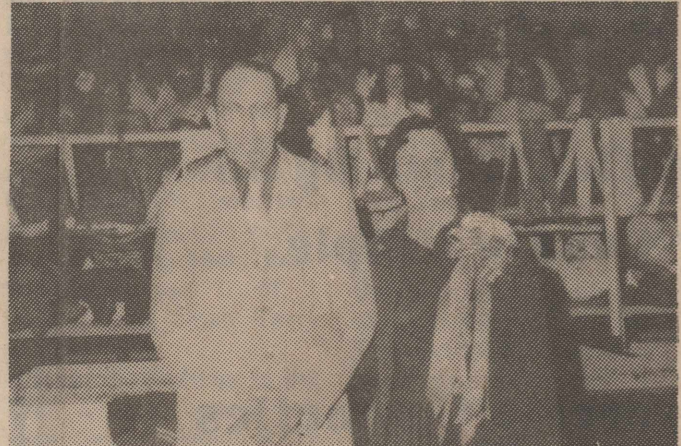


Seven County Gins Ready, Harvesting 10 Days Off

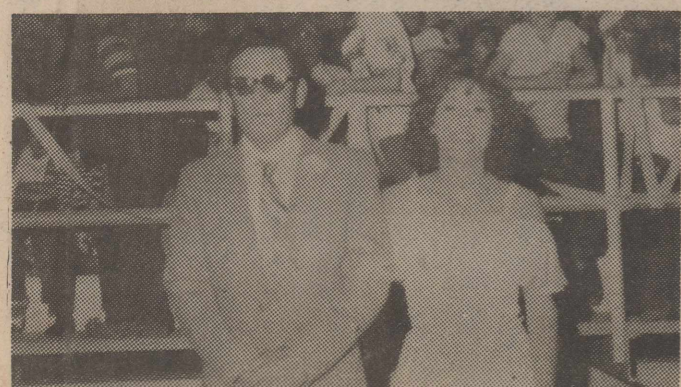

that the early week rainfall that hit lightly over most of Fisher County does not continue.

Although only 2 of the 7 Fisher County gins have started ginning, and that total only amounts to 59 bales, all gins are ready for what is expected to be an extremely large fall ginning season.

The Rotan Gin Company, managed by Jim Gruben, has ginned a total of 22 bales and that small amount has been enough to test the new machinery installed in the off-season. "We've installed a new Lummus 158 gin stand conversions and a new universal density press pump conversion," said Gruben. Both the Lummus 158 and density press will enable the Rotan Gin higher capacity in what will be a busy fall ginning season. "I think we'll be in full swing in about 2 weeks, providing we're not delayed by rain," said Gruben.

The only other county gin to start the 1981 season is The Farmers Gin, managed by Bonnie Duke. They have recorded a total

of 37 bales. "Our gin is running good but we're 2 to 3 weeks away from full swing," according to Bonnie Duke.

Dale Cave, manager of the Hobbs Gin, indicated last Tuesday morning that he would have started ginning that day had the rain not hit the county when it did. "We'll start in the next 10 days. One ag pilot indicated that he had 1,000 acres to defoliate in the next 2 or 3 days," according to Cave. Cave indicated that the Hobbs Gin has installed all new overhead equipment in the gin in the off-season at an estimated cost of \$150,000.00.

Foy Mitchell at the Farmers Union Co-op Gin in Roby thinks a good number of Roby area farmers will begin defoliating next week. He felt that the Farmers Union Co-op Gin would be in full swing in about 10 days.

Donald Coker, manager of the Longworth Gin, Billy Jeffrey at the Sylvester Gin, along with Kermit Terry at Terry's Gin, Inc., are expecting to be running in approximately ten days.

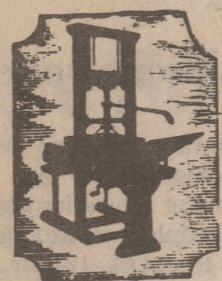
Appraisal Board Will Approve Budget Mon.

In addition, all youth, grades 6-12, are invited to a Hay Ride and Wiener Roast this Friday night. We will leave the church at 6:30.

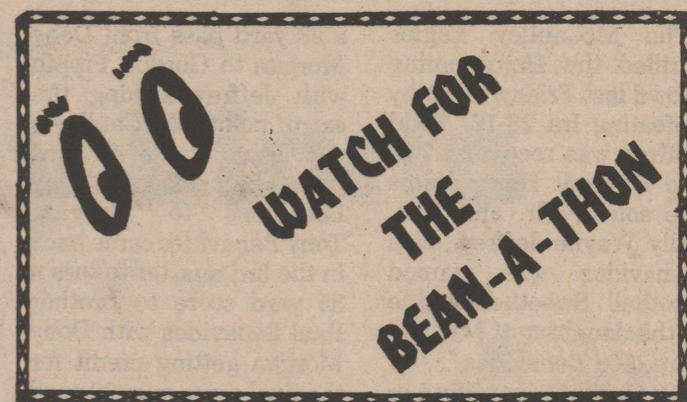

Rotan Yellowhammers Win Thriller Before Homecoming Crowd

The Rotan Yellowhammers put together their best offensive performance of the year last Friday night to defeat the Anson Tigers, previously undefeated in district play, by the score of 22-19.

Rotan clearly out-rushed the opponent running up 206 yards on the ground to 81 yards for Anson. Rotan recorded 18 first downs to 10 for the Tigers and the Yellowhammers completed 7 of 11 passes for 111 yards to 4 of 10 for 120 yards for Anson.

Rotan took the opening kickoff at the 27 yard line. Richard Mendoza returned 3 yards to the 30, then the Rotan offense began a 41 yard march before being stopped by the Tigers. On the 4th down, needing 9 yards, Larry Ramirez punted to the Anson 7 yard line with an Anson runner fumbling the ball. Rotan's Richard Mendoza recovered the fumble, giving Rotan a 1-goal from the 7 yard line. Three plays later Eli Turner bounded over the goal line from 1 yard out to give Rotan a 6-0 lead, after the extra point kick failed, with 7:09 left in the first quarter.

Dennis Warren, Joe Paul Soliz and Eli Turner stopped Anson's Angel Macias on the kickoff. Anson began their first drive from scrimmage at the 38 yard line. After three unsuccessful cracks at the Rotan defensive wall, with key stops by Randy Martinez, Wes Hardin, Ernie Carrillo, Weldon Hayes and Jeff Posey, Anson was faced with 4-5 and punted.

Two offensive carries by Kip Pease and one by Eli Turner failed to pick up a first down forcing another Rotan punt. Robert Salinas blocked the punt for Anson giving the Tigers possession 18 yards from a touchdown. With 2:45 left in the first quarter Salinas scored on a 6 yard drive up the middle, converting the extra point, and taking the lead 7-6.

Ernie Carrillo recorded two quarterback sacks, back to back in the closing seconds of the first quarter on Anson's Sonny Beauchamp. After Anson completed a long pass early in the 2nd quarter and were stopped by the Rotan defense they attempted a field goal from 14 yards

out. The kick failed.

Following the punt, Rotan took over possession at their own 4 yard line after a referee told Coach Robert Damron, "I blew the call". The referee put the ball in play at the 4 yard line, instead of the 20 after the ball went into the end zone.

Rotan controlled the ball on offense for the final 18 plays of the first half with

the half ending on a completed pass to Henry Williams on the 30 yard line.

Anson scored quick in the opening of the 3rd quarter. Anson recovered a fumble in the backfield and two plays later upped the score to 13-6.

Rotan took the Anson kick and marched 69 yards in 11 plays to take the

lead. Runs by Eli Turner, Kip Pease and Marcus Conner brought the squad to the Anson 30 yard line. The Rotan offense went into their shot-gun formation and three plays later Kip Pease connected on a 9 yard pass to Sammy Turner, leaving the score 13-12. Marcus Conner found the end zone on the extra point conversion and that pushed Rotan ahead for the night 14-13.

Artie Tucker and Weldon Hayes made key defensive stops in the following Anson series that forced an Anson punt on 4th and 18 from the 28 yard line.

An intercepted pass, thrown by Pease, killed their next drive but Anson could not capitalize on the opportunity as Conner, Carrillo, Alan Kiker, Hayes forced another Anson punt.

Pease took the Anson punt, returned it to the 45 and 4 plays later Gregg Gruben tossed a 22 yard pass to Sammy Turner for the score. The TD came with 1 second left in the 3rd period. Rotan surged ahead by the score of 22-13 when Pease hit Sammy Turner with the extra point pass.

Moses Gonzalez sailed the following kick into the end zone and Anson began their next series from the 20 yard line. Key tackles by Wes Hardin, Darrin Leverton, Dion Sepeda, Weldon Hayes and a 3rd down key stop by Jeff Posey killed the Anson drive.

Rotan was 7 plays into a drive with 3:18 left in the final quarter when Anson's Ralph Parker picked off a Gregg Gruben pass. The Tigers scored 4 plays later on a 3 yard

plunge by Mark Gee. The two point conversion try failed.

Richard Mendoza and Tony Zambrano fell on Anson's "on side kick" attempt with 1:59 left in the game and Rotan took over at mid-field. Three plays later a fumble recovery by Anson with 1:24 left in the game gave the Tigers new life.

Kip Pease intercepted Anson's first pass play from scrimmage and iced the win giving Rotan the ball on their own 20 with less than a minute left in the game.

Head Coach Robert Damron, following the important Anson win said, "This was an outstanding team effort defensively for Rotan. We played our best

offensive game tonight against a good Anson team."

Pease was the leading ground gainer with 22 carries for 134 yards; Eli Turner had 14 carries for 43 yards; Marcus Conner had 7 carries for 27 yards; Artie Tucker had 2 carries for 17 yards and Henry Williams had 3 carries for 5 yards.

ANSON 8th SHUTS OUT ROTAN 8th 14-0

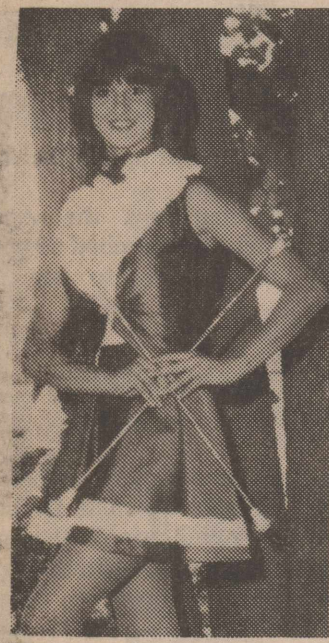

need for blood is continuous," Mrs. Brumfield said. "The quantity of blood required to keep the hospitals serviced adequately, plus allowance for emergencies equates to the number of units our mobiles must collect," Mrs. Brumfield explained.

So far, blood donor responses have satisfied the demand. "The people in our area have always answered the call for blood, and we feel certain their unselfish giving will be even better in the future."

"Appointments may be made with the local volunteer staff so 'the donating time can fit your busy schedule'," stated Betty Carter, Blood Services Chairman. "The goal is 70 units."

Additional medical guidelines for donating blood include the age limit of 17 to 66 years (17 year old can donate with written consent of parent or guardian), minimum weight of 110, 56 days from last donation, and a good medical history.

Temperature, blood pressure and hemoglobin count will be taken by Red Cross nurses prior to donation to make certain the donor is in good physical condition.

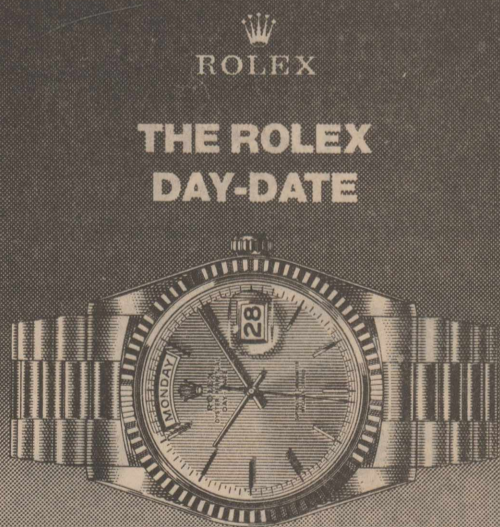

Roby Lions Down Miles, Defense Strong, Offense Powerful

Home field advantage wasn't enough for Roby's team Friday night, but the Lions offense was and Roby's defense was too much for the visiting Miles Bulldogs as the Lions beat the Bulldogs 30-18.

In the first quarter both teams had the ball twice. The Lions gained 40 yards rushing and none passing, were thrown for losses two times for a total of 8 yards. Roby's quarterback, Robby King, was 0 of 1 passing and Chad Terry punted twice.

The Miles Bulldogs in the first quarter scored on their first possession of the night, moving the ball 42 yards in 9 plays. The Bulldogs longest gain in the drive was a 13 yard pass from quarterback

Joseph Kalina to end Coty Barton. Then a 10 yard run by running back Ruben Casarez (No. 48) gave the Bulldogs a 1st and goal at the two. The Bulldogs then found out about the strong Lions defense led by Rudy Garcia and Benny Medrano. It took the Bulldogs 3 plays to get the 2 yards, Casarez falling across the goal line for Miles' first score. The kick for the PAT was good. The Bulldogs led 7-0 with 5:10 to go in the first quarter. The 2nd Bulldog possession started on their 22, on 1st down Miles, Casarez gained 5 yards, on 2nd down the defense threw the Bulldogs for a 1 yard loss. Then on 3rd down Roby's Chad Terry, Johnny Moesch and Rudy

Garcia teamed up to sack the Miles quarterback for another loss of 10 yards.

The Bulldogs in the first quarter rushed for 48 yards and passed for 13 yards, was thrown for losses twice for a total of -11 yards. Miles quarterback was 1 of 1 and they punted once.

The Lions started the Second Quarter with a 1st down on the Miles 43 yard line. After two carries for 4 yards by Sophomore Benny Putnam, Roby's quarterback Robby King hit Freshman Lance Green for a 39 yard touchdown play. The PAT was good, with King hitting tight end Johnny Moesch for the two points. With 10:49 left till the half, Roby led 8 to 7. Roby's next possession

came after the Lion's sophomore John Etheredge blocked the Bulldog punt. The Lions, with the ball at the 15 yard line, took only one play to score. Quarterback King, rolling to his right on an option, ran to about the 10 yard line where, while being hit by a Miles defender, pitches out to Roby's Kirk Williamson who went into the end zone for the Lions second score of the night. The PAT kick by Roby's Larry Williams was good with 8:19 left until the half. Roby led 15-7.

The Lions scored again just before the half. The third time they had possession in this quarter, the drive started on their own 25 yard line. It took the Lions six plays to cover the 75 yards, with sophomore Benny Putnam going in for the score on a 34 yard run, with Roby's Michael Porter throwing a good downfield block. The PAT kick by Williams was good, with 25 seconds left in the first half. The Lions led 22-7. In the second quarter the Lions rushed for 94 yards and passed for 41. King was 2 of 2 passing and one TD.

The Bulldogs in the second quarter had the ball three times. Miles started their first possession (2nd quarter) on their 35 yard line. Miles' Casarez (No. 48) ran for 13 yards to the 48 yard line, then carried the ball on the next three consecutive plays. First gaining only one yard, then held for one gain, when Roby's Reggie Parks, Rudy Garcia and Benny Medrano threw the Miles runner for a 5 yard loss. This drive ended with a blocked punt by Etheredge.

Miles' second possession in the second quarter started at their 35 and drove to the Lion 33 where on 4th down and 8, pressure from Roby's Chad Terry and Chris Kiser on the Miles quarterback resulted in an incomplete pass, killing the drive.

Miles had the ball one more time before the half,

In the 4th quarter the Lions rushed for 39 yards and passed for 6 yards. Roby was thrown for one loss of -4 yards. King was 2 of 3 passing. The Lions punted twice and had one fumble in this quarter.

The Bulldogs first possession of the 4th quarter netted only 2 yards gains on two rushing plays. As the Lion Defenders Joel King, John Etheredge, Benny Medrano and Rudy Garcia stiffened on 3rd and 7, the Miles quarterback was incomplete,

pressure being applied by Roby's Kiser and Moesch again.

The Bulldogs last possession found Roby's Benny Putnam and Jeff Upshaw sacking the bulldogs' quarterback for a 5 yard loss.

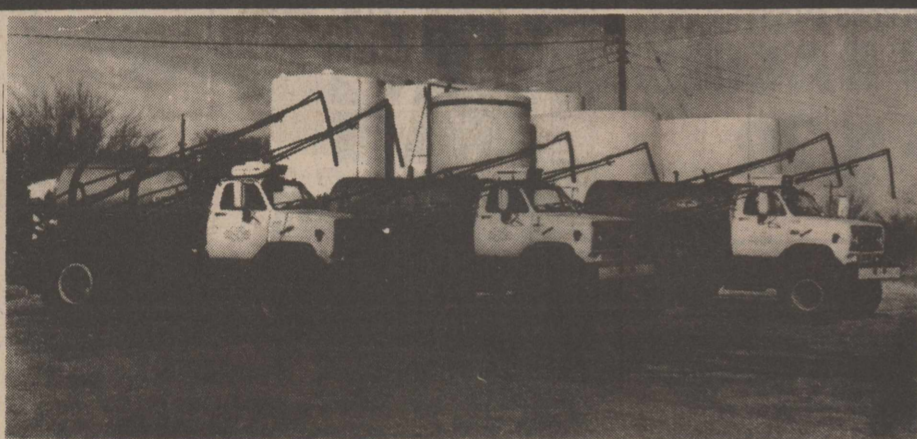
Miles in the 4th quarter rushed for 24 yards and none passing. Miles was thrown for losses twice for

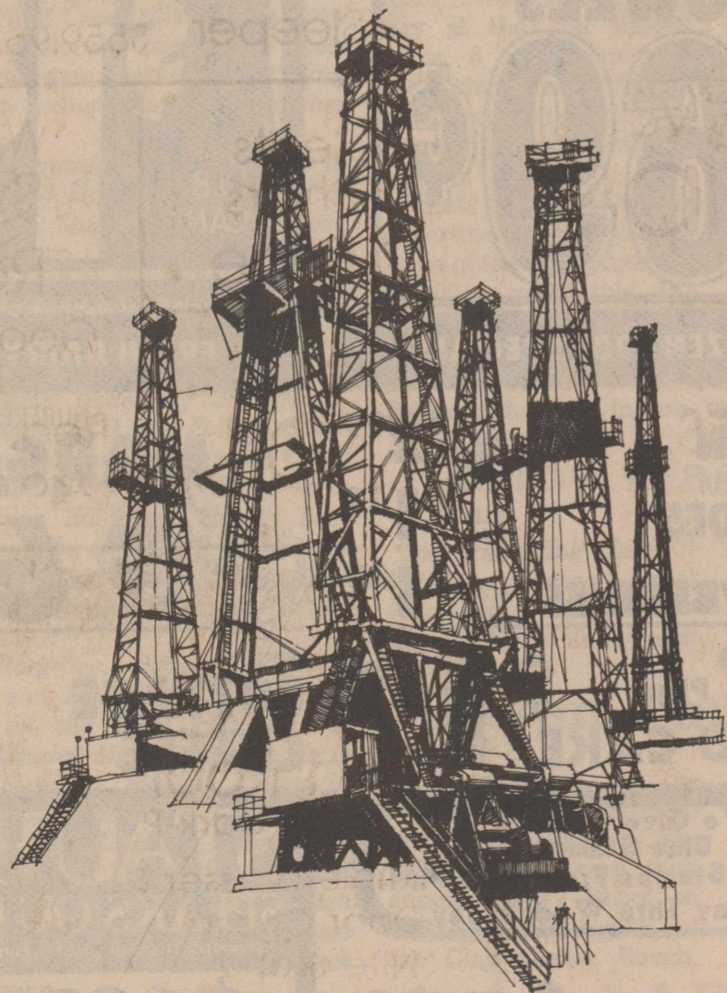

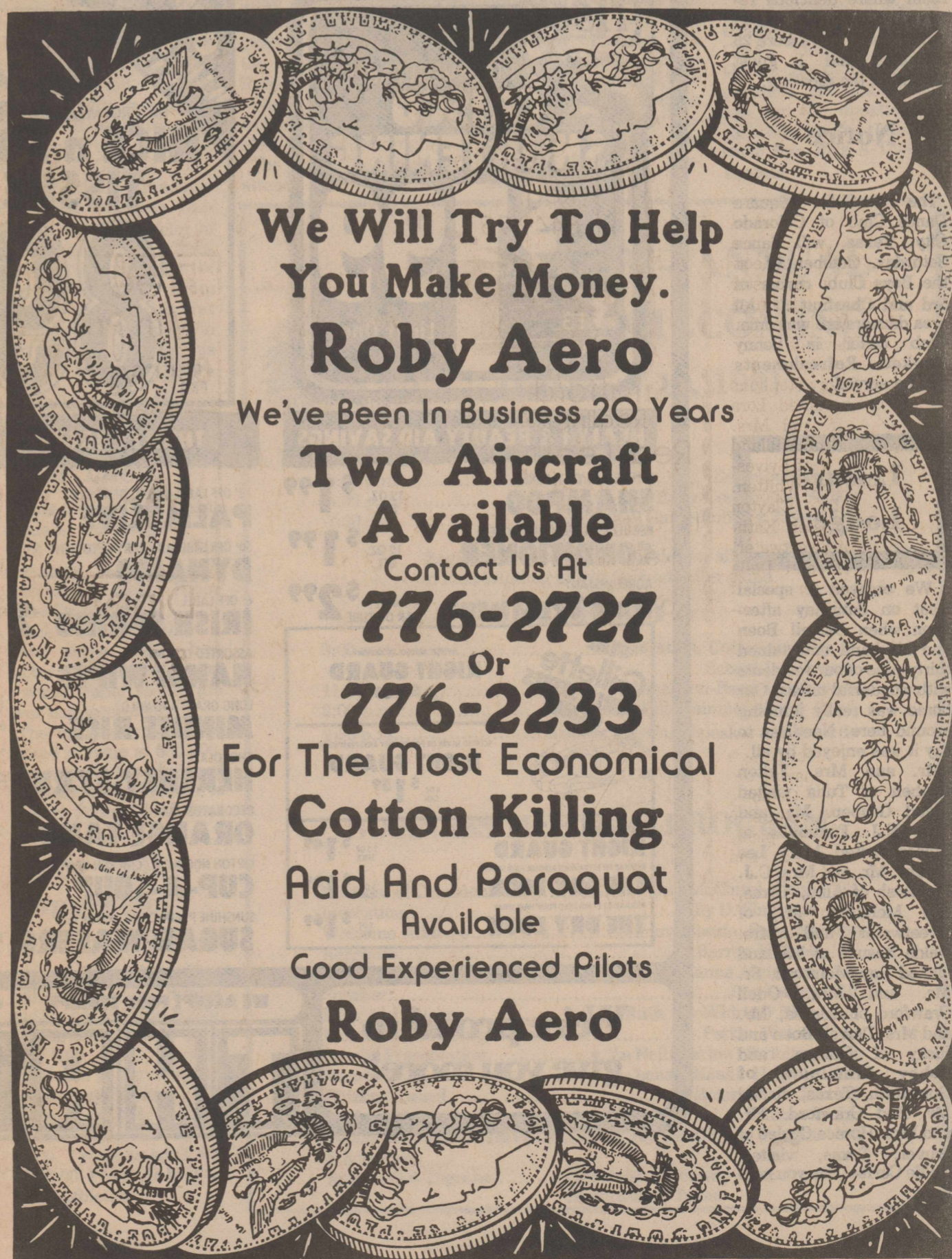

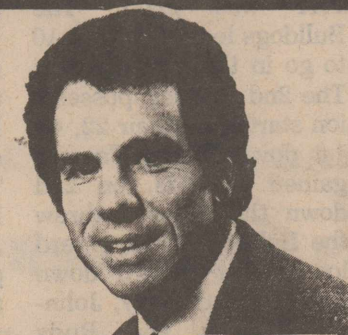
