

\$68,000 In Scholarships Are Awarded

A total of 37 of the 68 graduating seniors from Rotan, Roby and Hobbs were awarded in excess of \$68,400 in scholarships and grants to Texas Colleges and Universities at the graduation ceremonies conducted last Friday night.

A total of \$32,952 in grants and scholarships were awarded to 18 of the 31 Rotan High School graduates at ceremonies conducted last Friday night in the Rotan High School Auditorium.

Absentee Balloting Is Underway Again

Fisher County voters will have the opportunity to cast ballots in a second Primary Election (June Runoff) for three races plus the Precinct #1 Fisher County Commissioner race between G. B. Sutton and W. A. Cross.


Absentee balloting in the runoff begins on Wednesday, May 28th and continues through Tuesday, June 3rd. The date of the runoff election is Saturday, June 7th.

In the three races voters will select either James P. "Jim" Wallace of John Phillips for Associate Jus-

tice, Supreme Court, Place 1; W. T. Phillips or Mike McCormick for Judge, Court of Criminal Appeals, Place 3; and Tom Davis or Edith Roberts for Judge, Court of Criminal Appeals, Place #3.

Fisher County voters in election boxes 1, 1a, 18, and 22 will cast runoff ballots for Sutton and Cross in the precinct commissioner # 1 race.

Approximately 125 absentee votes were cast in the May primary, according to Fisher County Clerk Geneva Perkins.

The fire alarm was sounded at approximately 2:55 pm, last Saturday afternoon according to Fire Marshall Wayne Pursley of Roby. Many of the Roby firemen were out of town for their annual fishing trip. Those firemen that did respond to the alarm included: Wayne Pursley, Tommie Frierson, John Kiker, JK.

According to reports the fire started in the area of a soft drink machine and portable electric sandwich grill near the fountain.

The Noles Drug building is owned by Cecil King of Roby.

Dianne and Dan Swaffar are the owners of Noles Drug Store. According to Swaffar, "we're just going to have to wait and see what the insurance adjuster says before making any plans for the future". He

said that the Texas Pharmacy Board in Austin indicated that the intense heat from the fire probably means that all the drugs that were in stock would have to be destroyed. Prescription records were not destroyed according to Swaffar.

Although some clean-up is still underway, the plant is back to full operations after the damaging high waters.
