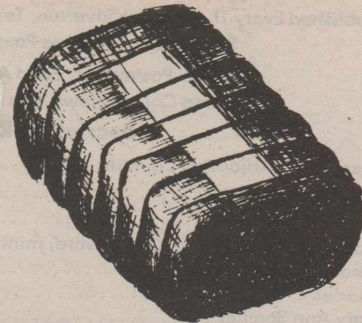

A couple of television camera crews have been in Silverton during the past few days, and it is exciting to see them at work.

Last Thursday *The Texas Country Reporter* was here to film a program in the studio of J. Christopher White. Scheduled to be aired in December, the outstanding wood sculpture and religious inspiration of the carver will be the subject of the program.

It had been planned to film the sunrise that morning at Caprock Canyons State Park, but due to cloud cover there was no sunrise.

Recently a segment for advertising background for Dickey-Stout Motor Ranch was filmed on the yard of the Briscoe County Courthouse and near the Jailhouse Museum. What a sight that huge longhorn steer made carrying his overalled rider around the courthouse! County officials were filmed waving from the east courthouse steps.

New in Silverton: the Garage Sale. Located in the back of Tiffin's Bazaar, it is open on Saturdays. New merchandise arrives all the time, and the building is packed with "good stuff".

In addition, if you have things you want to sell and don't want to have your own garage sale, Spud and his crew will sell it for you. The store gets 20% and you get 80% and you do the pricing. If you are interested, contact Betty Nan and she will give you a seller's identification number to put on your price tag.

The Bazaar continues to be a really good place to go to "sit a spell" and visit. There usually is homemade ice cream for sale and sometimes other goodies as well.

Another good place to loaf around is Caprock Floral Ranch, located east of the park. It is amazing to see what Margaret Smith and Rhenda Burson are doing with dried weeds and flowers. I think it is so wonderful that someone can take what has always been a "throw-away" and use it to make some money. The girls also are selling arts and crafts for some of the local artisans, helping others to "make a little money."

Be sure to mark your calendar: the Briscoe County Birthday Celebration is coming August 13-14, and this is just around the corner. School starts the following Tuesday, August 17.

New Highway to Connect Quitaque With 207 North of South Plains

House Speaker Pete Laney (D-Hale Center) was among special guests Friday who celebrated the announcement that the state will construct a highway linking South Plains and Quitaque.

Also attending were David Beernson, chairman of the Texas Department of Transportation, and State Senator Steve Carriker (D-Roby) as well as a representative of State Senator John Montford (D-Lubbock) and several other office holders.

Following a chuckwagon barbecue served from a campsite overlooking Caprock Canyons, Beernson told about 30 residents of South Plains and Quitaque that the construction bid will be awarded in November 1994, with work to begin shortly thereafter.

Beernson is credited with getting funding for the road, which will run from State Highway 207 near South Plains to FM 1065 near Quitaque, pushed through the commission.

"What you did for us is going to help these fine people," Laney said.

"It's good to know we will have people paying attention to rural needs," Carriker said.

Beernson said the importance of the road goes beyond what it will mean for the two cities and Caprock Canyons State Park.

"This road is symbolic for all of Texas," he said. "This road is a statement from the commission that rural Texas is not overlooked. You are not forgotten. You are remembered."

"We don't have enough money to build all the roads in Texas that are needed," he said. "But this opens up a path so people can see God's creation. And it allows for the movement of products and people safely from point to point."

Beernson also said the road "is important to the economic vitality of the area."

"It is important that rural Texas is not forgotten," he said.

Among those attending the celebration was Mildred Hamm, one of two women who began working on getting the road constructed more than 20 years ago.

Truman Merrell, who has lived in the area all his life, stood up to praise the decision to pave the highway.

"I've been driving over this old dirt road all my life and I'd like to thank you," he said.

Among those attending the festivities were many South Plains and Quitaque residents who traveled to Austin to testify before Beernson and the commission.

The bricks sell for \$50 each and the inscription may be up to 18 letters (and/or spaces) per line on three lines per brick. You may contract for more than one brick, if you wish. There are no age limitations on who may participate in this memorial project containing historical data for public viewing.

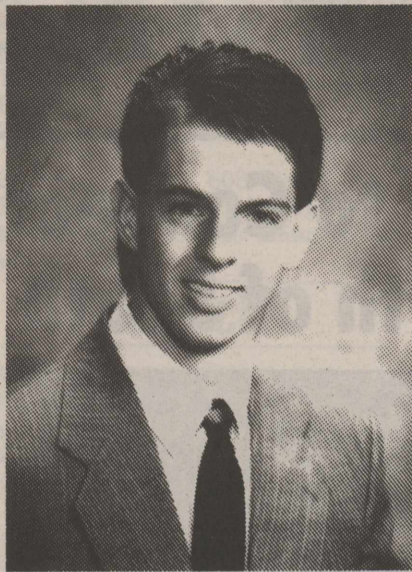

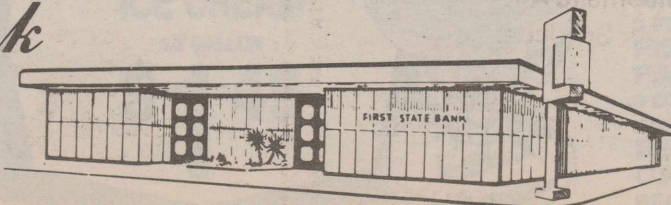

Summer Project Benefits Kids and Family

Even though summers seem to get shorter and busier every year, time still drags for many school-age children. Parents can help by getting kids started on a summer project to fill their time off.

One project useful to the whole

family is a home inventory book. A home inventory is a record of everything you own. It is a valuable aid in case of a fire, theft, or other loss of property. It provides a basis for estimating lost value and establishing insurance claims. In addition, a home inventory can help your family determine the amount of insurance you need to cover your possessions.

For kids, creating a home inventory is helpful for other reasons. It makes them aware of the value of items in their home. It gives them a chance to find out the history of family heirlooms or antiques that have been passed from generation to generation. And it provides a source of fun and pride through taking pictures and producing a useful product.

Equip your children with camera and film, pens, loose-leaf paper and a notebook binder. On each sheet of paper, your child or children will place a picture of one item in your home and a description of the item. The description should include information such as the manufacturer, model and serial number. For some items, like appliances or electronics, your child may be able to find a current newspaper or magazine advertisement showing a similar item. That ad can be added to the inventory page to represent replacement value of the item.

Review the inventory with the children periodically and discuss the items they have listed. You may be able to add information about when the item was purchased, how much it cost, or how long it has been in the family. Remember to include items stored in the attic, garage, drawers and closets as well as easily-overlooked items such as furniture and wall hangings.

As the children conduct the

inventory, consider having them engrave an identification number on appliances, electronics, collectibles or other items. Engravers are usually available from local police departments or insurance agencies. Engraved items are less attractive to thieves and aid in matching items with owners when stolen goods are recovered. Use your social security number, driver's license number, or other identification number to mark your items.
