The Knox City-O'Brien -Benjamin Little League Organization has scheduled it's annual registration meeting to kick off the 1994 Little League season. The meeting has been scheduled for this Thursday, April 7, at 6:00 p.m. in the W.R. Baker Auditorium on the Knox City school campus.

Parents Required To Attend
