

Rotan Council Rejects Lone Star Gas Rate Hike

Frank Gravelle, representing the Lone Star Gas Company, appeared before the Rotan City Council last week and requested an approximate 11 percent increase over current rates, according to Kenneth Vann, Rotan City Secretary.

Gravelle, in addition to asking for the increase, asked that a minimum billing plan be implemented.

Members of the Rotan City Council voted 5-0 to deny the increase. It is expected that Lone Star Gas will appear before the

Council in February. Councilmen informed Gravelle that he was welcome to re-present the information in February but strongly encouraged that the portion asking for a minimum bill be deleted.

In other action the council heard a report by

Rotan Police Chief Gene Pack informing them on the activities within the department during December. According to Pack's report, the police department issued 16 tickets; made 8 arrests; questioned 2 juvenile shoplifters; investigated 4

accidents; worked 7 funerals; responded to 2 fire calls and answered 9 prowler calls.

City Secretary Vann informed the council that the Sewage Grand Application had been sent to Austin and that approval of "Phase 2" could come as early as February 28. The new sewage treatment plant, if approved, will cost \$267,000 and will provide Rotan residents with a lagoon type plant and a new lift station.

Vann reported that as of January 12, a total of 73.3 percent of the 1980 taxes had been collected with a total of 19.4 percent of delinquent taxes had been paid.

City employees on hour-

ly wages received a 25 cents an hour pay hike and all salary personnel received a pay increase of \$50.00 a month. This motion to adjust salaries and wages received a 5-0 approval vote by the

council.

Mayor Lester Sencil informed the council that the Rotan Community Center had a total operating expense of \$805.04 in December, had income of \$401.01 leaving a deficit of

\$403.94 that was paid by the council for December.

In final action the council approved the first of four payments to the Fisher County Appraisal District in the amount of \$2,366.75.

Individual football awards were presented to Mike Morrow as offensive line player for 1980 and to Keith Mullins as the offensive back player for 1980.


The offensive player of the year award was presented to Byron Weathersbee.

Rotan, Roby Will Name New Mayors In April

Voters in Fisher County will be naming new board members to the school boards at Rotan, Roby and Hobbs; will name two new board of directors to the hospital board; and will elect mayors and councilmen at both Rotan and Roby on Saturday, April 4.

At Rotan, voters will be electing a new person to serve a two-year term as mayor, plus two councilmen for two-year terms. The office currently being held by Rotan Mayor Lester Sencil, plus two councilmen posts currently being held by Dorothy Lomas and Rodney Tankersley are up for re-election in April. Others serving on the Rotan City Council with one year remaining on their terms include: Jim Nowlin, J.A. McClain, and Connie McQueen.

At Roby, Mayor Carl Matthies and commissioners Jimmie Laurie and Jack McClure have terms expiring this year. The election to name the new city officials will take place April 4. The deadline for filing for elected positions in Roby is March 4.

Two vacancies will be filled by voters on the Fisher County Hospital Board. The terms of Board President Albert Maberry and board member Glenn Copeland expire in 1981. Other board members with one year remaining on their terms include: Rudy Martinez, Raford Hargrove and Kermit Terry.

Voters will be naming two residents of the Rotan Independent School District to two-year terms on April 4. The terms of Allan Houston and Wayne Harris (filling the un-expired term of Dr. Jerry Marshall) are both up for re-election. Board members with another year remaining on their terms are: Ernest Ragan, and Leon Long. Members with two years left on their elected terms are: Donnie Guben, Roger Blackwell and James Carter.

will be running for a one year term. June Wright, filing out the term of Latham Burk, will be running for a two year term, while board members John Matthies and Judy Mauldin have terms of three years expiring in

1981. At Hobbs, school district residents will be naming two residents to three year terms. The term to Gary Hyer expires as does the now vacant seat formerly held by Gary Nettleton. Other board

members with terms expiring in 1981 include: Jerry Hodges and Odell Rains. Three board members have terms expiring in 1983. They include: Howard Gordon, Mickey Templeton and Walt Cave.

Cotton Harvest Over, 24,481 Bales Ginned

Cotton farmers are finished harvesting the disappointing 1980 crop, for all practical purposes, according to Dick Edwards manager of the Rotan Gin. Edwards said last Tuesday morning that in his opinion the cotton was over 95 percent ginned in the county and that it would be pushing the current total of 24,481 bales to ever reach 25,000 bales for the season.

Last year Fisher County farmers reached a record high total of 94,217 bales.

In late November of 1980, gin managers predicted that area farmers would gin around 31,000 bales in 1980. It appears that total bale count figures will fall short of the anticipated count by gin managers.

Rotan Lands One On All Dist. Band

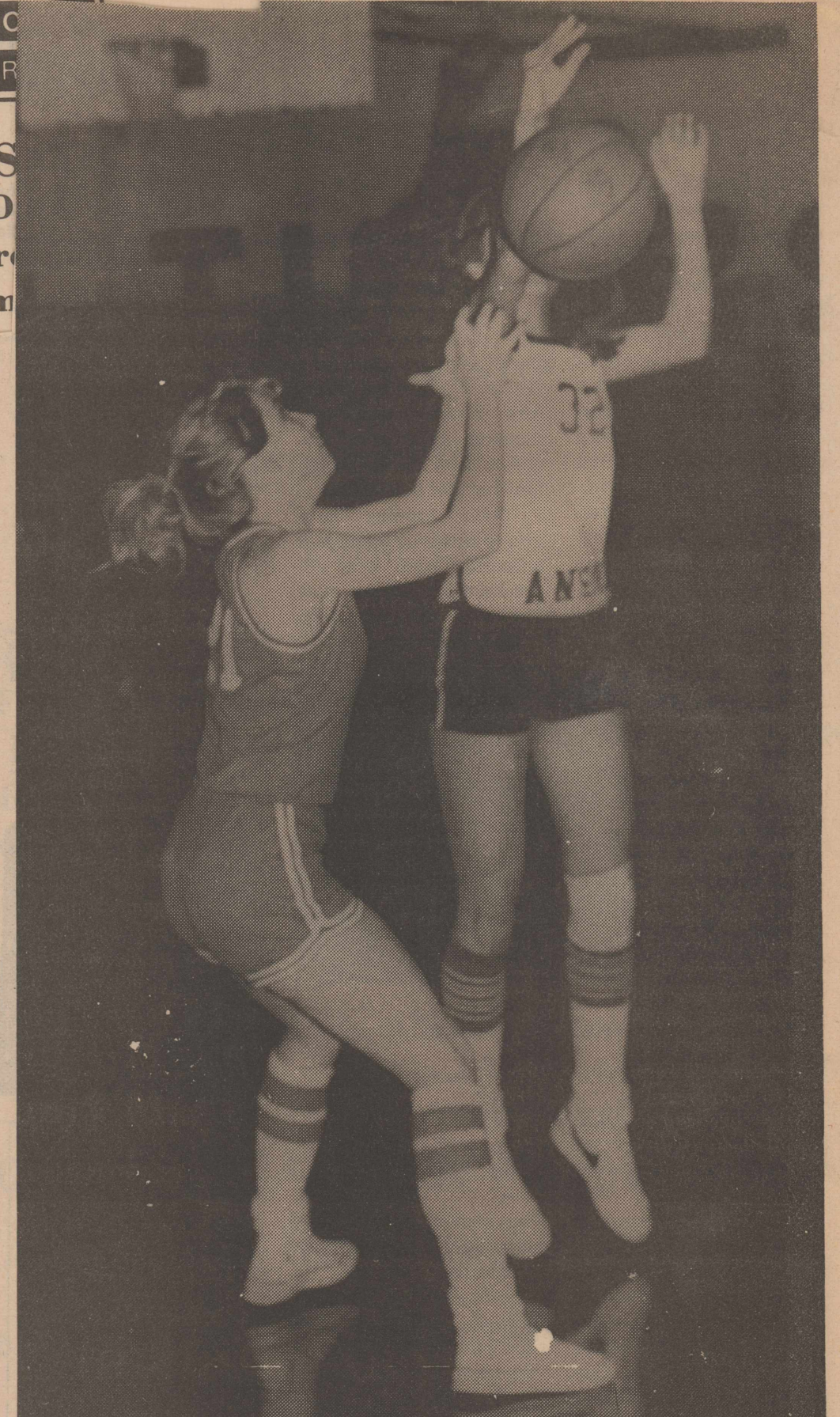

Homestate Pays Out Record Interest

Savers at Homestate Savings Association were paid a record amount of interest last year, according to Don R. Whitehead, president of the Association.

But, Whitehead said, the record high savings interest rates forced Homestate Savings Association to charge higher rates to mortgage customers and that dampened local housing activity.

Mr. Whitehead reported that Homestate Savings Association paid out a record high of 16,009,379 in interest to savers during 1980.

Homestate Savings Association's saving balances now total \$71,121,536, a gain of \$10,331,926 during 1980. Whitehead said the savings balance total is an all-time high.

Mortgage lending, however, was off somewhat from 1979. Even so, Homestate Savings Association loaned \$15,616,601 to mortgage customers. The association now has a total of \$72,153,385 in total

loans outstanding and \$83,298,280 in total assets. These, too, are records, Whitehead stated.

In a year-end report to Homestate Savings Association's customers, Whitehead commented that the 1980s "hold great promise for home lending institutions such as Homestate Savings, in spite of a slow beginning. Changes in the financial industry, such as interest-bearing checking accounts, will offer opportunity for growth through expanding services to customers."

Pat Neeper, Fisher County Auditor, and Karen Gardner, Deputy County Treasurer, attended the Area 2 County Auditor's meeting in Kermit recently. Main topic of the meeting was County Depository Banks.

Mrs. Neeper was selected to serve on the State Membership Committee of the County Auditors Association.

Whitehead said that population trends indicate a record housing demand nationally, and he said that local housing demand should be strong too. "The strength of our local economy and of our housing market depends in great part on the Reagan Administration's success in dealing with inflation."

"Although we expect no miracle cures, we do believe that the new Administration is determined to bring the economy's inflationary excesses under control," Whitehead stated.

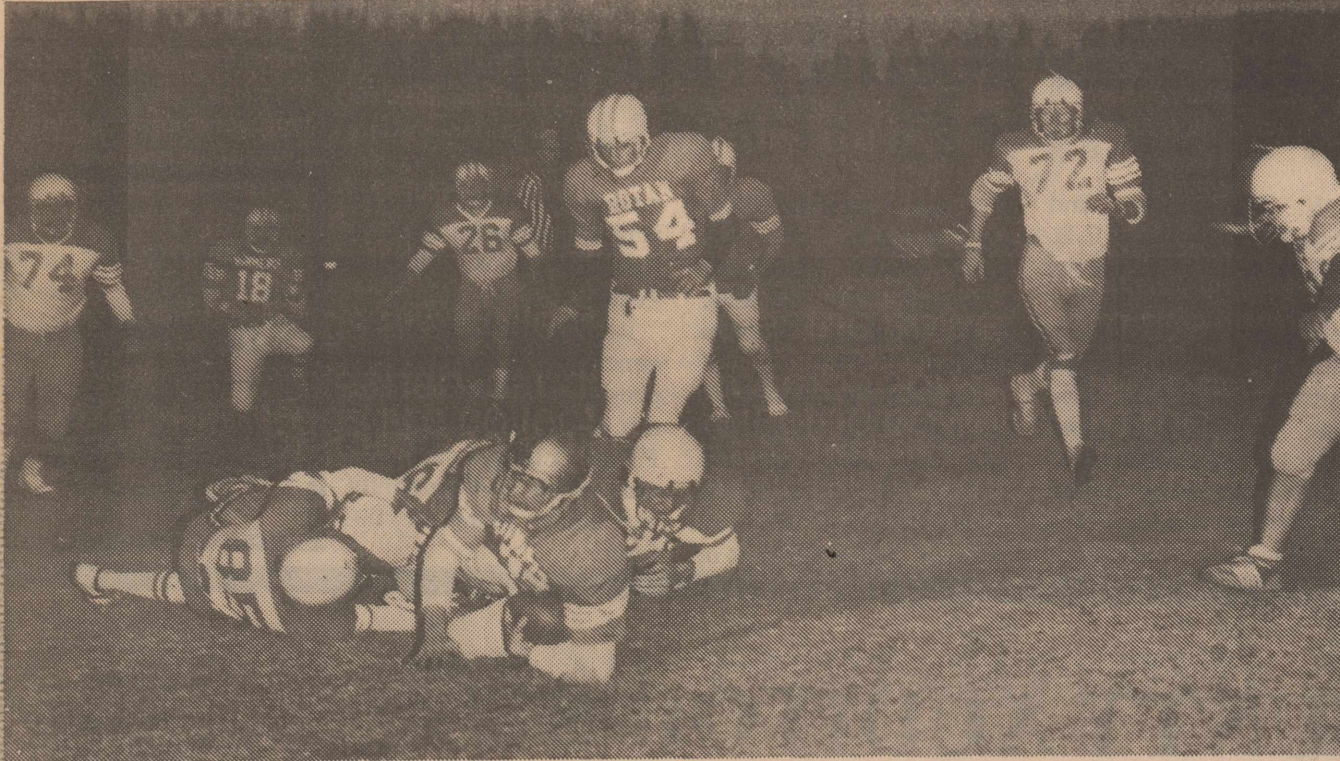
