**SERIOUS ACCIDENT:** Glen Overby, 10 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Donald Overby of Rotan, was injured at the AJRA Rodeo in Midland last Wednesday, Aug. 27, during a goat tying run. He was kicked in the back of the head by his horse. He spent about 4 hours in the operating room where they removed bone spurs from the brain. In a conversation with Sharon Overby last Tuesday morning, we learned that he is making a very rapid recovery and should be back home in about two weeks. He was removed from the critical list, taken out of the Semi Critical Care Area and moved to Pediatrics, Room 405 last Tuesday. He will be back home in a few weeks then back to school 2 or 3 weeks after that. He is walking several times a day, eating good and seems to be recovering fine.
