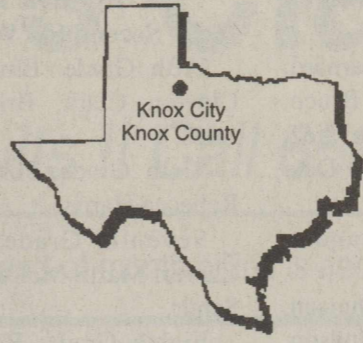

Greyhounds claim Regional title



2002 Knox City Greyhounds ~ Regional Champions



STARTING ON HIS 96 YARD TOUCHDOWN RUN, Knox City Greyhound running back Riley Spells is shown here as he turns the corner at the 4 yard line on the right side of the field. Roby Lions crushed by 'Hounds

The Knox City Greyhounds totally dominated the Regional Championship game last Saturday night at Shotwell Stadium in Abilene by soundly defeating the Roby Lions, 34-7.

Expecting a fight, Knox City's 'Hounds took to the field with an attitude that the game was theirs and never changed that way of thinking. Scoring first after only four minutes of play, Greyhound fans went wild when Dominique Collier took the ball across the goal line after a 14 yard run. Collier also added the extra point kick to put Knox City on top, 7-0.

Just a little over three minutes later, all Roby's defenders could do was watch as Quentin Spells showed his amazing speed and went untouched on a 38 yard romp into the end zone. Collier moved the score to 14-0 with another extra point kick between the up-rights.

Four minutes into the second quarter, Knox City added another 7 points on the scoreboard when quarterback Sedrick Roberson took the ball across the goal line with a one yard plunge and Collier added his third extra point kick.

In the next 4 minutes, Roby advanced the ball down to Knox City's 20 yard line and looked as if their offense was finally on track. A pass from quarterback J.W. Chick that might have been a Roby touchdown was intercepted by Greyhound Carlos Ruiz on the 4 line to stop the drive. Taking over on their own 4 yard line, the Greyhound offense thrilled the fans once again when Riley Spells took a handoff and returned the ball up the right sideline for 96 yards and another Knox City touchdown. Collier's extra point attempt failed, leaving the score 27-0 when the teams went into the locker room at half time.

Third quarter action was scoreless, and the scoreboard remained 27-0 until 5:27 left in the fourth quarter when Greyhound Quarterback Sedrick Roberson took the ball in on another 1 yard keeper. With the scoreboard showing 33-0, Dominique Collier kicked in his final extra point of the game to up the score to 34-0.

In the final few minutes of play, Knox City's JV team took to the field for valuable playoff experience. Roby's varsity kept driving on offense, finally scoring with a 10 yard pass from J.W. Chick to Josh Williamson with 2 seconds left in the game. Josh Moffett added the extra point to end the game with the score Knox City 34 - Roby 7.

Other game highlights included a 23 yard run first quarter run by Scooter Thompson, and a sack of the Roby quarterback by Quentin Spells with seconds left in the first half. In the second half of action, Greyhound linebacker Caleb Carver made what has to be the best and hardest hitting sack of the season when he totally levelled J.W. Chick, the Roby quarterback, as he was attempting a pass. Chick got up wobbling and was observed holding his head for quite a while after the hit.

Riley Spells led the Greyhound offensive charge with 124 yards on 4 carries and 1 touchdown. Sedrick Roberson picked up 2 touchdowns with 65 yards on 10 carries, Gemile Roberson ran for 60 yards on 5 carries, Quentin Spells ran for 48 yards on 3 carries with 1 touchdown, Dominique Collier ran for 36 yards and a touchdown on 8 carries, and Scooter Thompson picked up 29 yards in 7 attempts.

Quarterback Sedrick Roberson also threw the ball 7 times with 3 completions for 64 yards and no

interceptions. Carlos Ruiz hauled in 2 of the passes for 38 yards, and Gemile Roberson received the third completed pass of the game for 26 yards.

On defense, Sedrick Roberson led the team with 14 tackles, including 2 for a loss and 1 pass hurry. Scooter Thompson had 12 tackles, with 2 for a loss and 3 pass hurries. Caleb Carver had 11 tackles with 4 for a loss, 2 sacks, and 4 pass hurries. C.J. Bruce had 10 tackles, including 1 pass hurry. Carlos Ruiz had 8 tackles, with 1 critical interception and 1 broken pass. Gemile Roberson had 7 tackles, with 4 for a loss, 1 sack and 2 pass hurries. Kendrick Green had 8 tackles with 1 for a loss. Sean Duncan had 7 tackles, with 1 for a loss and 1 pass hurry. Rickey Gonzales also had 7 tackles, with 1 for a loss. Dominique Collier had 5 tackles, including 2 for a loss and 1 pass hurry. Riley Spells had 4 tackles with 1 broken pass. Quentin Spells had 3 tackles, including 1 sack and 1 pass hurry. Josh Ivie had 3 tackles with 1 for a loss, Logan Morrow had 2 tackles, Wes Parker had 2 tackles, and Cameron Hutchinson, T.J. Richardson and Ben Simmons each had 1 tackle.

Knox City picked up a total of 354 yards on 36 carries, Roby had 162 yards on 45 carries. KC picked up 64 yards through the air with 3 of 7 passes completed; Roby aired out 58 yards on 7 of 13 passes with 1 interception. Knox City picked up 16 first downs to Roby's 12 and only had to punt the ball 1 time. Roby punted 4 times. The Greyhounds fumbled once with a turnover, Roby did not fumble at all. The dreaded yellow flag came back to haunt Knox City once again with 55 yards lost on 5 penalties. Roby only lost 15 yards on 3 calls.

Knox City set to battle Petrolia on Friday in State Quarter Finals

As the Knox City Greyhounds continue to advance through the Class 1A post season playoffs, they are busy this week preparing for the State Quarter Final Game that will be played this Friday night. The 'Hounds, their coaches and fans will once again be returning to Memorial Stadium in Wichita Falls, where they will take on the Petrolia Pirates.

With a kickoff time set for 7:30 p.m., the Greyhounds will be facing a very talented team from Petrolia. The Pirates not only have one of the best running backs in Texas with Ross Harrison, they

also have a passing game worthy of respect. The game should be a solid matchup on both offense and defense as both Knox City and Petrolia are among only eight teams who remain playing in 1A football.

In last weeks regional action, Knox City defeated Roby 34-7, and Petrolia defeated Roscoe 33-3. Knox City's game will be remembered for the relentless Greyhound running attack, while Petrolia's game was an aerial display.

Knox City will be the visiting team at Memorial Stadium this Friday night, fans will park in the

east parking lot and sit in the east stands. There will be a tailgate party in the southeast corner of the parking lot for all Knox City fans, that event is scheduled to begin at 5:30.

All Greyhound fans and supporters are urged to make the short drive to Wichita Falls and support your home town team!

The weekly pep rally will be in the W.R. Baker Auditorium on the Knox City school campus, it is set to begin at 2:45 on Friday afternoon. The team will leave for Wichita Falls immediately following the pep rally.

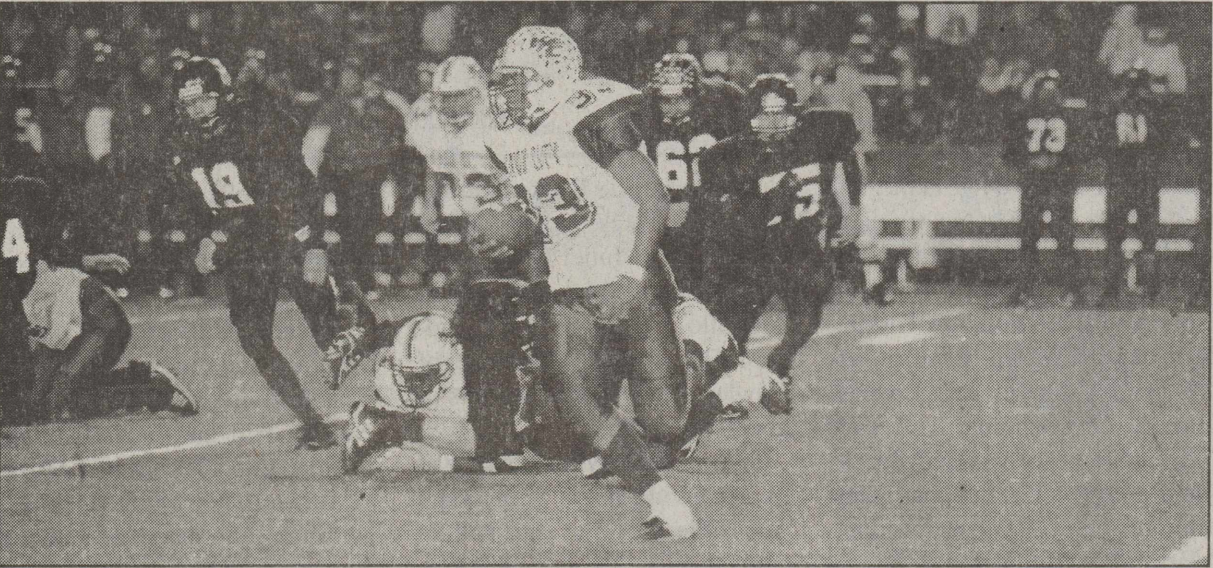

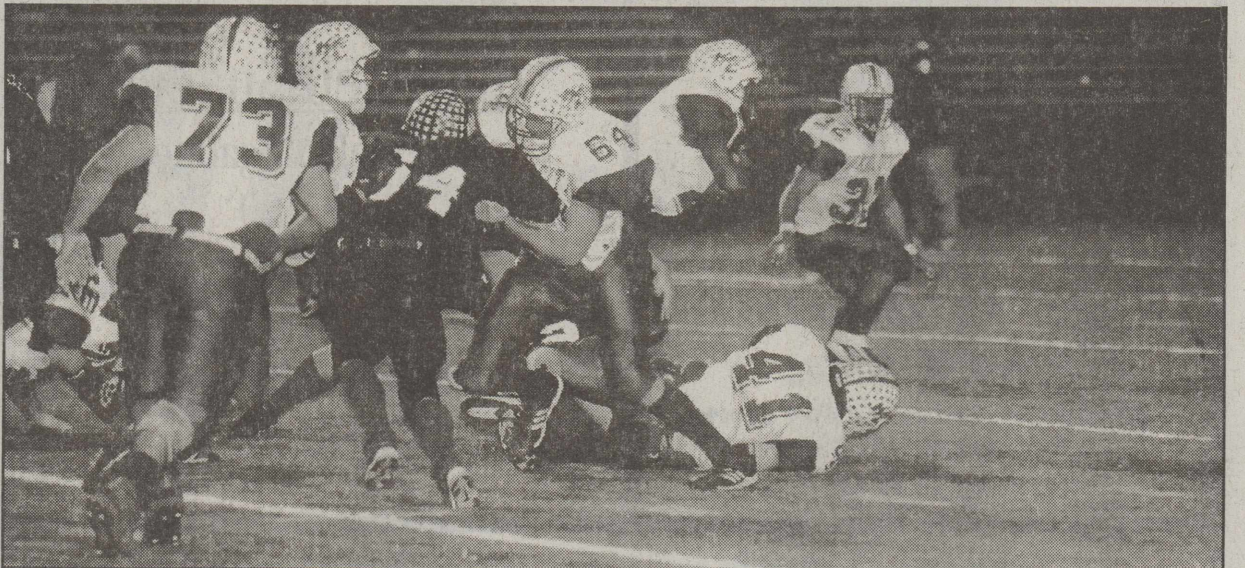

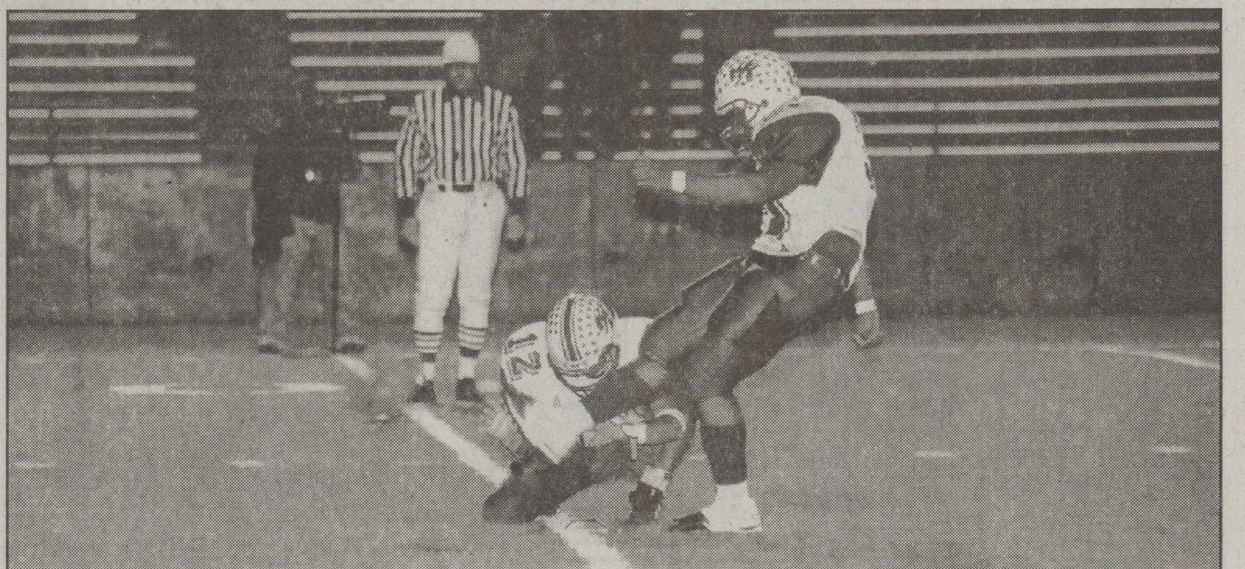

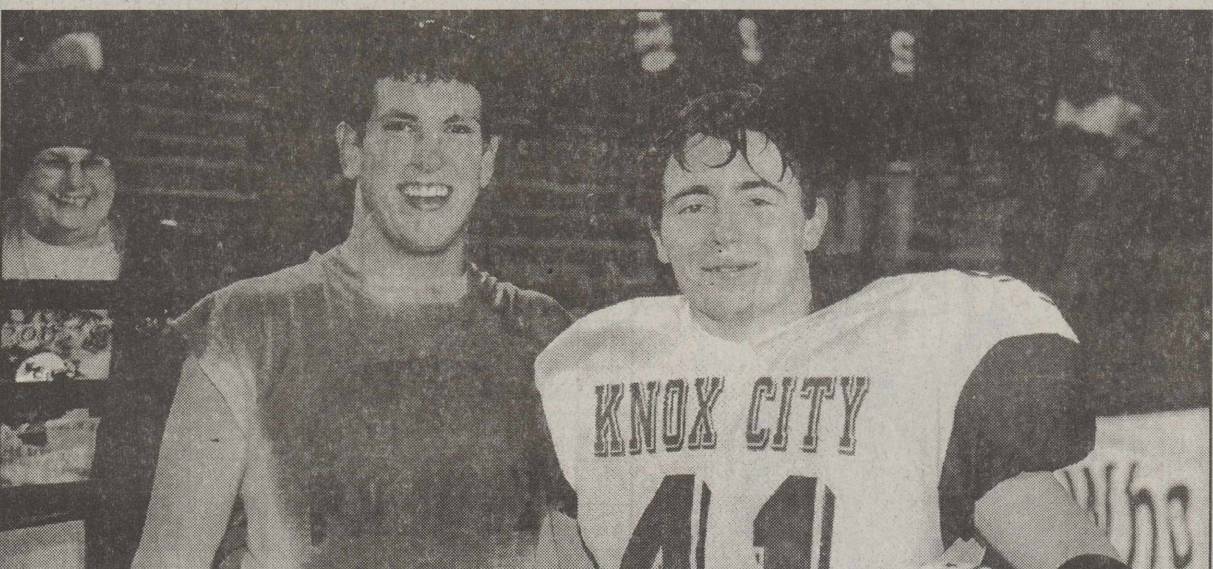

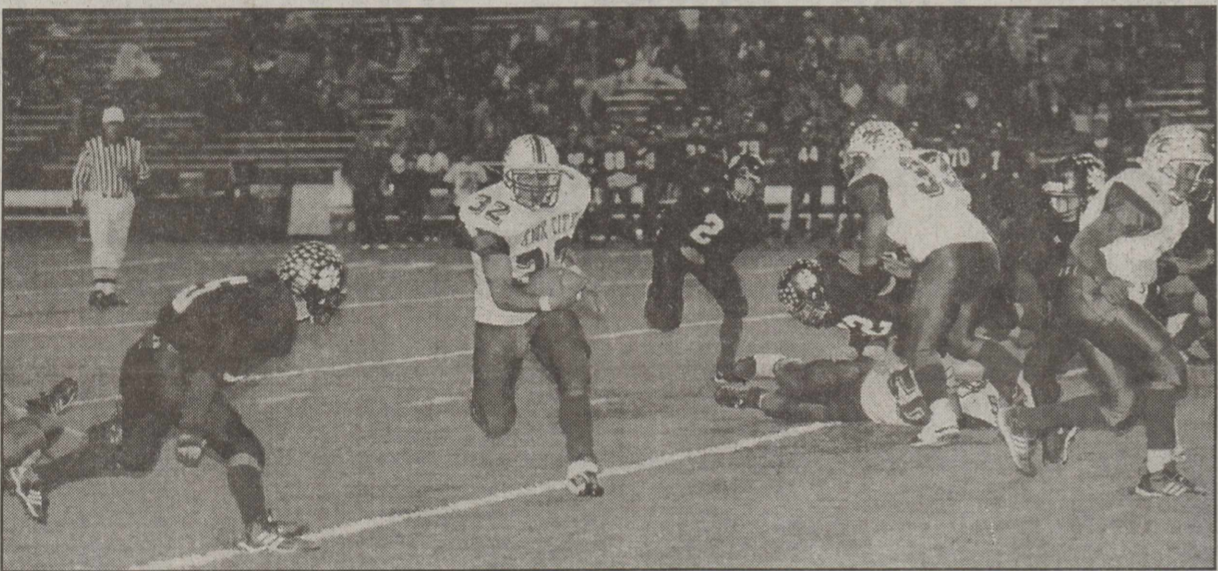

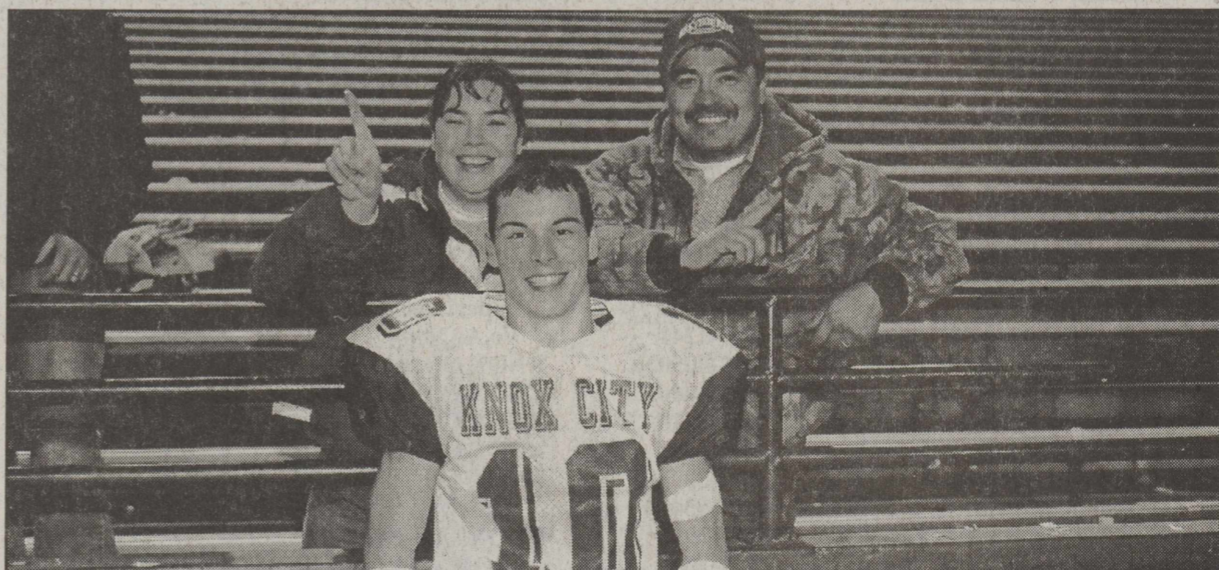
