Recipes for this week's column came in the mail today but sounded different and good. Hope you like them. GRANDMA'S GRAPEFRUIT CAKE 2 cups cake flour 2 teaspoons baking powder $1 / 2$ teaspoon salt
$1 / 2$ cup freshly juice $1 / 3$ cup cooking oil
4 eggs
$1 / 8$ teaspoon cream of tartar

## cup sugar

Combine flour, baking powder and salt; sitt into bowl. Strain grapefruit juice and combine with vegetable oil. Set aside. Separate eggs. Beat egg whites and cream of tartar until stiff peaks form; set aside. In large mixing bowl and using the same beater, beat egg yolks and
sugar until mixture is thick. Beat in about $1 / 2$ cup of flour mixture with $1 / 4$ cup of the juice-oil mixture. Repeat, alternating flour misture with liquid, beating well after each addition. Gently fold beaten egg whites into batter thoroughly. Pour batter into two 9 inch or three 8 inch greased and floured cake pans. Bake in pre-heated 350 degree oven for 25 minutes or until cool in pans for five minutes. Turn out onto wire racks and let cool thoroughly. When cool, frost with Cream Cheese Frosting. CREAM CHEESE FROSTING $2(80 z)$ packages cream chees
1 cup powdered sugar
2 tablespoons finely grated Texas Ruby Red grapefruit
peel $1 / 2$ teaspoon vanilla
$1 / 2$ cup freshly squeezed Texas Ruby Red grapefruit 2 Ruby Red grapefruit
Sprigs of fresh mint
Allow cream cheese to soften. Cream the cheese and powdered sugar together. Add grapefruit peel and vanilla. Add grapefruit juice gradually, beating until mixture is fluffy. Frost the cake layers. Garnish cake with Ruby Red grapefruit sections and sprigs of mint. Refrigerate cake until ready to serve

3 cups freshly squeezed Texas Ruby Red grapefruit juice $1 / 4$ to $1 / 3$ cup honey
2 cinnamon sticks
6 whole cloves
In medium saucepan, combine all ingredients, stir well. minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove cinnamon sticks and cloves. Pour into mugs, garnish with additional cinnamon sticks and cloves if desired.

by Gerald Rodgers, CPA income tax returns. All are intended to review the facts and see that your return is properly filed. The agent is not to harass or belittle you. If you have filed your return with the correct numbers, don't lose sleep over an upcoming audit.
The simplest of the audits The simplest of the audits is a "direct
correspondence." You may be asked to send photo copies of a few specific checks or documents. An "office audit" will often be more detailed and may require you to take certain records to your nearest IRS office. A call to the examining officer for more inform you an extra trip
you an extra trip. "field audit" is held at your home or place of business. It usually involves a full review of all major income and expense items. If you have income from a partnership or small corporation they may also be brought into the audit.
The IRS has had excellent results by letting the The IRS has had excellent results by letting their
computer select which returns are to be audited and most likely to produce added revenue for the government. The computer checks for certain "norms" in your return depending on the nature
of your business, income level, etc. If you have of your business, income level, etc. If you have abnormal figures such as excessive interest
expense, high medical bills, etc., you should attach a photocopy of the document supporting the deductions. Such documentation may keepthe IRS from contacting you.
If you receive correspondence from the taxing
authorities, respond timely authorities, respond timely. Ignoring their first few
notices will not gain you favor when you finlly meet, and you will.
