

Heaven and Christmas have different meanings for me this year.

The year of 1997 has truly been one I will never forget.

Referred to as "the most happiest time of the year" by Scooter, we have continued our tradition of decorating and gift-wrapping.

Referred to as "the most happiest time of the year" by Scooter, we have continued our tradition of decorating and gift-wrapping as a tribute to Daddy who loved the holiday more than life itself. His face would light up at the thought of playing Santa and seeing the *News* office windows fill with Christmas presents benefiting the Child Welfare. Most of all, he loved the season and time spent with his family. We did too.

One of the greatest gifts I will receive this Christmas season is a column written by Dr. Billy Graham. Mom saw this in a daily newspaper, titled "We should know others in Heaven..."

The song lyrics of "I Bowed On My Knees" say "as I entered the gates of that City, my loved ones all knew me well, they took me down the streets of Heaven, the scenes they're too many to tell.." Some do not believe we will know each other in Heaven; however, being one who has always has, I found great comfort in Dr. Graham's remarks.



A lady wrote to Dr. Graham asking the question, "Do you think we will recognize our loved ones in Heaven?" She further went on by saying, "I know the Bible says we will have new bodies that will be perfect and never grow old, but does that mean we won't recognize each other? I worry about this, since my husband died just a year ago and I long to see him again."

Dr. Graham replied to her by saying, "The Bible gives every indication we will recognize our loved ones who are in Heaven, and you should take comfort in that fact.

"This is seen in various passages in the Bible. For example, when Jesus was transfigured before some of His disciples and His Heavenly glory shown through, they still recognized Him. They also recognized Moses and Elijah who appeared with Him, although they had been dead for many hundreds

of years (see Matthew 17: 1-13). Paul declared that in Heaven "... I shall know fully, even as I am fully known" (1 Corinthians 13:12). King David took comfort in the fact he would be reunited with his dead son: "... Can I bring him back again? I will go to him ..." (2 Samuel 12:23).

He ended by saying "Rejoice that your loved one is now in Heaven, safe from all pain and illness.









The City of O'Brien water system collected one water sample during the month of November 1997 that contained Coliform bacteria. The City of O'Brien water system is required to submit a minimum of two water samples each

month for bacteriological analysis. The Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) sets drinking water standards in Texas and has determined that the presence of total coliform is a possible health concern. Total coliform are common in the environment and are generally not harmful themselves. However, the presence of these bacteria in drinking water, generally is a result of a problem with water treatment or the pipes which distribute the water and indicates that the water may be contaminated with organisms that can cause disease. Disease symptoms may include diarrhea, cramps, nausea and possibly jaundice, and associated headaches and fatigue. These symptoms, however, are not just associated with disease-causing organisms in drinking water, but may also be caused by a number of factors other than you drinking

METER TAMPERING NOW A FELONY

The State of Texas has recently adopted an amendment to the State Penal Code making meter tampering a third degree felony. A third degree felony comes with a punishment of confinement in the Texas Department of Corrections for a term of not more than 10 or less than 2 years. In addition to imprisonment, an individual adjudged guilty of a third degree felony may be punished by a fine not to exceed \$5,000.

Before the amendment of the new law, it was a class A misdemeanor for meter tampering unless the loss of service was more than \$200. Under the new law, any meter tampering regardless of the amount of loss is now a felony of the third degree.

Meter tampering consists of, but is not limited to: (1) Diverting electricity from passing through a meter device.

(2) Preventing electric service from being correctly registered by a meter device. (3) Unauthorized activation of service.

As a special note to our members, it will also be considered meter tampering if a meter is reset and electrical service is restored by anyone other than a Cooperative

All Cooperative meters are sealed. This seal should not be cut or broken without

special authorization. In cases where the seal must be cut for emergencies, the Cooperative should be notified as soon as possible so that the meter can be resealed.











Two years ago, a Holland bookstore ordered bracelets. Last year, the company sold 250,000 bracelets. To date in 1997, four million bracelets have been sold. Four thousand stores carry the bracelet, up from 500 in March.

This year alone, sales are over \$1 million. The bracelet has even gone global, and a WWJD Bible is in print. God instructed the people of Israel to make the Shema central to their lives: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might." They were told to think on these words at bedtime, to teach them to their children, to write them on their door frames and to wear them on their hands. (Deuteronomy 6: 4-9).

In a time when corporate logos and brand-name clothing communicate values and loyalties, the WWJD jewelry serves as a 1990s version of the Shema, telling others who we are. It reminds us to show our values through the decisions we make and actions we take.

WWJD is a positive trend worth joining. (Partial excerpts taken from The Baptist Standard)












