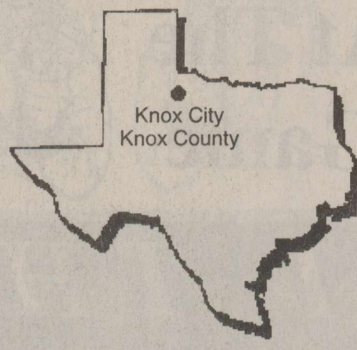

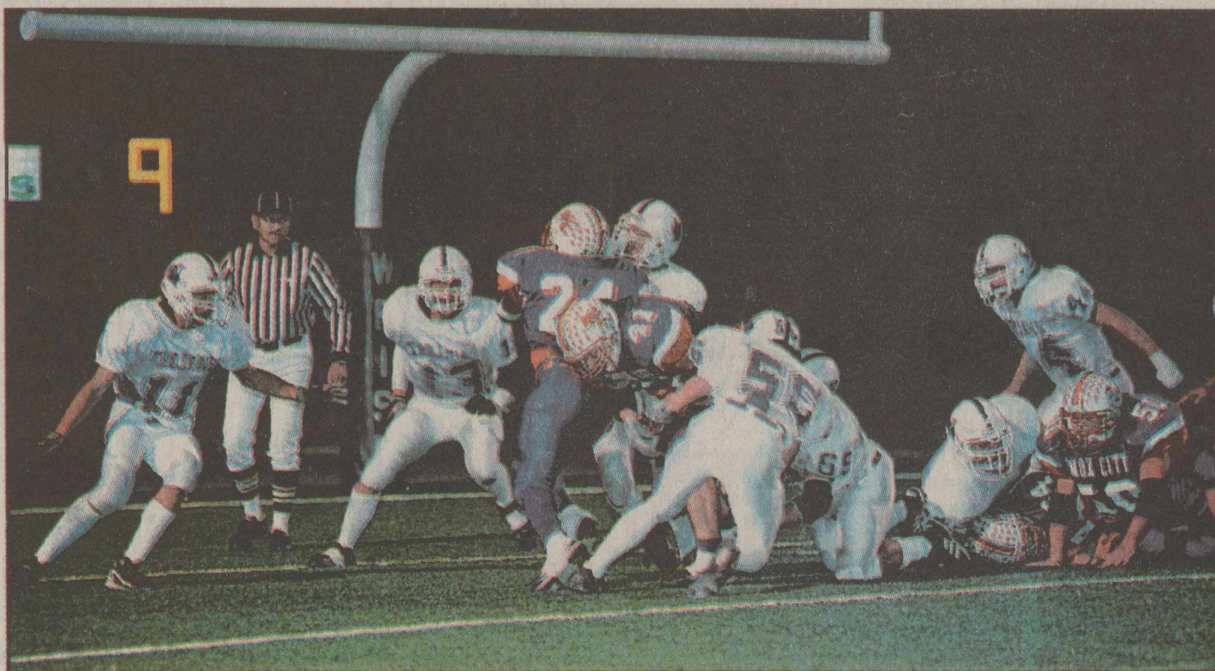

### Quentin Spells breaks the game open

FRESHMAN RUNNING BACK QUENTIN SPELLS electrified the fans last Friday night at Memorial Stadium in Wichita Falls when he broke open for long yardage late in the fourth quarter to set up the game winning touchdown. Quentin only carried the ball two times in the game, but picked up 44 yards. Quentin (22) is shown here running through a huge hole in the Windthorst defense opened up by Ricky Dale Smith (76), Caleb Carver (64), Drew Barnard (73) and C.J. Bruce (50). Windthorst Trojan defenders identified on the play are Chad Green (5), Jay Meurer (65), Trent Berend (55), and Amador Buenrostro (69).



### Scooter Thompson scores winning TD

SENIOR FULLBACK SCOOTER THOMPSON (41) is shown here just a second before he turned to the right and took the ball across the goal line to score the winning touchdown in the Area Championship game last Friday night at Memorial Stadium in Wichita Falls. Making a great block for Scooter is Riley Spells (24), other Greyhound defenders shown to the right are Senior Caleb Carver (64) and Sophomore C.J. Bruce (50). Tied through the first three quarters, both Knox City and Windthorst scored in the fourth quarter to tie the game at 7-7. ### KCHS Greyhounds advance to regional game with Roby after Friday's 14-7 battle with Windthorst at Wichita Falls

With their backs to the wall, the Knox City Greyhounds dug their heels in and played their best defensive game of the year as they held the powerful Windthorst Trojans to a 0-0 ball game through three full quarters last Friday night at Memorial Stadium in Wichita Falls. As both teams fought hard for the Area Championship title and the right to advance to the regional round of the Class A playoffs, Knox City's Hounds proved their determination right to the very end of the game when they pulled ahead with just seconds left.

Even though Knox City only had 3 first downs in the first three quarters of play, the offense seemed to come alive late in the third quarter after KC Junior Carlos Ruiz intercepted a Windthorst pass from quarterback Chad Green and returned it to the Trojan 36 yard line. Just eight plays later, quarterback Sedrick Roberson finally put the first points of the night on the scoreboard with a 6 yard run. Dominique Collier quickly picked up the seventh point with his point after kick through the uprights.

Windthorst never gave up the fight, coming back midway the fourth

quarter to score when Chad Green ran the ball into the end zone from 10 yards out. Green also kicked in the extra point for the Trojans. That touchdown was set up by a Greyhound fumble that was recovered by linebacker Chad Schreiber. He looked like he might return it all the way, but Greyhound Riley Spells chased him down after a long run that gave Windthorst a first down on Knox City's 39 yard line. The ensuing touchdown came just 9 plays later.

One of the most exciting plays of the night came when Greyhound freshman running back Quentin Spells found a huge hole in the windthorst defense that had been opened up by tremendous blocking from the Greyhound offensive line. Spells sprinted through the opening, then picked up speed and gained 43 yards before three Trojan defenders finally brought him down inside the 5 yard line. Four plays later, Senior Scooter Thompson put Knox City ahead as the 216 pound fullback broke through four tacklers and dove into the end zone with just 13 seconds left in the game. Once again, Dom Collier kicked the extra point to put Knox City ahead 14-7, and that score held after Senior Kendrick Green intercepted a long pass from Windthorst to finally end the game.

The win over Windthorst was both happy and sad for Knox City players and fans. Happy because the win advanced the Greyhounds to the regional round of the playoffs that will be held this Saturday at 7:30 p.m. against the Roby Lions at Shotwell Stadium in Abilene. The sad feeling came after players, coaches and fans learned that two brothers on the Windthorst team lost their grandfather and grandmother in a tragic car crash near Jacksboro as the couple traveled to Wichita Falls for the game. Heartfelt sympathy is extended to Matt and Morgan Schenk and their family from everyone in Knox City.

The Greyhounds will play the Roby Lions at 7:30 Saturday night at Shotwell Stadium in Abilene for the Regional Championship.

**Knox County Hospital District is making privacy a priority in 2003**  
 With mandatory compliance of HIPAA

To the citizens of Knox County, April 15, 2003, will be more than just another tax day. It marks the beginning of mandatory compliance with the privacy provisions of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). Millions of health providers across America will be required by the Department of Health and Human Services to comply with these new provisions which charge the medical industry with accountability for the sanctity of patients' medical information. In anticipation, Knox County Hospital District is participating in a program endorsed by the

Texas Organization of Rural and Community Hospitals to receive the training, policies, procedures and other administrative documents required to safeguard patient privacy. Many of the changes will be transparent, but patients will still notice a number of differences during medical visits. One of the most notable changes will be the Notice of Privacy Practices that Knox County Hospital District will be providing each of its patients. The Notice informs patients of their rights under HIPAA regulations, the hospital's responsibilities to safeguard protected health information, and what can be done if a patient feels

their privacy has been violated. Don't be alarmed when asked to sign an acknowledgment regarding the Notice of Privacy - it is required by law. Knox County Hospital District faces stiff fines if it violates the rules associated with HIPAA and is asking for assistance in the difficult transition of implementing new privacy policies. Don't be surprised when calling for information about a friend, neighbor or family member that the information can't be released - it's the law.  Funeral services for Bruce B. Campbell Jr. of Knox City were held Sunday, November 24, 2002, at 2:30 p.m. at the Church of Christ in Knox City with Gene McCarty officiating. Burial was in the Knox City Cemetery with Smith Funeral Home in charge of arrangements. Mr. Campbell, 85, died Friday, November 22, 2002, in the Knox County Hospital. Born January 6, 1918, in Normangee, Texas, he graduated from Texas A&M University with a bachelor's degree in engineering. He married Mary Margaret Bigham on March 5, 1941, in Goldthwaite, Texas. She preceded him in death in 1997. Mr. Campbell was president of Citizens State Bank until he retired. He was director of the Knox City Chamber of Commerce from 1967-1970. He was on the Brazos River Authority from 1971-1989, serving as chairman. He was a member of the Chamber of Commerce and was awarded the E. Hob Smith Most Appreciated Citizen award in 1988. He was a member of the Knox City Lions Club and had also served on the City Council. He served in the United States Army during World War II with 2nd Engineers Special Brigade and was awarded the Bronze Star and the Purple Heart. He was a member of the Church of Christ. Survivors include a daughter, Mary Jo Campbell of Dripping Springs; and a brother, Tom Campbell of Georgetown. 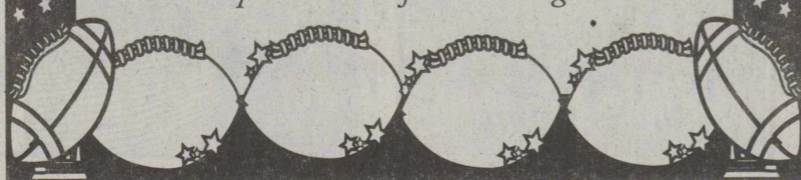

Corrine Parrish spent a few days last week in the Houston area visiting friends.

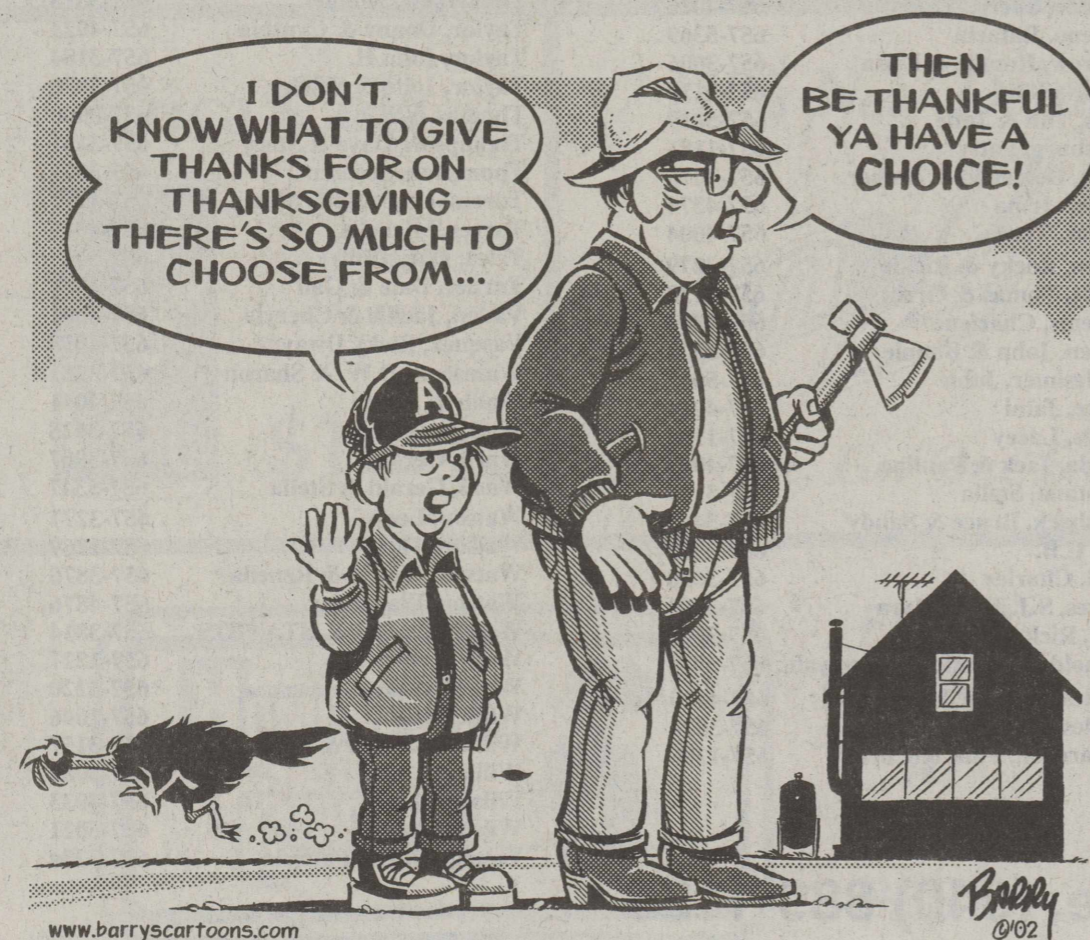

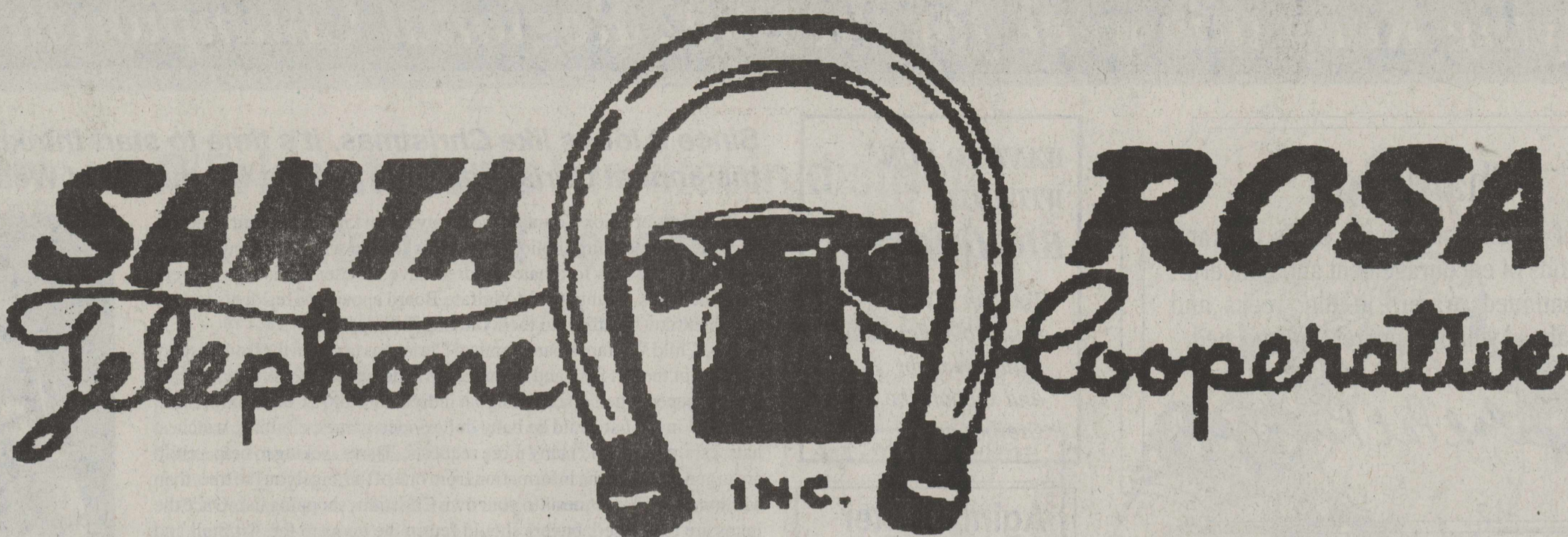

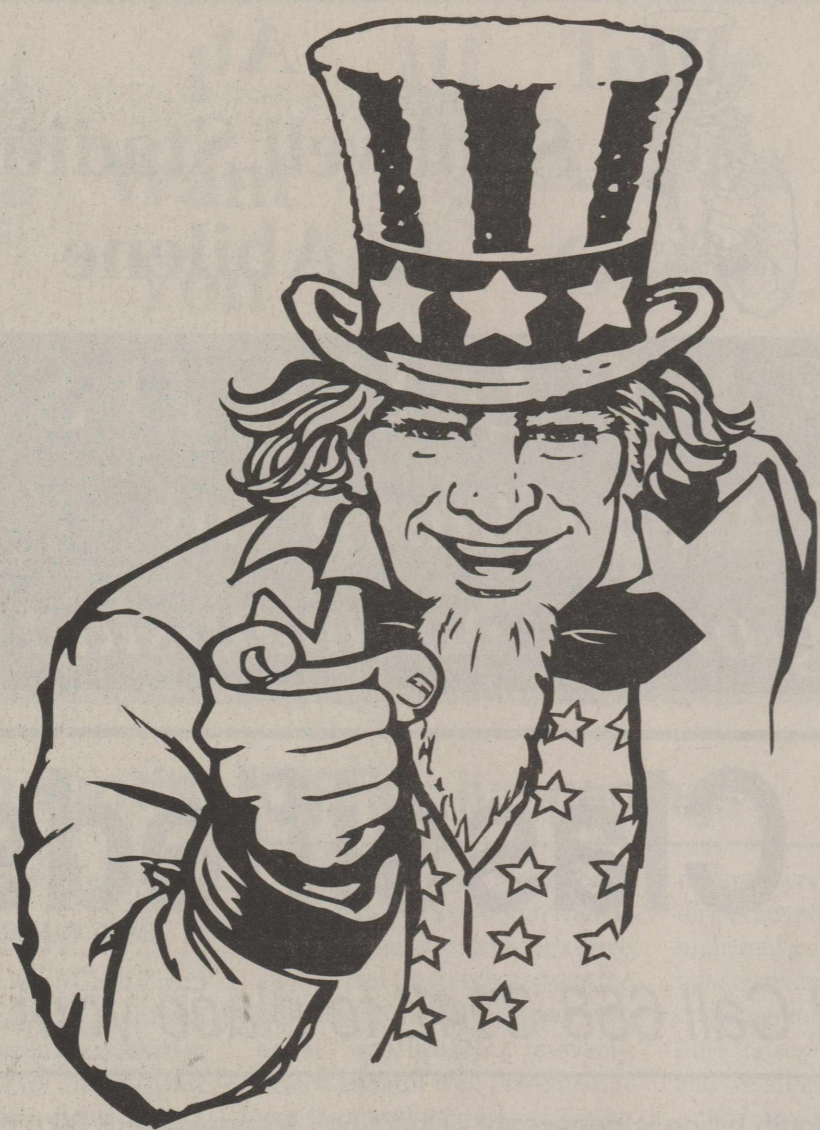
