Greyhounds 'Spur' Bulldogs, 27-15

Knox City proud of season's first victory

The Knox City Greyhounds looked - and played - like a determined, finely tuned football team when they took on and soundly defeated the Bulldogs from Spur in a home game at Greyhound Stadium last Friday night.

Combining a sound offense with a crushing defense, the 'Hounds picked up over 400 yards on the way to defeating Spur.

Anthony Ainsworth and Michael Baez ran for a total of 358 yards, with Ainsworth gaining 197 yards on 18 carries and Baez running for 161 yards and two touchdowns. Ainsworth and Brandon Gutierrez each crossed the goal line for Knox City touchdowns.

Playing before a happy home crowd, the Greyhound win over Spur was the first victory for Knox City this season. KC now has a 1-2 record (with one open date), while Spur drops to 0-4.

The Greyhounds will travel to Roby this Friday night for a district game against the Lions. The kickoff is scheduled for 7:30 p.m.






