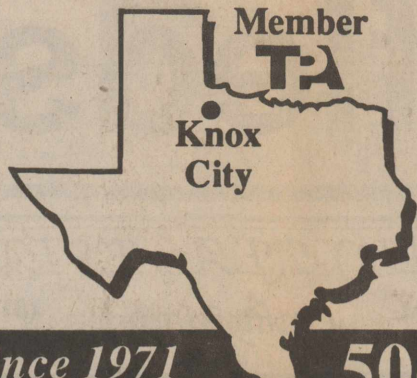

Other distribution locations will be in Rochester from 8:00-9:00 a.m. at the Rochester Fire Department building; Benjamin: 9:30-10:30 a.m. at the Knox County Courthouse; Truscott: 9:00-9:30 a.m. at the Truscott Community Center; Gilliland: 9:45-10:15 at the Gilliland Community Center; Vera: 10:45-11:15 a.m. at the Vera

Community Center; Goree: 1:30-2:15 p.m. at the Goree Community Center; Munday: 3:00-4:00 p.m. at the Munday Community Center.

Recipients are asked to bring a large grocery sack, and each person must present identification (including Social Security Card and Driver's License) before receiving commodities.

date as they enter the building. These results will be announced after this program is completed.

The dates that the farmers will vote on are May 9, May 16 and May 23.

Local Injured In Fatal Accident

A Knox City man remained hospitalized in Lubbock Tuesday after being critically injured in a near head-on collision west of Knox City Friday afternoon.

Santos Guerrero, 46, was listed in serious but stable condition said a University Medical Center spokeswoman. He was flown to University Medical Center after being treated at the Knox County Hospital. His wife, Pat Chavez, is in Lubbock with her husband. A fund has been started at Brazos Valley Care Home to help defray medical expenses and anyone wanting to donate may do so there. Pat is employed by the nursing home.

Joe Conception Martinez, 42, of Rochester died in the Knox

County Hospital Friday evening from injuries received in the accident. Graveside services were held Monday at 10:30 a.m. in the Rochester Cemetery with the Rev. Katharyn Byrd officiating, directed by Smith Funeral Home.

Knox City Police Chief Dean Homstad said that the pair was traveling west on State Highway 222 in a mid-1980s Dodge pickup shortly before 5:00 p.m. when it crossed the center stripe and hit an eastbound tractor semi-trailer rig. Truck driver Randy Smith of Knox City tried to avoid the pickup, swerving his rig off the road and clearing a creek, Homstad said. Smith was not injured.

Smith is employed by J. C. Eaton and Sons of Knox City.

Little League SignUp Is Thursday At 6:00

All Little League, T-Ball, Girls Softball Players And Parent(s) Required To Attend Important Planning Meeting

The Knox City-O'Brien-Benjamin Little League Organization has scheduled its annual registration meeting to kick off the 1994 Little League season. The meeting has been scheduled for this Thursday, April 7, at 6:00 p.m. in the W.R. Baker Auditorium on the Knox City school campus.

Parents Required To Attend

This meeting is very important and parents should note that either one or both parents are required to be present at the meeting with their child if the child expects to play ball this year. Unlike past years, the registration meeting this year will include a program to discuss the teams, the officials, insurance, the concession stand, fan conduct, and many other items. Little League officials want to stress to the parents that Little League is not a baby-sitting service, it is a sport for youth that involves the family and not just the boy or girl who is actually playing ball. The officers

and coaches of the Little League Association are not paid employees, they are parents who volunteer and end up donating a lot of their time to the effort. The program on Thursday evening will present information on how parents can help out.

Players Will Register

Along with the program scheduled to pass on information, actual registration for the 1994 season will be conducted on Thursday evening. Registration forms will have already been taken to the schools and handed out to all interested students. There will also be registration forms available at the meeting. The registration fee this year has not gone up, it will remain at \$13.00 per child who will play ball. That \$13.00 fee includes the cost of insurance for each player through the national Little League Association.

5 Year Olds Can Play

This year, the local association has adopted the new option to allow 5 year olds to play T-Ball.

In the past, T-Ball started at age 6, with the child being required to be in Kindergarten. This year, 5 year olds will be able to play, with no Kindergarten requirement.

Girls Softball Is New

Another new feature of the 1994 season is the addition of fully sanctioned girls softball teams in the Little League age division. So far, there have been 24 girls express an interest in this new league.

T-Ball Games To Expand

At the most recent meeting of the Knox City Little League Association, the board discussed expanding the T-Ball game schedule to include 2 games a week, just as the Little League teams are scheduled.

Benjamin Teams Added

Another action taken by the board was to approve the addition of one T-Ball team and one Little League team from Benjamin as a part of the league. The formation of teams from Benjamin will save the parents of Benjamin players

from having to travel back and forth to Knox City. The teams will practice in Benjamin and play here in Knox City.

Teams To Be Picked

At the conclusion of the program and registration on Thursday night, the coaches and officers will meet to pick teams. With the exception of Benjamin players who will go to their own teams this year and the girls going into softball, players will stay on the same teams as last year. New players into the league will be drafted into the various teams and notified by their coach about team information.

Some New Coaches Added

Although players from last year will be going back to the same teams, many of the players will be under the direction of new coaches. Coaches for the 1994 season are as follows:

T-Ball: The Astro coach will be Dwayne Johnson. The Braves coaches will be Robert Anderson and Danny Wainscott. The Rang-

ers coaches will be Marq Brockett and Ricky Gonzales. The Tigers coach will be Ronnie Bruce.

Little League: The Cardinal coaches will be Danny Parker and Sid Richardson. The Dodgers Coaches will be Jessie Rios, Nefro Gonzales and Dave Thompson. The Royals coaches will be Cindy Maxwell and Kim Estrada. The Tigers coaches will be Domingo Garcia and Tharon Campbell.

Pony League: Bill Allen has agreed to coach the Pony League if enough players sign up to form a team.

Coaches for the Girls softball teams and the Benjamin T-Ball and Little League Team have yet to be determined, depending on how many players register for each on Thursday evening.

Officers for this year are Kevin Stone, President; Danny Parker, Vice-President; and Dave Thompson, Secretary Treasurer. Head Umpire for the 1994 season is Ronnie Oliver.

The coaches and officers of the

Knox City-O'Brien Little League have all agreed to place a priority on Kids having fun this year!

Parents need to remember that one or both parents of a player are required to be present at this very important meeting at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday night. The program will last for approximately 30 minutes, with the registration to follow. If both parents are unable to attend the meeting, another adult relative may bring the child to registration as long as the parents have signed the registration form in advance. The registration form also includes a waiver statement, a return uniform statement and family insurance information, so be sure to read it carefully and fill in all the blanks.

The meeting applies to the parents of all players, male and female, ages 5-6-7-8-9-10-11-12 and Pony League age.

This is an important meeting - If your child plans to play ball this year, please be there!
