoke and charring may be unhealthy and should be avoided.

To keep your cookout a fond memory rather than a regretful experience, follow these simple steps from Jane Rowan, County Extension Agent for Family & Consumer Sciences with the Texas Cooperative Extension, Knox County:

Food Preparation:

- Select fresh meat, poultry, or seafood that is high quality for best cooking results.

- Keep these perishable products at 40° F or colder until immediately before grilling. Thaw frozen foods in the refrigerator or defrost in microwave and immediately place on grill.

- Marinate foods in the refrigerator and discard leftover marinade.

- Wash your hands before and after working with raw meat, poultry or seafood.

- Wash your work surfaces and cutting boards with hot soapy water before and after preparing

food. To sanitize use 1 tsp bleach per quart of water. If possible, use a separate cutting board for fresh produce and raw meat, poultry, or seafood

When away from home, keep your meat and poultry away from other food in a separate cooler with ice.

- After placing raw meat on the grill, wash utensils and platters with hot, soapy water before using them to serve cooked food.

- Cook foods to an internal temperature that destroys harmful bacteria. Check the temperature by placing a thermometer in the center-most part of the meat, not touching the bone.

Internal temperatures for thorough cooking to prevent foodborne illness are:

- ~ Whole poultry 180° F; poultry breasts 170° F; ground beef patties 160° F;

- ~ Ground poultry 165° F; beef, veal, or lamb steaks, roasts, or chops 145° F;

- ~ All cuts of pork 160° F

- Serve food immediately after grilling or keep at 140° F or above until served.

- Place on a clean platter.
- Refrigerate all leftovers immediately at 40° F or below.

- Discard any food left out longer than 2 hours or 1 hour if temperature is above 90° F.

Grilling Tips:

- ~ To prevent heavy smoking or charring of food and less smoke in your eyes follow these tips:

- ~ Choose low-fat meats or trim excess fat before grilling.

- ~ Precook meat in the microwave or by boiling to release juices that may cause flare-ups. Do not interrupt cooking. Immediately transfer precooked food to the grill to finish cooking and provide "cookout" flavor.

- ~ Avoid high-fat marinades or basting sauces.

- ~ Cover grill with aluminum foil. Punch holes between grids to remove juices.

- ~ To decrease heavy smoke from dripping fat, rearrange the food to another place on the grill, rotate the grill, or decrease the heat.

- ~ Cook meat until done but not charred. Remove charred or burned material from the food and discard. **Do not eat charred or burned pieces!**

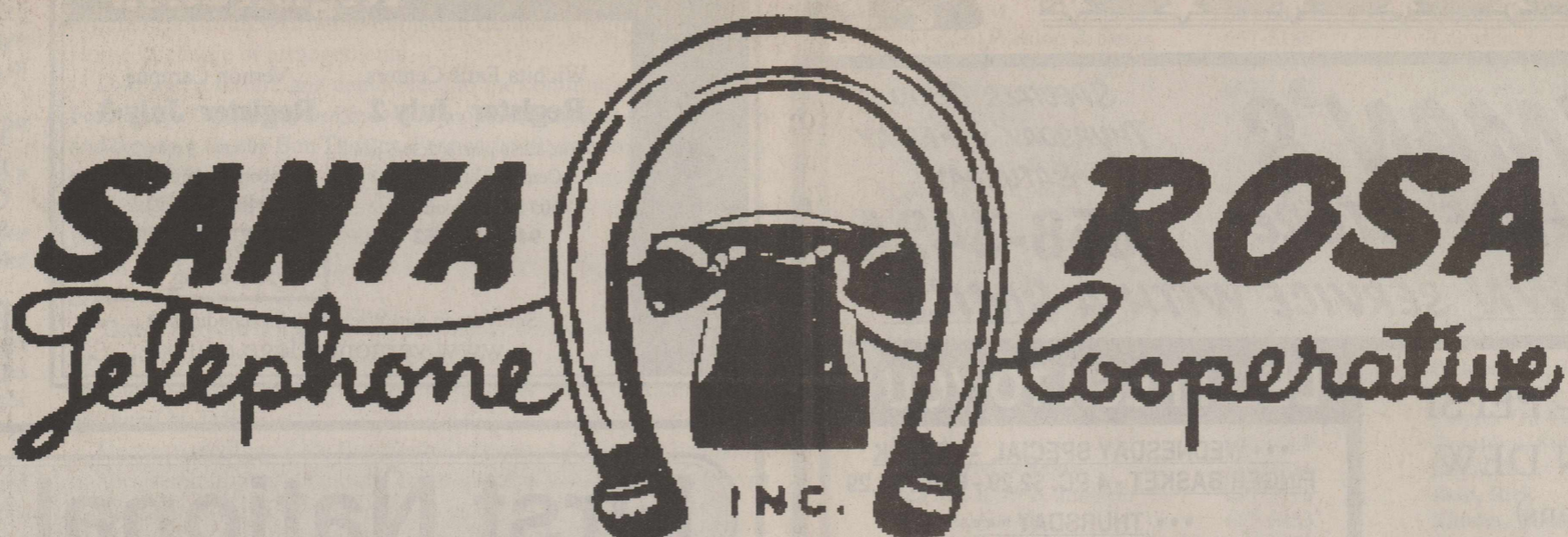

Shari Brown returned home Thursday after two weeks camp at Panfork Baptist Encampment near Wellington.


I was in Goree Wednesday morning for the funeral of Jessie Mae Johnson, the wife of Leon. Jessie Mae died on Monday after a three year illness.

Wilma L. Rutter

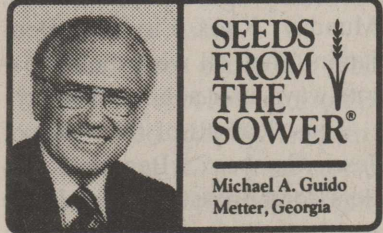
Wilma L. Rutter, 88, went to be with our Lord on Sunday, June 16, 2002.

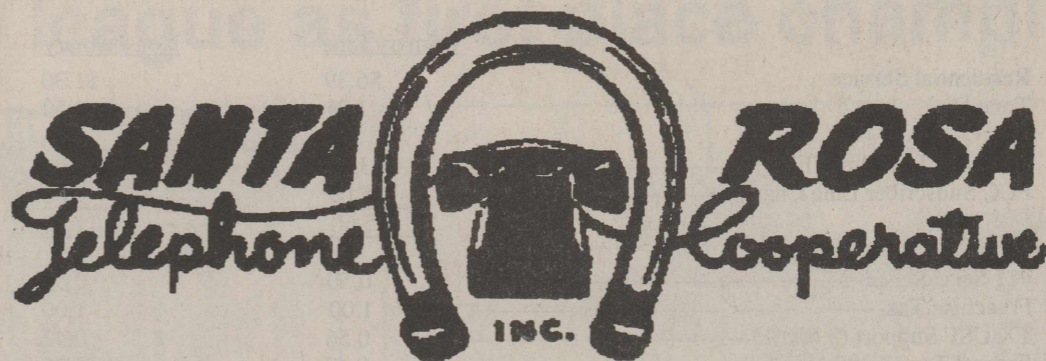

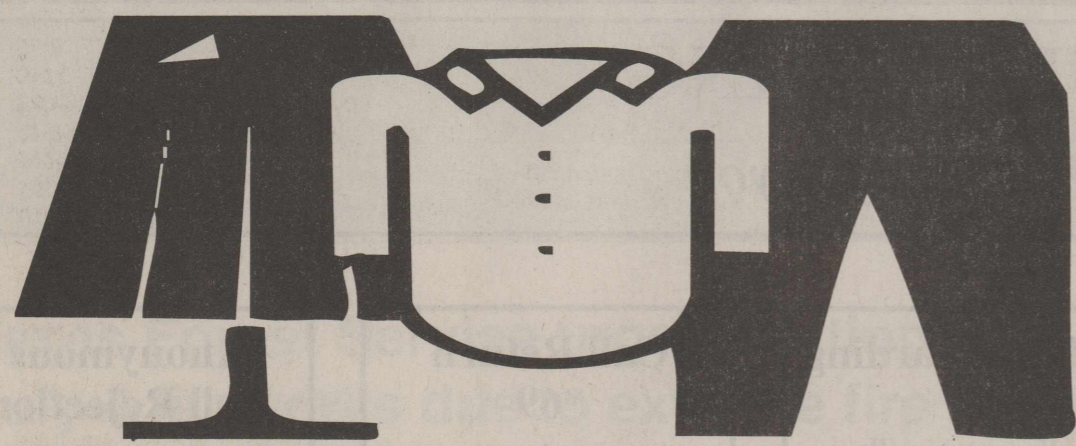

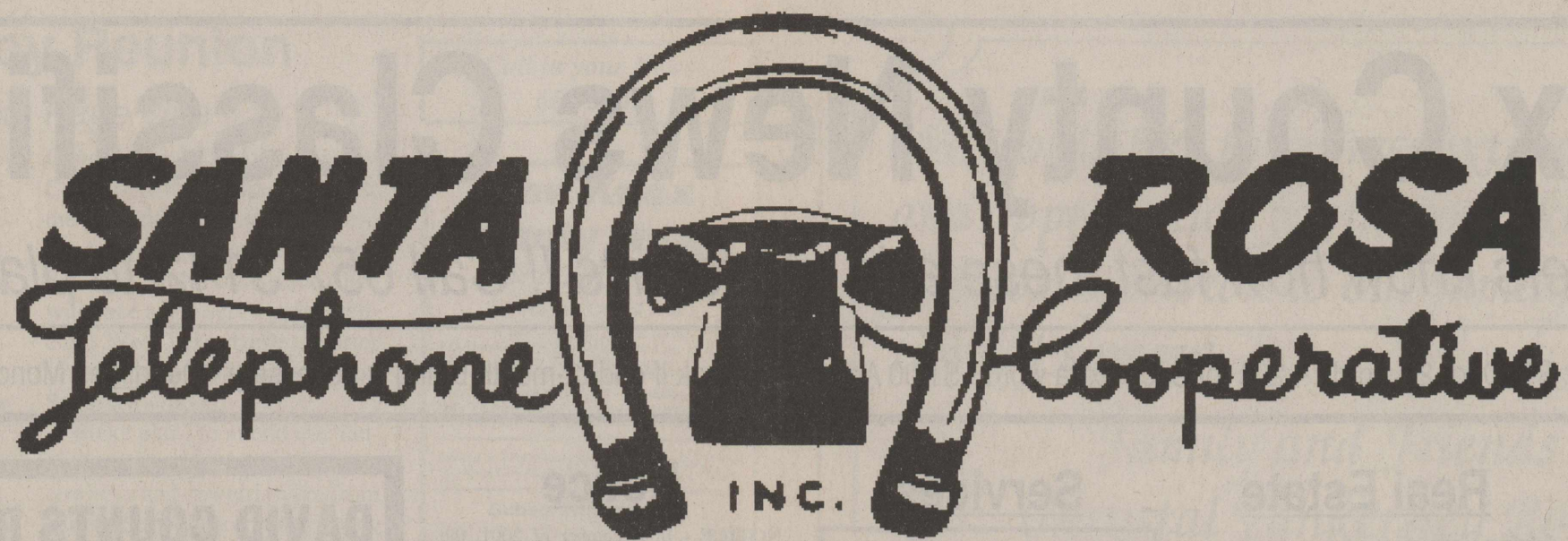
