City public works manager resigns

Scott Perry, the Public Works Manager for the City of Knox City has resigned his position, effective a week ago. While no official reason for Perry's resignation was given, city maintenance matters will continue with the remaining maintenance staff.

In other city related news, the following are minutes from the last regular scheduled meeting of the city council, dated June 13.

The City Council of Knox City met in regular session on June 13, 2002, at 7:02 PM with Mayor Charles Lankford calling the meeting to order.

Mayor Lankford presiding, with council members present: J. M. Emerson, Bud Reynolds, Fred Ledesma, Domingo Garcia, and Leon Watson. Also present: City Secretary Barbara Rector, Public Works Manager-Scott Perry, Utility workers Jerry Low, Jimmy Trevino, Mark McGaughey and Wesley Espinosa, Chief of Police Harry Steen, Public present: Allen Rhodes and Jessie Rios.

J. M. Emerson gave invocation. Mayor Lankford welcomed the new members to the Council and stated everyone looked forward to working with them. He asked if there were anything that they would like to ask at this time before the meeting started. Mr. Reynolds asked why was there all of the reports in the packets and did they really need them. Mayor Lankford stated that everything in the packet was asked for by the previous Council. They felt the reports were all necessary to handle business for every aspect. of the City, and with them everything can be kept up with on the day to day operations, giving the Council good information each

Mr. Allen Rhodes was present for Public Comments; he addressed the Council on the West Nile virus alert from the USDA for horse owners concerning the mosquito season. He asked the Council why the mosquito sprayer is not running in town. Mayor Lankford told Mr. Rhodes that the sprayer is being worked on right now and will be running soon.

The minutes of May 9, 2002 was discussed in length on the part of changing the police department policy manual under the General Procedures section page three, 2: 12. J. M. Emerson made the motion to accept the minutes as written from the previous meeting, Leon Watson seconded the motion. Vote was two yes being J. M. Emerson and Leon Watson, three no being Bud Reynolds, Fred Ledesma and Domingo Garcia. The three no votes informed the Council that the only part of the minutes they voted no on was the police department policy manual section. Therefore, the minutes of May 9, 2002 have not been ap-



BFI will be on the agenda for next Council meeting, giving time to research contract on the price increase.

Next on the agenda was to deliberate and act on a City Administrator. Mr. Reynolds informed the Council that he asked this to be on the agenda. He stated that he felt the City needed an administrator, as stated in the by-laws the chain of compound is Mayor, Administrator, City Secretary. He wants the City to start actively seeking someone for the position but not be in a great hurry. Therefore, finding the right person to fill the position. Mr. Emerson gave concern over how the City could afford a City Administrator. Mr. Reynolds made the motion to place ads in the area newspapers; Mr. Garcia seconded the motion. All voted aye.

Next item on the agenda was General information was next Howco Inc. and Tx Comm. Development Program to discuss the called public meeting on June 5, 2002. Information on selecting projects to be funded from grant funds and projects that are listed in priority needs. Giving councilmen not in attendance the opportunity to fill out the assessment

Deliberate and act on the need of a cemetery association was next. Mr. Emerson told the Council he feels that the City needs to form an association, so that the City employees and Council are not responsible for all the problems with the cemetery. Lengthy discussion on the good and bad. Motion made by Mr. Emerson to place an ad in the local newspaper asking the Community to help organize an association to take over the upkeep, records and funding of the cemetery. Seconded by Mr. Ledesma. All voted yes.


Next was to deliberate and act on a new section of curbing at the cemetery. This was tabled until the next Council meeting.

Deliberate and act on the repair of torn out curbing at the cemetery was next. Mr. Watson and Mayor Lankford will report

back to the Council next month. Street paving was next on the agenda. Discussion on the needed repair on several streets in town and that the condition of some streets was beyond repair, they would need to be torn completely out and paved again. The City's patching machine was discussed and Scott was asked to call Seymour and Olney about their machines, as they are very happy with the performance of the machine.





AUSTIN-Texas Land Commissioner David Dewhurst today announced the Texas residency requirement for participation in Texas Veterans Land Board (VLB) loan programs has been reduced to one year.

"I'm pleased we've continued to make veterans programs better," said Dewhurst, "and we'll continue looking for better ways to serve Texas veterans as long as I'm in office."

Dewhurst, who chairs the VLB, said he was pleased that eligible veterans will be able to participate in VLB loan programs within a year of moving to Texas, as opposed to the previous two-year residency requirement.

"What a great way to welcome veterans to Texas," Dewhurst said. "U.S. veterans, regardless of where they come from, have served all Americans and should be treated with honor and respect."

Dewhurst said the VLB already had a one-year residency requirement for admission to Texas State

Veterans Homes, and lowering the residency requirement for VLB loan participation provides more consistency among the various programs.

"If a veteran has lived here a year, then he or she is a Texan as far as most state laws are concerned," Dewhurst said. "Once we were sure a shorter residency requirement wouldn't adversely affect our programs, I saw no reason to make a newcomer wait two years to participate in VLB home and land loan programs. The more participation we have from our veterans, the stronger these programs become."

Dewhurst said additional information on VLB loans for homes, land and home improvements, as well as Texas State Veterans Homes for veterans and their spouses who need long-term, skilled nursing home care, is available on the VLB Web site at www.glo.state.tx.us/vlb, or by calling the toll free number at (800) 252-VETS.2002


